

BURNET COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT RESOLUTION AFFIRMING PRIOR ADOPTION OF LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL WORK PAY SCHEDULE

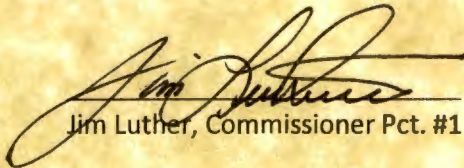
On July 28, 2009, the Burnet County Commissioners Court adopted Section 7(k) of the FLSA, 29 U.S.C. § 207(k) in regards to all Burnet County Law Enforcement Employees. Said legal provision provides for a partial overtime pay exemption for public agency employees employed in law enforcement activities such as deputies, jailers, detention officers, and investigators.

Under this provision, Burnet County established a work period of 14 consecutive days for the purpose of calculating and paying overtime compensation to its employees who perform law enforcement activities.

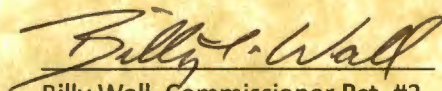
Although voted upon and adopted in open court, said action was not memorialized in the form of a written resolution. The Commissioner's Court of Burnet County hereby affirms this action taken on July 28, 2009 and hereby memorializes it in the adoption of said resolution.

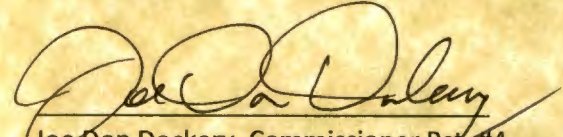
This 14-day work period began on the pay period following the adoption of this provision on July 28, 2009.
