1. Approve the Minutes of the Flood Control District meeting for March 24, 2020.

2. Approve Intergovernmental Agreement with the Palominas School District to allow public access to, and share maintenance for, current and future proposed multi-use trail on the Palominas Recharge property, effective May 19, 2020.

Mr. Mark Apel, Environmental Projects Coordinator, presented this item. Mr. Apel identified the project area as 285 acres adjacent to the Palominas schools' North and West boundaries. He met with the Palominas Elementary School Principal and School Superintendent to discuss using school property for parking and access to the multi-use trail, which would be open to both the school district and the community. On March 10, 2020, the Palominas School Board signed an intergovernmental agreement outlining the proposed usage, maintenance, and safe access via the school's property.

Vice-Chairman English commented the agreement was necessary before beginning the project.

Supervisor Judd asked if the trail would be open to the public at all times. Mr. Apel answered that they are looking at options to provide access for the public while maintaining the school's security.

Chairman Borer asked if any additional comments regarding this public hearing were received and Ms. Lemons stated there were none.

Vice-Chairman English made a motion to approve the Intergovernmental Agreement with the Palominas School District to allow public access to, and share maintenance for, current and future proposed multi-use trail on the Palominas Recharge property, effective May 19, 2020. Supervisor Judd seconded the motion.

Chairman Borer called for the vote and it was approved 3-0.
