

**RESOLUTION OF THE BURNET COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT
OBJECTING TO THE APPLICATION TO THE LOWER COLORADO RIVER
AUTHORITY, APPLICATION NO. 2024-5606, UNDER THE HIGHLAND
LAKES WATERSHED ORDINANCE SEEKING APPROVAL FOR THE
ESTABLISHMENT OF AN AGGREGATE PROCESSING PLANT AND
QUARRY NEAR INKS LAKE, BURNET COUNTY, TEXAS**

Whereas, The Lower Colorado River Authority (LCRA) has received an application from Asphalt Inc. for a permit under the Highland Lakes Watershed Ordinance for an aggregate processing plant and quarry near Inks Lake in Burnet County; and

Whereas, such application calls for a quarry and processing plant to be located within a population area that will be negatively affected. Such area includes recreation and tourism locations at and surrounding Inks Lake, business locations, and natural resource locations integral to the Texas Hill Country; and

Whereas, the proposed aggregate processing plant and quarry operations would negatively affect the health and safety of those in the vicinity through increased dust, noise pollution, and potential impacts to water quality; and

Whereas, the proposed operations will utilize water resources located in a geographic area in which water is limited, especially under drought conditions that regularly affect Burnet County; and

Whereas, the proposed operations will generate increased heavy truck traffic in a rural area, negatively affecting tourism to the business and recreation areas in the vicinity, cause further environmental impacts as operations expand in the area, and potentially deteriorate local infrastructure; and

Whereas, the proposed operations will impact existing natural resources in the vicinity of Inks Lake and pose a risk to the ecological balance that supports local wildlife, vegetation, and the water quality of the Highland Lakes system; and

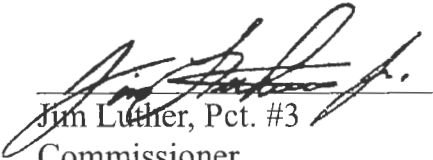
Whereas, numerous Burnet County residents have filed comments and objections to the proposed aggregate processing plant and quarry; and

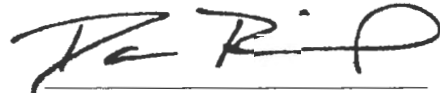

NOW THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED BY THE BURNET COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT:

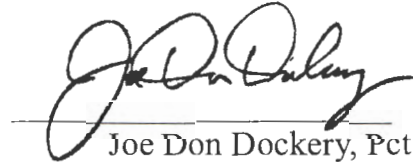

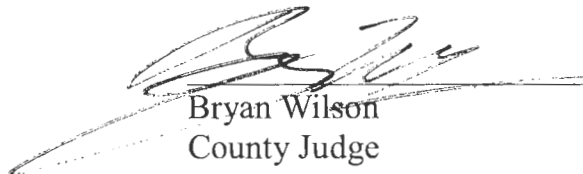

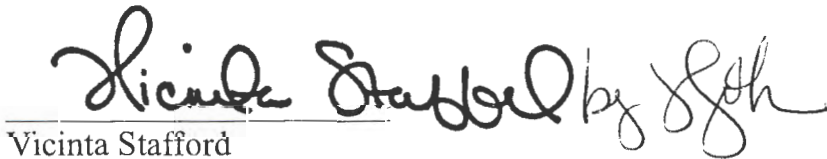
