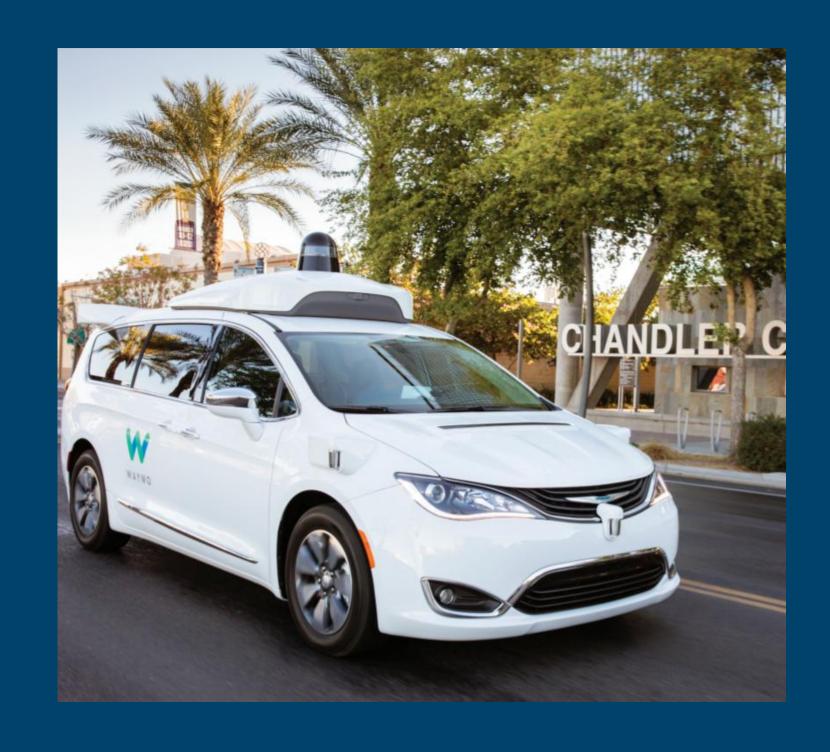

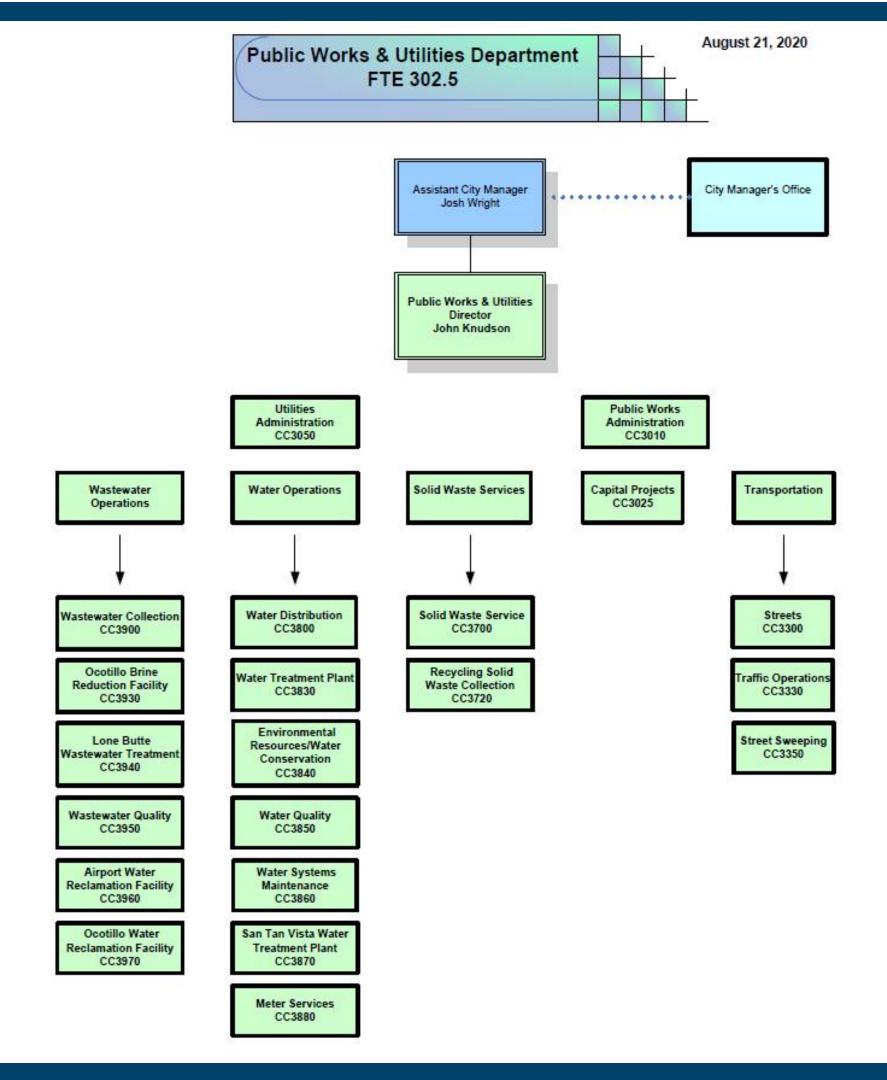

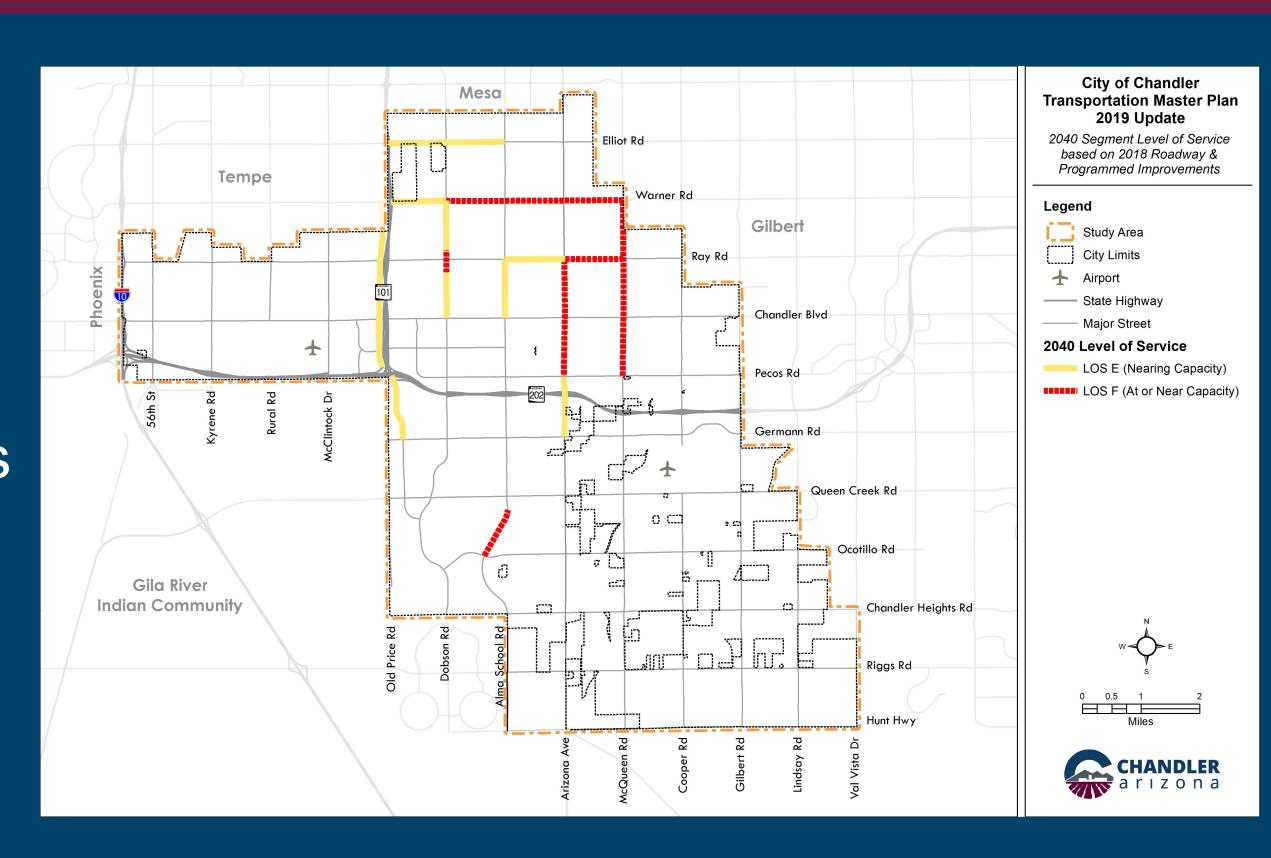

