Pursuant to A.R.S. §16-602, Cochise County conducted a hand count audit of the November 6, 2018 General Election.

The Cochise County Party Chairs from the Republican and Democrat Parties met at 2:00 pm on November 7, 2018 to begin the hand count audit process. The Chairwomen drew, by random lot, the following Vote Center and early batches for the hand count:

Vote Center #12, located in Bowie with 85 ballots cast on Election Day  
Batch #24 with 216 early ballots cast  
Batch #67 with 198 early ballots cast

Cochise County operates entirely on a Vote Center model, with 17 Vote Centers in operation this election. Although they randomly selected our smallest center, this method satisfied the precinct count requirement. All machines at the Vote Centers are fully ADA compliant.

All ballots were accounted for in the central counting location before the selection process began. There were 34,140 early ballots cast.

Four contested races were audited as required by law for the General Election:

Statewide Candidate	Governor
Federal Candidate	U.S. Representative
Statewide Legislative	State Senator LD14
Proposal	Prop. 127

Nine hand count workers (4 REP / 5 DEM) convened at 9:00 am on November 10, 2018 to begin the actual hand count. Following the administration of the Oath to all present and providing instructions, the physical

hand count began. The tabulation method used was the stacking method. The hand count was conducted by 3 boards, consisting of 3 members each.

The Board adjourned at 12:30pm with the hand count audit having been successfully completed.

Attached is the summary report, which depicts the results of the hand count audit for each race. I am happy to report that everything that was hand counted matched the machine determined results with only a .01% discrepancy in one race. That falls well into the acceptable range with the Party's being satisfied we met our legal obligation and our electronic equipment counted the votes accurately.
