Closing of North Annex Polling Location

- Why Close?

- Courthouse security concerns
- AgriLife is only 1.3 miles from North Annex
- AgriLife is a much larger facility with ample parking which can accommodate a larger indoor voter turn out
- Redeployment of North Annex voting machines would increase efficiency at AgriLife.
- Voter turnout at North Annex has been small (2% turnout in both 2020 and 2022 elections)
- Voter parking is always a problem and entrance for voting is on the side (not main entrance) and is always confusing

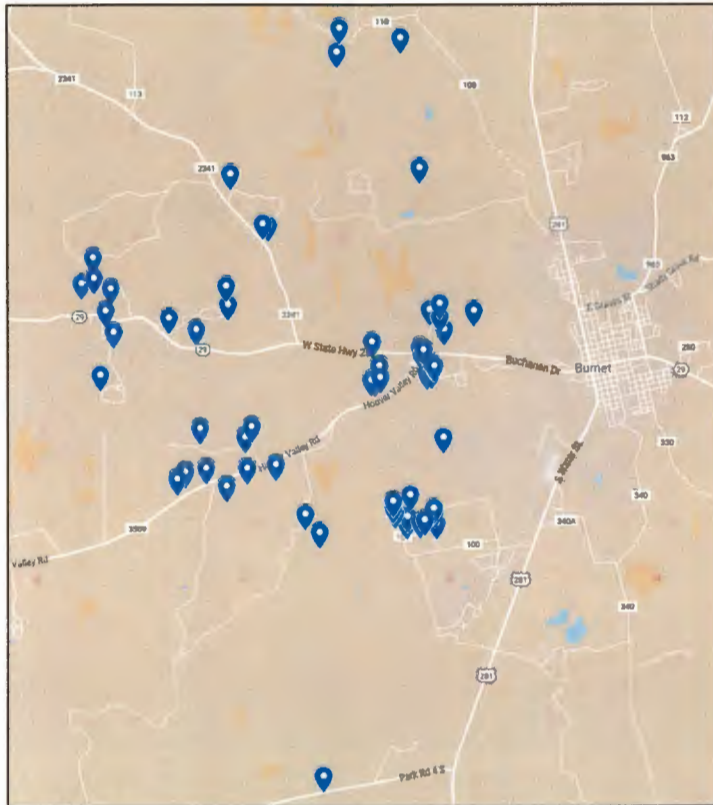
- Voter Impact

- Only 1 Precinct 17 voter voted at the North Annex in both the 2020 General and 2022 Primary elections
- AgriLife is more comfortable and convenient for voters (voters can wait inside)

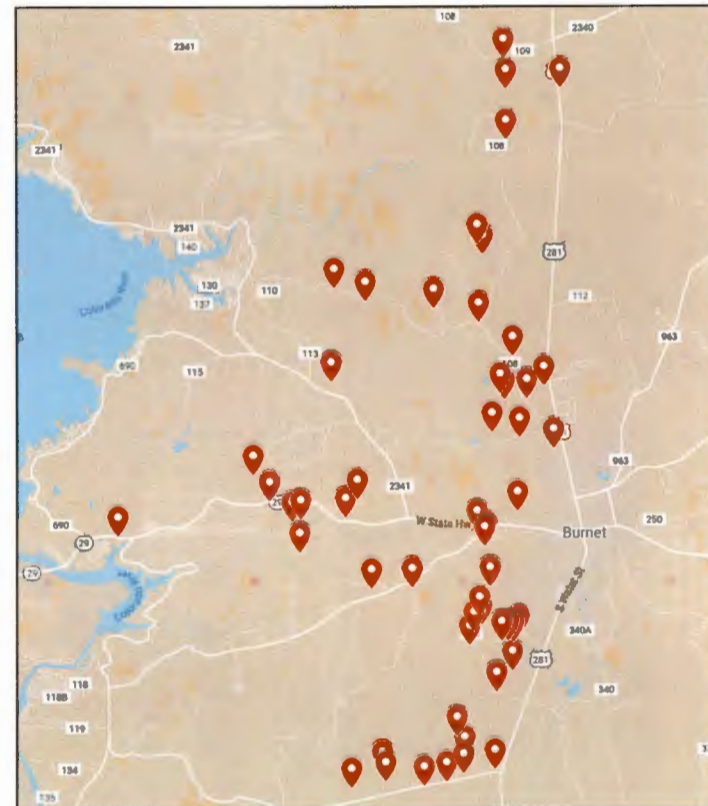

76 (38% of 199 votes cast by Precinct 1 voters countywide) voted at Agrilife on election day, 20 of those voters drove past First Lutheran
29 (15% of 199 votes cast by Precinct 1 voters countywide) who voted at First Lutheran would have driven within 0.6 miles of Agrilife

Closing of First Lutheran Polling Location

- Why Close?
 - AgriLife is only 2.2 miles from First Lutheran
 - AgriLife is a larger facility with ample parking which can accommodate a larger indoor voter turn out
 - Eliminating a Commissioner precinct 1 location allows room for other possible moves in the future
 - Redeployment of First Lutheran voting machines would increase efficiency at AgriLife.
 - Voter turnout at First Lutheran is relatively small for a polling location within 2 miles of another location (3% for 2020 General and 4% 2022 Primary)
 - 20 Precinct 1 voters who voted at AgriLife drove past First Lutheran
 - 29 Precinct 1 voters who voted at First Lutheran would have driven within 0.6 miles of AgriLife
- Voter Impact
 - Only 9 Precinct 1 voters voted at First Lutheran in both the 2020 General and 2022 Primary elections
 - AgriLife is more comfortable and convenient for voters (voters can wait inside)
 - 60 (38% of 158 votes casted at First Lutheran by all voters) voted out of their home Precinct
 - 69 (70% of 98 votes casted at First Lutheran by Precinct 1 voters) would have to drive another 2.2 miles to reach AgriLife

Moving the Marble Falls South Annex Polling Location

- Why Move Locations?

- Courthouse security concerns
- South Annex has limited parking
- Texas Tech is next door to the South Annex
- Texas Tech has ample parking and more room for voters to wait inside
- Has a natural flow in the front door and out the side door for voters
- The voting room configuration having two doors, provides a smooth flow through the room

- Voter Impact

- Other than signs needed to redirect voters to the new location, there should be no voter impact
