

TURN IN MILEAGE FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT VEHICLES BY COUNTY

Williamson County

- Sheriff Office and Constables vehicles turn in is 100,000 miles or when annual maintenance and repair exceed the vehicles residual value

Lampasas County (Josh Swain talked to Deputy Chief)

- 4 year cycle - vehicle mileage ranges from 80,000 - 120,000
- Vehicles average about 20,000 miles a year

Travis County

- Sheriff Office vehicles are replaced at 60,000 miles
- Replaced vehicles may be used as secondary vehicles for non life threatening county functions. These vehicles have a mileage of 85,000 miles or 7 years

Bastrop County

- Sheriff Office mileage turn in 100,000 - 120,000

DPS

- Trooper mileage turn in is 100,000 - 120,000 (approximately 4 - 5 years)

Blanco County

- Sheriff Office vehicles turn in mileage of 120,000 miles

Gillespie County

- Sheriff Office mileage turn in 100,000 miles

Lampasas Police Department (Laurie spoke to the office)

- Case by case but generally 100,000 - 120,000 miles for turn in

Llano County

- Cars are driven until crashed or undriveable
- No mileage
