A. JOINT RESOLUTION

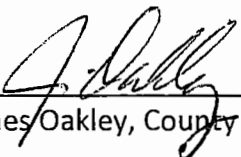

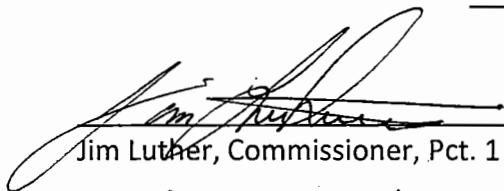
AND WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Burnet County, Texas desires to give authorization for said Contract,

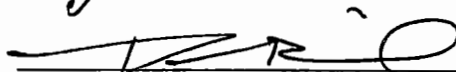
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF BURNET COUNTY, TEXAS, THAT:

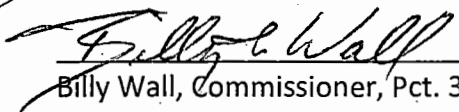

B. ESTIMATED VOTER TURNOUT