2040 Level of Service Without Improvements

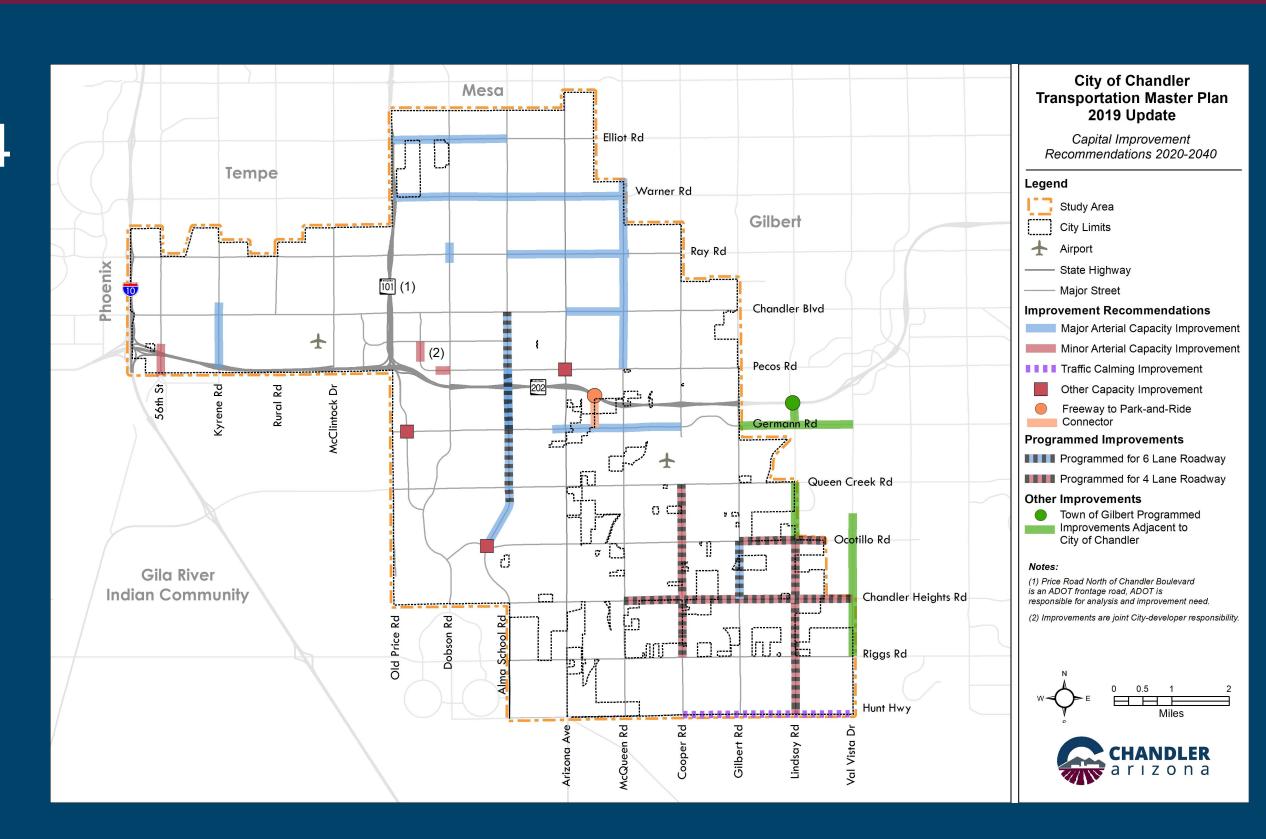

