



BURNET COUNTY 9/11 REMEMBRANCE PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, on September 11, 2001, our nation endured the worst terrorist attack on U.S. soil, met with incredible courage, heroism, and resilience by the American people; and

WHEREAS, in response, Americans united in a spirit of patriotism, compassion, and service, performing countless acts of kindness; and

WHEREAS, families of 9/11 victims and community organizations began marking the anniversary with charitable service to honor those lost and the heroic efforts of first responders and volunteers; and

WHEREAS, the 2009 Serve America Act established September 11th as a “National Day of Service and Remembrance,” encouraging Americans to honor victims and heroes through acts of service; and

WHEREAS, service on this day is a meaningful way to remember the fallen and recognize those who served and continue to serve—military personnel, veterans, first responders, and their families; and

WHEREAS, the National Day of Service and Remembrance is observed nationwide through events organized by nonprofits, schools, businesses, faith groups, and local communities; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of Burnet County are encouraged to participate in service projects that honor the victims and heroes of 9/11 by addressing local community needs;

NOW, THEREFORE, we, the Burnet County commissioners court, do hereby proclaim **September 11th as a Day of Service and Remembrance in Burnet County**, and call upon all citizens to honor the lives lost through acts of community service and participation in remembrance events on this day and throughout the year.
