COUNCILMEMBER STEWART said this is a change order for a much larger water project at the 101 and 202 freeways. A few years ago, a pipe burst, and there were some anomalies in the project. The water leak was fixed but it was costly. We worked closely with the state because it was a state project and were reimbursed for the cost. This will provide the money up front, which will be paid back by the state. Councilmember Stewart thanked Governor Ducey, President Fann, Speaker Bowers, Senator Mesnard, Senator Bowie, Representative Whitaker, Representative Cobb, Representative Jermaine, Representative Pollock and Representative Epstein their support in getting that funding.
