C. Legislative Bills for Discussion and Possible Action

1) [HB 2194 drug overdose fatality review teams](#) (Nguyen)

- Summary: The bill reestablishes the Drug Overdose Fatality Review Team (Review Team) with the Arizona Department of Health Services (ADHS) that self-repealed on January 1, 2023 ([Laws 2017, Chapter 234](#)) and makes it an emergency measure that will be come effective on the Governor's signature. It establishes requirements for the Review Teams powers and duties, which includes providing assistance, minimum standards, protocols and training to local drug overdose fatality review teams (local review team). Prohibits local review team members or presenters from being questioned about information in a civil or criminal proceeding.

- 2) [SB 1307 constables; salaries](#) (Gowan)
 - Summary: SB 1307 increases the salary ranges for constables by approximately \$20,000 [detailed table below]. Establishes a salary floor of \$20,000 (increased from \$0) for precincts with 5,000 to 10,000 registered voters. Modifies references to documents served to include documents served or documents attempted to be served. Also dictates that the number of services or attempts are as reported on the constable standardized daily activity logs.
- 3) [SB 1413 homeless encampment; removal](#) (Wadsack)
 - Summary: As amended in committee the bill requires a county, city or town to notify anyone living within a homeless encampment that their belongings will be removed within 24 hours of receiving a notice to remove their property. Requires any property removed by the city, town, or county for at least 14 days to allow the property to be claimed and the space to be cleaned by the local government. Makes living in an encampment criminal trespassing when it is on private property.
- 4) [SB 1429 civil action; preliminary hearing](#) (Wadsack)
 - Summary: The court is required to conduct a preliminary hearing within 30 days in a civil action to determine if the case should proceed. The courts must evaluate if the plaintiff has a valid claim with sufficient evidence and if there is a motion to dismiss to issue a ruling on the motion to dismiss no later than the date of the preliminary hearing.
- 5) [SB 1565 ballot processing; electronic adjudication; limitation](#) (Carroll)
 - Summary: Prohibits the use of artificial intelligence or learning software or firmware to be used for processing early ballots, verifying voter's affidavit, checking the voter's affidavit; and electronic vote adjudication. Prohibits the use of experimental voting systems by the Secretary of State or the governing body of a city or town.
