

CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This Contract is made and entered into this 1st day of May, 2025, by and between **WILLDAN ENGINEERING** ("Willdan"), a corporation, and **Texas City, Texas** a Municipality ("Client").

Recital: Client desires to employ Willdan to furnish certain professional services in connection with **Building Permitting Inspection Services for the College of the Mainland 2023 Bond Projects** (the "Project") in accordance with the proposal submitted by Willdan on August 9, 2024 which proposal is attached under Exhibit "C" and incorporated herein by reference. NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, the receipt and adequacy of which is hereby acknowledged and contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Services. Willdan shall provide professional services and advice on various issues affecting the decision of the Client described in detail in Exhibit "A", Description of Services, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

2. Compensation. Willdan shall be compensated, including reimbursements, for services rendered under Section 1, in accordance with the terms and conditions indicated in Exhibit "B," Compensation. Willdan may submit monthly statements for basic and additional services rendered. It is intended that payments to Willdan will be made by Client within ten (10) days of invoice.

3. Indemnification. Each party hereto agrees to save, keep, and hold harmless the other party hereto from all damages, costs, or expenses in law and equity including costs of suit to the extent resulting from its own negligent acts, errors, omissions, recklessness or willful misconduct. Neither party shall be required to defend the other party from any such claims, it being the intent of the parties that they shall each be responsible for the defense of its own negligence.

4. Hazardous Materials. Client acknowledges that Willdan's scope of services for this project does not include any work related in any way to asbestos and/or hazardous waste. Should Willdan or any other party encounter such materials on the job site, or should it in any other way become known that such materials are present or may be present on the job site or any adjacent or nearby areas which may affect Willdan's work, Willdan may, at its option, terminate work on the project until such time as Client retains a specialist contractor to abate and/or remove the asbestos and/or hazardous waste materials and warrant that the job site is free from any hazard which may result from the existence of such materials.

5. Insurance. Willdan shall obtain and shall require any subcontractors to obtain insurance of the types and in the amounts described below and satisfactory to the Client.

A. Commercial General Liability Insurance. Willdan shall maintain occurrence version commercial general liability insurance or equivalent form with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. If such insurance contains a general aggregate limit, it shall apply separately to this Contract or be no less than two times the occurrence limit. Such insurance shall:

1) Name the Client, its officials, officers, employees and agents as additional insureds with respect to performance of Services. Such insured status shall contain no special limitations on the scope of its protection to the above-listed insureds.

2) Be primary with respect to any insurance or self-insurance programs covering the Client, its officials, officers, employees, agents, and consultants.

3) Contain standard separation of insureds provisions.

B. Business Automobile Liability Insurance. Willdan shall maintain business automobile liability insurance or equivalent form with a combined single limit of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Such insurance shall include coverage for owned, hired and non-owned automobiles and shall name Client as additional insureds; be primary with respect to any insurance; and contain standard separation of insureds provisions.

C. Workers' Compensation Insurance. Willdan shall maintain workers' compensation insurance with statutory limits and employers' liability insurance with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per accident at any times during the term of this Contract during which Willdan may retain employees.

D. Certificates/Insurer Rating/Cancellation Notice.

1) Willdan shall, prior to commencement of the Services, furnish to the Client properly executed certificates of insurance, and certified copies of endorsements, and policies if requested by the Client, which shall clearly evidence all insurance required in this Section. Willdan shall not allow such insurance to be canceled or allowed to expire except on 30 days' prior to written notice to the Client.

2) Willdan shall maintain such insurance from the time the Services commence until the Services are completed, except as may be otherwise required by this Section.

3) Willdan shall place insurance with insurers with a current A.M. Best's Rating no less than A:VIII licensed to do business in Texas.

4) Willdan shall replace certificates, policies and endorsements for any insurance expiring prior to completion of the Services.

6. Independent Contractor Status. Willdan shall be an independent contractor and shall have responsibility for and control over the details and means of providing the services under this Contract.

7. Ownership and Maintenance of Documents. All materials and data, including data on magnetic media, prepared by Willdan under this Contract shall become the property of the Client upon the completion of the term of this Contract, except that Willdan shall have the right to retain copies of all such documents and data for its records. The Client shall not be limited in any way in their use of such data at any time, provided that any such use not within the purposes intended by this Contract shall be at the Client's sole risk and provided that Willdan shall be indemnified and defended against any damages resulting from such use, including the release of this material to third parties for a use not intended by this Contract. Should Willdan, either during or following termination of this Contract, desire to use any materials prepared in connection with this Agreement, it shall first obtain the written approval of the Client.

Willdan's records, documents, calculations, test information, and all other instruments of service shall be kept on file in legible form for a period of not less than three years after completion of the services covered in this Contract.

8. Suspension of Work. Client may, at any time, by fifteen (15) days written notice, suspend further performance by Willdan. All suspensions shall extend the time schedule for performance in a mutually satisfactory manner and Willdan shall be paid for all services performed and reimbursable expenses incurred prior to the suspensions date.

9. Termination. Either party may terminate this Contract at any time by giving fifteen (15) days written notice to the other party of such termination. If this Contract is terminated as provided herein, Willdan will be compensated, including reimbursement, for the services actually performed at the agreed Rates.

10. Compliance with Law. Each party will use reasonable care to comply with applicable laws in effect at the time the services are performed which to the best of their knowledge, information and belief apply to their respective obligations under this Contract.

11. Successors and Assigns. This Agreement shall be binding on the successors and assigns of the parties, but it shall not be assigned by either party without written consent of the other party.

12. Attorney's Fees. If either party commences an action against the other party arising out of or in connection with this Contract, the prevailing party in such litigation shall be entitled to have and recover from the losing party reasonable attorney's fees and costs of suits.

