

RESOLUTION

BURNET COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT

RELATING TO THE AUTHORITY OF THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE TO ADMINISTER FIREARMS PROFICIENCY TESTS TO QUALIFIED RETIRED LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

WHEREAS, Texas Penal Code section 46.15 and United States Code title 18 section 926C each provide for the carrying of concealed weapons by qualified retired law enforcement officers, subject to such officer holding a certificate of firearms proficiency that has been issued within the preceding 12 months;

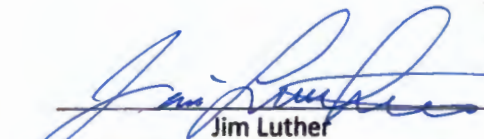
WHEREAS, Texas Occupations Code section 1701.357 provides for the establishment of procedures for administering firearms proficiency tests to those qualified retired law enforcement officers;

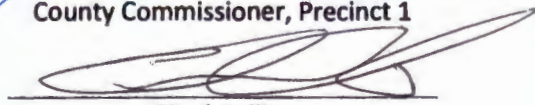
WHEREAS, section 1701.357 further requires that the commissioners court approve of a program where a county law enforcement agency would administer firearms proficiency tests and issue certificates of proficiency to those qualified retired law enforcement officers; and

WHEREAS, we find that it is in the best interest of public safety to facilitate such a program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that on this day, the Burnet County Commissioners Court authorized the Burnet County Sheriff's Office to administer firearms proficiency tests and issue certificates of proficiency to qualified retired law enforcement officers in compliance with all applicable statutes.

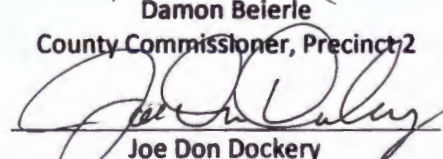
