A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SUBMIT A GRANT APPLICATION, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA, TO THE BROWARD METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION'S COMPLETE STREETS AND OTHER LOCAL INITIATIVES PROGRAM, FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SOUTH MIDDLE RIVER MOBILITY COMPLETE STREETS PROJECT, AND FOR FUNDING OF UP TO FOUR MILLION DOLLARS PER PROJECT; AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE THE GRANT APPLICATION AND ANY AND ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY OR INCIDENTAL TO THE GRANT APPLICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is providing funds to local governments through the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (BMPO); and

WHEREAS, the BMPO is providing grant funding to local governments for complete streets, traffic calming, intersection improvements, and other related projects, through its Complete Streets and Other Localized Initiatives Program (CSLIP); and

WHEREAS, CSLIP is a competitive grant program, which funds local transportation projects with construction costs between \$1,000,000 and \$4,000,000; and

WHEREAS, applications will be objectively evaluated, and the top-ranked projects will receive funding based on the availability of funds; and

WHEREAS, awarded projects will be reviewed by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), which regulates the manner federal funds are spent on local roadways by municipalities; and

WHEREAS, following its evaluation, the BMPO will recommend the top-ranked projects for grant funding through the FDOT Work Program, based on available funds for the CSLIP; and

WHEREAS, if awarded, and accepted, the City of Fort Lauderdale, Florida (City), will be required to manage the design and construction of the project using the federally mandated Local Agency Program (LAP) process; and

WHEREAS, the South Middle River Mobility project has been identified by the affected neighborhood association as a priority project and the association has provided support of this project; and

WHEREAS, if the grant is awarded and accepted, the City will maintain or coordinate the maintenance of the city roadways after the project's completion;

SECTION 1. That the above recitals are true and correct and incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.



A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF LAUDERDALE LAKES, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING AND ENCOURAGING THE PROPOSED PROJECT BY THE BROWARD METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION PROVIDING FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF MULTIUSE PATHS, RAISED INTERSECTIONS, AND COMMUNITY BUS STOPS ON NW 41 STREET BETWEEN SR-7 AND NW 52 AVENUE WITHIN THE CITY OF LAUDERDALE LAKES ("CITY") IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE COMPLETE STREETS AND OTHER LOCALIZED INITIATIVES PROGRAM ("CSLIP"); AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR CSLIP, AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ACCEPT, ON BEHALF OF THE CITY, SUCH FUNDING AS MAY BE RECEIVED FROM CSLIP; PROVIDING FOR THE ADOPTION OF RECITALS; PROVIDING FOR INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CITY CLERK; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization ("MPO") approved the Complete Streets and Other Localized Initiatives Program ("CSLIP") on July 9th, 2015;

WHEREAS, the MPO's CSLIP provides funding for small local transportation projects that will improve the safety and mobility of all transportation users in Broward County, and;

WHEREAS, this competitive grant program can fund projects such as, but not limited to, complete streets projects, traffic calming and intersection improvements, ADA upgrades, mobility hubs, bus shelters, bike racks, and technology advancements such as transit signal priority and traffic control devices;

WHEREAS, the Multiuse Paths, Raised Intersections, and Community Bus Stops on NW 41 Street between SR-7 and NW 52 Avenue Project ("Project") will be evaluated and ranked by the MPO, then vetted to determine programmability in accordance with the CSLIP policies;

WHEREAS, a resolution from the City of Lauderdale Lakes ("City") Commission expressing support for the Project is required to establish funding eligibility;

1 WHEREAS, federally funded projects off the state highway system are delivered using the
2 federally mandated Local Agency Program (“LAP”) process;

3 WHEREAS, the City Commission of Lauderdale Lakes conveys its commitment to provide
4 for the administration and delivery of the Project pursuant to the LAP Program’s reimbursement-
5 based methodology as specified in the LAP Agreement;

6 WHEREAS, the City Commission of Lauderdale Lakes further commits to further funding
7 upfront costs for design, Construction Engineering and Inspection (CEI) services, and construction
8 to later be reimbursed as per the LAP agreement; and further program funding for construction
9 contingency per the requirements of LAP;

10 WHEREAS, the Multiuse Paths, Raised Intersections, and Community Bus Stops on NW 41
11 Street between SR-7 and NW 52 Avenue Project will be constructed within the agency’s right of
12 way;

13 WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the City to maintain or coordinate the maintenance of
14 the roadways after the Project's completion; and

15 WHEREAS, the City commits to working with the Broward MPO per the requirements of
16 CSLIP policies.

17 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF
18 LAUDERDALE LAKES AS FOLLOWS:

19 SECTION 1. ADOPTION OF RECITALS: The foregoing RECITALS are hereby ratified and
20 confirmed as being true, and the same are hereby made a part of this Resolution.

21 SECTION 2. AUTHORITY: The City Commission of Lauderdale Lakes hereby conveys its
22 supports for the proposed project for the construction of Multiuse Paths, Raised Intersections

1 and Community Bus Stops in the Oakland Estates located on NW 41st Street to extend from N
2 State Road 7 to NW 52 Avenue within the City of Lauderdale Lakes, and authorizes the
3 appropriate City Officials to submit an application for the Complete Streets and other Localized
4 Initiatives Program (“CSLIP”), and accept any funding received from CSLIP.

5 SECTION 3. INSTRUCTIONS TO THE CITY CLERK: The City Clerk and other appropriate
6 City Officials are hereby authorized to take any and all actions necessary to effectuate the intent
7 of this Resolution.

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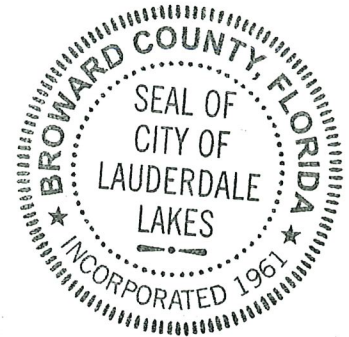



I am pleased to support the City of Pompano Beach's request for grant funding from the Florida Department of Transportation to support the continuation of transit services within the City of Pompano Beach (the "City"). The City's objective in applying for grant funding is to offset operational expenses necessary to implement an expanded transit program aimed at relieving traffic congestion on West and East Atlantic Boulevard, generally running from Dixie Highway to the Atlantic Ocean where East Atlantic Boulevard connects with North Ocean Boulevard (A1A) in Pompano Beach, Florida. A secondary transit corridor, A1A, is also part of the project for traffic relief, as it borders significant development in the City.

The proposed program is a short-haul transit program, the riders of which would alternatively drive on local arterial roads such as Atlantic Boulevard and A1A. The program provides transit to visitors, residents, and workers to and from park and ride locations within the City to their desired destinations. The City has also implemented an on-demand micro-transit service that is available to residents and visitors.

The City has been one of our strongest supporters in improving mass transit and identifying multi-modal alternatives, including implementing the Complete Streets Master Plan. Moreover, the MPO and Broward County, with support from cities like Pompano Beach, are implementing a system-wide transportation plan supported by the County's Surtax that was approved by the voters in a referendum in November 2018.

The Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) writes to express support for the City of Fort Lauderdale’s application for Fiscal Year 2026 Better Utilizing Investments to Leverage Development (BUILD) Grant Program funding for the Las Olas Boulevard Mobility Project.

Las Olas Boulevard is a critical east–west corridor and one of the City’s primary connections to Fort Lauderdale Beach and the barrier islands. The corridor carries high volumes of pedestrians, cyclists, and vehicles each day, contributing to recurring congestion and ongoing transportation safety concerns that have regional implications.
