a. Motion. Billings MPO Public Participation Plan, (PPP), Scott Walker, Transportation Planner, presenting.

Transportation Coordinator Scott Walker opened this agenda item and stated it has been approximately ten years since this document was last updated. He stressed the importance of including social media in the public participation process.

Background: MPOs are mandated by the Federal Highway Act, (1973), to provide cooperative, comprehensive, and a continuing transportation planning and decision-making process. Currently this falls under the “Fixing America’s Surface Transportation, (FAST), Act. A public participation plan, (PPP), is needed for compliance. The MPO

facilitates between FHWA/MDT and local committees and governing bodies. These groups and/or advocates may include but are not limited to: Persons with limited English proficiency; Representatives of the disabled; Representatives of public transportation users; Representatives of pedestrian facility users; Representatives of bicycle facility users; Representatives of low-income communities; Representatives of minority communities; Freight shippers and haulers; Private providers of transportation; and Representatives of affected public agencies. Strategies and Tools include media; digital and print materials; online and social media, an in-person meetings. The plan encourages creativity in outreach such as “Tag on Meetings” held during other events, Exhibits at events; Steering Committees, Focus Groups and Stakeholders; and tours.
