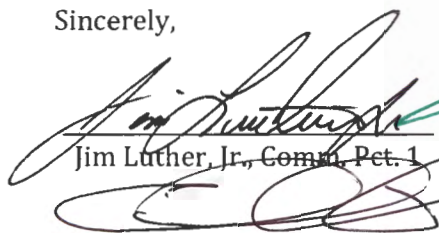
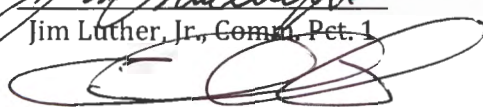

The existing configuration no longer adequately supports current traffic demands, contributing to congestion, limited passing opportunities, and turning conflicts. The addition of a continuous center turn lane and wider shoulders will improve roadway functionality, reduce delays, and enhance safety and travel times for motorists, cyclists, and emergency responders.

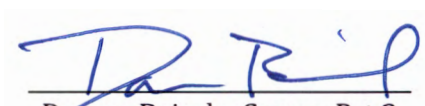
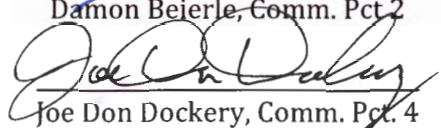
