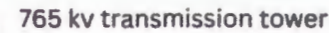
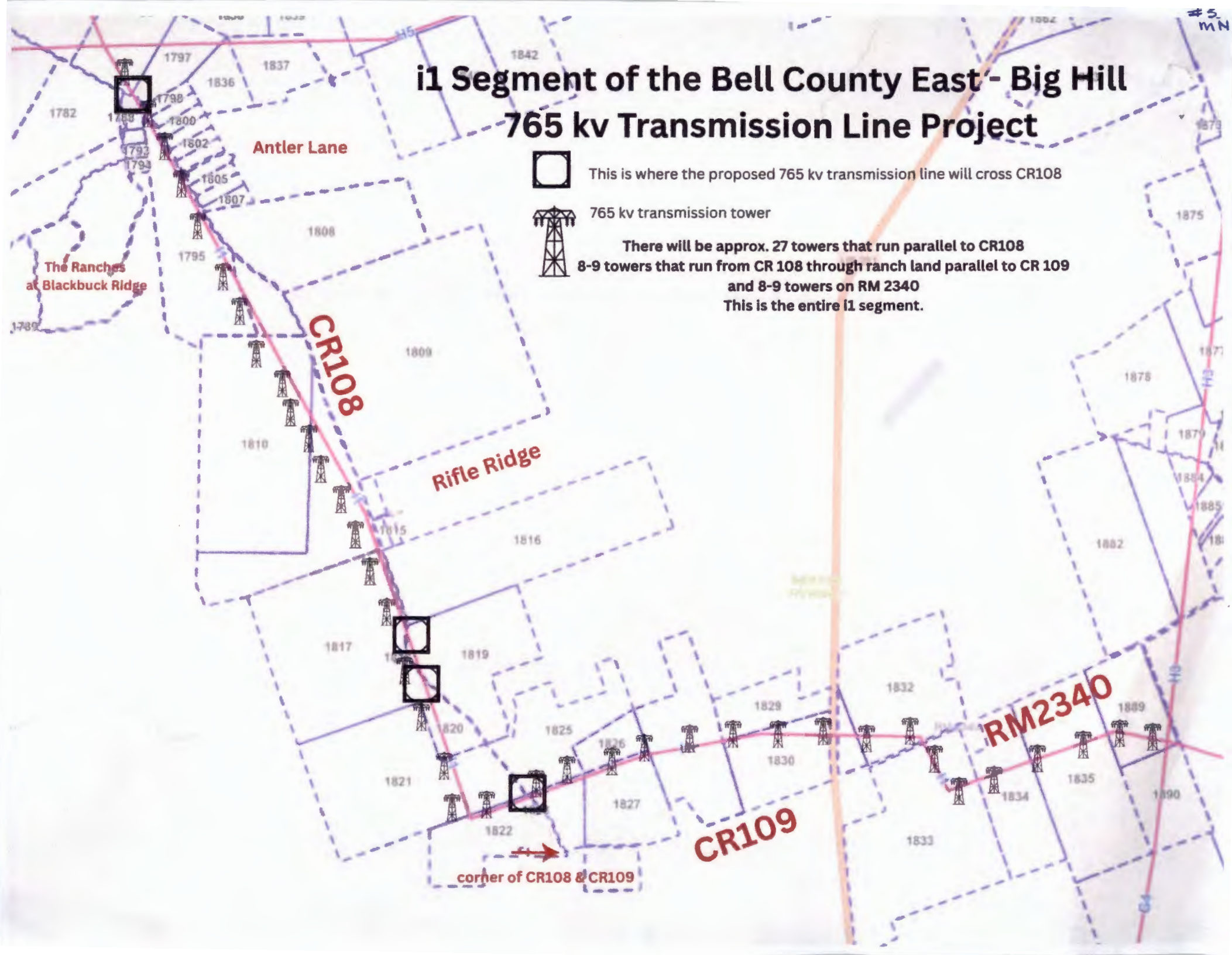

Good morning, commissioners.

I am here this morning to discuss the 765kv transmission line project that is going to affect Burnet and more specifically the i1 segment.

We are the i1 segment on CR108, CR109 and 2340. We have 129 residents that will be affected by this project should our segment be picked.

1. On 8-28-2025 the Lampasas Commissioners court sent a letter to LCRA expressing their concerns that the 765 project could threaten the integrity of their flood-control dams. They also shared the concerns of property value loss and environmental impact. While I applaud Lampasas for their letter, I am concerned that talking with LCRA or ONCOR will not get the same response as talking with the PUC.

Has Burnet reached out to either organization regarding this project? Will you be reaching out? I ask because many of us email I send daily with gets no response from LCRA or ONCOR.

2. Another concern we have is the repaving of our roads, should our segment be chosen. Whose budget is that in? CR108 requires monthly patching of holes with just normal traffic and everyone is concerned with large trucks transporting tower parts that the roads will be destroyed. Who will fix them? Who has budgeted the money? Will Burnet ask ONCOR for the money? Because I do not believe the burden should be on Burnet for something destroyed by this LCRA/ONCOR project.
3. I attended a meeting last Thursday which was held by Tom Green from the G4 segment. What I did not realize is that there are still many people this project will affect that are just finding out. There were many residents who live on our i1 segment that did not know until they received a letter from me. They never received their LCRA/ONCOR letter. How can you help us to spread the word? Can you post more on your FB page? Can you put a banner on your website? Can you have a weekly article in the news? How can you help us to get the word out to residents who are still unaware that this project is happening?
4. Here is my big ask. I have asked about this in every email to LCRA and ONCOR, with no response. I would like to see a cost analysis for bringing more power to the Permian Basin. Is a 765kv transmission line project more cost-effective vs building natural gas and wind power plants? Having additional power plants in the Permian Basin would be a wise choice for the data centers, and those power plants could also provide additional power for our existing Texas grid. Why pull lines all the way across Texas, through the land owned by hard working Texans when you can build a power plant to meet the same needs?

So, I will ask you to try and get the cost analysis? And if you get someone to discuss this with you, we would also like to see the geological reports they have done, the environmental reports and reports for internet tower disruption that uses radio signals, and to disclose any federal funding they may be receiving.