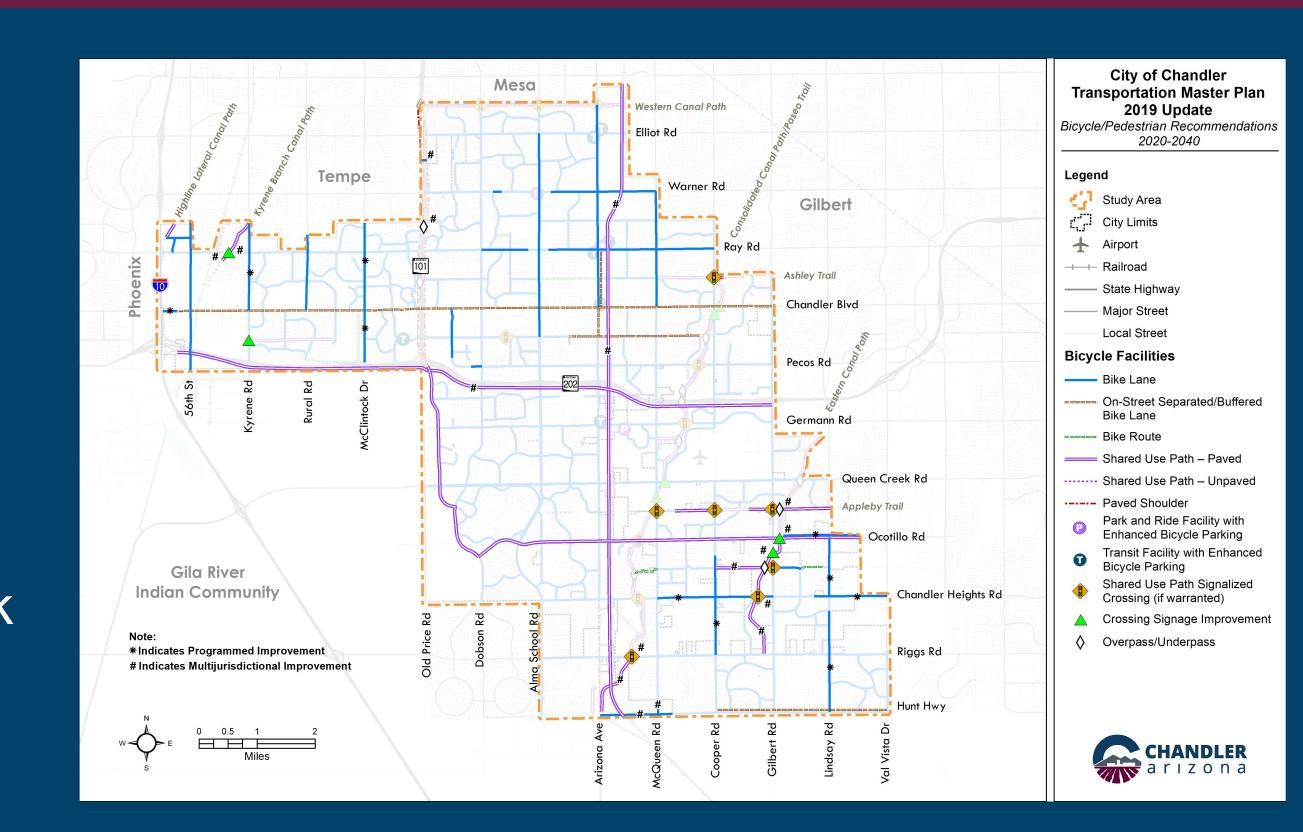
Roadway Recommendations (2020-2040)

- Network of primarily 4
 -lane and 6-lane roads
- Several 4-lane roads with 6 lanes at intersections north of Loop 202 and east of Loop 101
