On behalf of the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) you and your staff are invited to a second Public Hearing for the Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study for the above referenced project. A PD&E Study is FDOT's process to evaluate the social, economic, and environmental impacts associated with a planned transportation improvement project. The purpose of this project is to reduce congestion and enhance safety within the Hallandale Beach Boulevard, Pembroke Road and Hollywood Boulevard Interchanges.

A preferred alternative was selected in 2021 and presented at a Public Hearing in September 2021. Subsequent coordination with the local municipalities after the Public Hearing generated several requests to modify the preferred alternative in specific areas to meet their local needs. Therefore, FDOT addressed these requests and evaluated several modifications to the preferred alternative. Between 2023 and 2024, FDOT completed the evaluation and finalized the refinements to the preferred alternative. The refinements were presented to the local municipalities, obtaining concurrence to complete the PD&E Study.

The environmental review, consultation, and other actions required by applicable federal environmental laws for this project are being, or have been, carried out by FDOT pursuant to 23 U.S.C. § 327 and a Memorandum of Understanding dated May 26, 2022, and executed by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and FDOT.

The Public Hearing is scheduled for **Thursday, April 3, 2025 (Virtual)**, and **Tuesday, April 8, 2025 (In-Person)**:



A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AND SUBMIT GRANT APPLICATIONS, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, TO THE BROWARD METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION'S COMPLETE STREETS AND OTHER LOCAL INITIATIVES PROGRAM FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMPLETE STREETS PROJECT ON NORTHEAST 15th AVENUE AND THE SOUTH MIDDLE RIVER MOBILITY PROJECT, AND FOR FUNDING OF UP TO THREE MILLION DOLLARS PER PROJECT; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY, AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is providing funds to local governments through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (BMPO); and

WHEREAS, the BMPO is providing grant funding to local governments for complete streets, traffic calming, intersection improvements, and other related projects, through its Complete Streets and Other Localized Initiatives Program (CSLIP); and

WHEREAS, CSLIP is a competitive grant program, which funds local transportation projects with construction costs between \$500,000 and \$3,000,000; and

WHEREAS, applications will be objectively evaluated, and the top ranked projects will receive funding based on the availability of funds; and

WHEREAS, awarded projects will be reviewed by the Local Agency Program (LAP), which regulates the manner federal funds are spent on local roadways by municipalities; and

WHEREAS, following its evaluation, the BMPO will disburse this competitive grant funding to local governments, based on applications submitted; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, and accepted, the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida (City), will be required to manage the design and construction of the project using the federally mandated LAP process; and

WHEREAS, the LAP is a reimbursement-based grant program; and

WHEREAS, the LAP requires that the City provide funding for any contingency costs that may arise during construction in the year of construction; and

WHEREAS, these projects have been identified by the affected neighborhood associations as priority projects and the associations have provided support of these projects; and

WHEREAS, if the grant is awarded and accepted, the City will maintain or coordinate the maintenance of the city roadways after the project's completion;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:


SECTION 1. The CSLIP grant will fund the installation of high security fencing and signage at locations along the SFRC in Broward County to assist with deterring and preventing trespassing along the corridor. High security fencing has been previously installed on the SFRC and has shown to be effective in reducing trespassing and subsequent fatalities.


