Rigo Hernandez, who currently operates Rigo's Café at 902 6th Street, has expressed interest in purchasing the property for the purpose of establishing a new restaurant/industrial catering business. In addition, Mr. Hernandez may utilize the space for a meeting space for a local church.

Staff recommends sale of the property to Mr. Hernandez in the amount of \$165,000. While this is below the appraised value listed by the Galveston County Appraisal District, it is equal to the purchase price paid by TCEDC when the property was originally acquired.

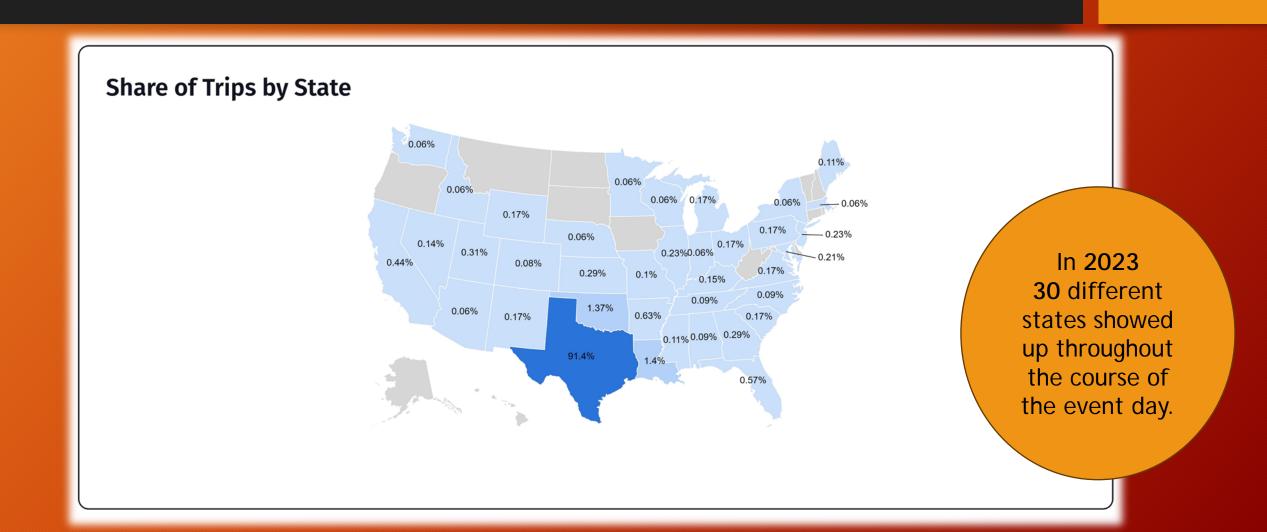

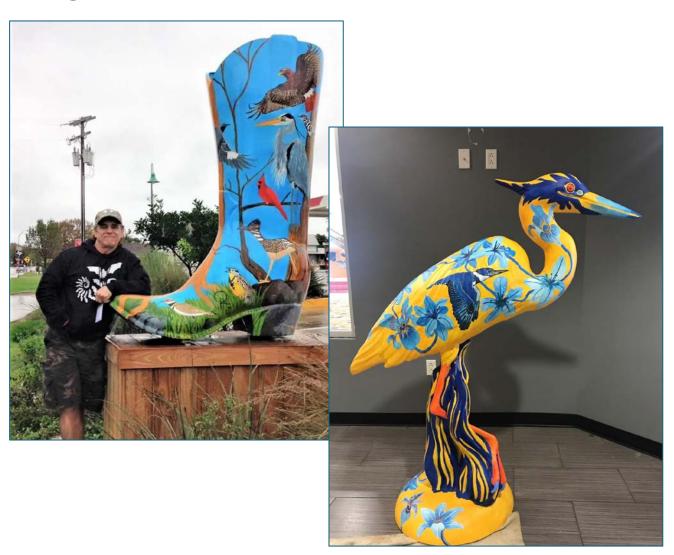