13. Dispute Resolution. If a dispute arises between the parties relating to this Contract, the parties agree to use the following procedure prior to either party pursuing other available remedies:

A. A meeting shall be held promptly between the parties, attended by individuals with decision-making Client, to attempt in good faith to negotiate a settlement of the dispute.

B. If unsuccessful, the parties should seek a mutually acceptable mediator to mediate the dispute with the next 45 days.

C. If A and B have failed, the dispute shall be litigated in Galveston County, State of Texas.

14. Records. Willdan shall maintain complete and accurate records with respect to costs incurred under this Contract. All such records shall be clearly identifiable. Willdan shall allow a representative of the Client during normal business hours to examine, audit, and make transcripts or copies of such records and any other documents created pursuant to this Contract. Willdan shall allow inspection of all work, data, documents, proceedings, and activities related to the Contract for a period of three (3) years from the date of final payment under this Contract.

15. Insolvency of Client. Willdan shall be entitled to immediately, and without notice, suspend the performance of any and all of its obligations pursuant to this Contract if Client files a voluntary petition seeking relief under the United States Bankruptcy Code or if there is an involuntary bankruptcy petition filed against Client in the United States Bankruptcy Court, and that petition is not dismissed within fifteen (15) days of its filing. Any suspension of services made pursuant to the provisions of this paragraph shall continue until such time as this Contract has been fully and properly assumed in accordance with the applicable provisions of the United States Bankruptcy Code and in compliance with the final order or judgment issued by the Bankruptcy Court.

16. Miscellaneous Provisions. This Contract is subject to the following special provisions:

A. The titles used in this Contract are for general reference only and are not a part of the Contract.

B. This Contract shall be interpreted as though prepared by both parties.

C. Any provision of this Contract held to violate any law shall be deemed void, and all remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect.

D. This Contract comprises a final and complete repository of the understandings between the parties and supersedes all prior or contemporary communications, representations or agreements, whether oral or written, relating to the subject matter of this Contract.

E. Any notices given pursuant to this Contract shall be effective on the third business day after posting by first class mail, postage prepaid, to the address appearing immediately after the signatures below.



Willdan shall not be liable for damages resulting from the actions or inactions of governmental agencies including, but not limited to, permit processing, environmental impact reports, dedications, general plans and amendments thereto, zoning matters, annexations or consolidations, use or conditional use permits, project or plan approvals, and building permits unless caused by Willdan's negligence or wrongful conduct.

G. Waiver by either of any term, condition, or covenant, or breach of any term, condition, or covenant, shall not constitute the waiver of any subsequent breach of any other term, condition or covenant.

EXHIBIT "A"
DESCRIPTION OF SERVICES

- 1) Building Code Permit **Inspections** for College of the Mainland 2023 Bond Projects, **Library and Classroom Building (LCB)**.

Inspections include all Building Code required inspections. Special inspections, material or other testing is not included. Inspections will typically be performed on the next business day after request but no more than 48 hours following request. Inspections will be billed monthly as noted in Exhibit "B".

Inspections will be performed for Building, Mechanical, Electrical, Plumbing and Energy Code compliance based on the Texas City adopted codes applicable to this project (Primarily the ICC I-Codes, Edition as directed by City). Fire and engineering/public works inspections are not included.

EXHIBIT "B"
COMPENSATION

1) Lump Sum Building Permit Inspections for the Library and Classroom Building (LCB): \$ 74,600

The proposed fee includes all required Building Code inspections and including travel.

Fee does not include special/deputy inspections, fire inspections, public works/engineering inspections or any testing.

Re-inspections due to grossly incomplete or non-compliant work may be billed at \$95.00 per hour plus \$0.67 per mile from the Houston area, after initial warning.

Willdan will invoice monthly, in arrears, based on the estimated construction schedule of 25 months or \$2,984 per month.



C. Proposed Methodology and Approach

Willdan prides itself on the ability to adapt and work within an existing framework of a department. We will propose options for providing services as described. Our intent is for our clients to be comfortable with our services and adhere to the clients’ needs.

Based on the RFP, it appears the required services are very similar to those currently provided to our current client, Texas State Technical College on 5 of their campuses. In order to allow construction to proceed in as efficient and timely manner as possible, it is key that Willdan be involved early on and work directly with the project design team. Willdan can work as independently as the Texas City Building Official would like, following any direction necessary to provide the City full confidence in final approvals. As a key to ensure building occupancy is obtained as quickly as possible, it is critical that a diligent plan review is performed to limit issues during the inspection process.

For these types of projects, we will typically work with the contractor(s) to coordinate timely inspections.

D. Work Plan and Schedule

As noted above, Willdan’s standard is to follow the procedures and processes of our client City. However, our staff’s extensive experience and depth allow us to help improve City processes or provide the flexibility necessary to help move projects along in an expedited manner. Below is our standard plan review schedule. We propose to proceed with the following schedule but provide for online meetings with the design team to ensure comments are addressed without unnecessary delays.

To allow the most efficient plan review by the most qualified staff, we recommend the plan review is performed electronically. Willdan has its own online, cloud-based plan check tracking system that allows applicants, City staff and Willdan plan reviewers to access each submittal and view outstanding comments 24 hours a day. Our plan check tracking system sends email notifications to any list of recipients from the City to ensure the correct people know when submittals are accepted, comments issued and plan review approval is obtained. Once plan approval, we ensure the applicant is aware other departments and possible QC checks are still required prior to permit issuance. Willdan is also fully capable of performing electronic plan reviews through the City’s system or through paper submittals, as directed by the City.

Inspections are typically performed on the next business day but we can also provide after-hours and weekend inspections, if authorized by the City.
