Kingsland Water Supply Corporation has filed an application with the Public Utility Commission of Texas to amend its Certificate of Convenience and Necessity (CCN) No. 12217 for the provision of retail water utility service in Llano and Burnet Counties.

The requested area overlaps the district boundaries of the Kingsland MUD. If Kingsland MUD does not request a public hearing, the Commission shall determine that the district is consenting to Kingsland Water Supply Corporation's request to provide retail water utility service in the requested area.

The requested area is located approximately 5 mile(s) north of downtown Granite Shoals, Texas, and is generally bounded on the north by RM 3404 and CR 302 (Llano County) and CR 134 (Burnet County); on the east by CR 120A (Burnet County); on the south by Colorado River (Llano County) and Mill Creek Road (Burnet County); and on the west by River Oaks Drive (Llano County). The total requested area includes approximately 1623 acres and 335 current customers.

Persons who wish to intervene in the proceeding or comment upon action sought should contact the Public Utility Commission, P.O. Box 13326, Austin, Texas 78711-3326, or call the Public Utility Commission at (512) 936-7120 or (888) 782-8477. Hearing- and speech-impaired individuals with text telephones (TTY) may contact the commission at (512) 936-7136. The deadline for intervention in the proceeding is 30 days from the mailing or publication of notice, whichever occurs later, unless otherwise provided by the presiding officer. You must send a letter requesting intervention to the commission which is received by that date. The letter must include the person's name, address, email address, and fax number if applicable.

If a valid public hearing is requested, the Commission will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. An evidentiary hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.

A landowner with a tract of land at least 25 acres or more, that is partially or wholly located within the requested area, may file a written request with the Commission to be excluded from

the requested area ("opt out") within 30 days from the date that notice was provided by the utility. All opt out requests must include a large-scale map, a metes and bounds description of the landowner's tract of land, landowner's name, address, email address and fax number, if applicable.
