B. Legislative Bills for Discussion and Possible Action

1. [HCR 2039 governor; state of emergency](#) (Chaplik)

Summary: States that for any state of emergency (SoE) that is not a state of war emergency, “*the state of emergency and any emergency powers granted to the Governor terminate ... thirty days after the date on which the SoE is declared*”, unless extended by the Legislature.

C. Legislative Bill Updates

1. [HB 2618 decommissioning; solar and wind; standards](#) (Griffin)

Summary: As amended in the Senate’s Committee on Natural Resources, Energy, and Water (NREW) committee, contains language specifying that the bill’s decommissioning and site restoration requirements “supersede any city, town, or county standard, rule, requirement or ordinance related to the decommissioning of a solar energy power plant or restoration of a solar energy power plant site unless otherwise specified.” Bill has not yet been “COW’d” to officially attach the NREW amendment. We continue to discuss amendments that preserve a county’s authority with the sponsor and their staff.

2. [HB 2617 carrying of firearms; constables](#) (Bliss)

Summary: Permits a constable, while on or off duty, to carry a firearm if the constable is AZPOST certified, or if the constable completes firearms training, undergoes a psychological exam and either possesses a concealed weapon permit or completes a background check approved by AZPOST.

3. [HB 2669 NOW: prohibition; biosolids; land application](#) (Dunn)

Summary: As amended in Senate Committee on Natural Resources, Energy, and Water, codifies Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) rule with respect to requiring domestic septage to meet pathogen reduction requirements. Additionally, requires a biosolid mixed with a solid waste to be regulated as a solid waste.

4. [SB 1307 constables; salaries](#) (Gowan)

Summary: As amended on the House Floor, modifies statutory constable salary ranges as reflected in the table below.
