

## Executive Summary Form

### Agenda Number: 7224 (Healthy People Healthy Communities IGA)

#### **Recommendation:**

Approval of ADHS Contract No. CTR055282 Amendment No. 3 - Healthy People Healthy Communities, between the Arizona Department of Health Services and Cochise County Health & Social Services, for the period of 07/01/2023 to 6/30/2024 in the amount of \$556,421. This contract was formerly titled ADHS IGA 2020-015.

#### **Background (Brief):**

The Healthy People Health Communities IGA was implemented by the Arizona Department of Health Services to best apply the goals of the state's Health Improvement Plan (AzHIP). This IGA combines several programs into one shared IGA – Tobacco Prevention, Health in Az Policy Initiative and Chronic Disease Prevention, Teen Pregnancy Prevention, and Suicide Mortality Review Program. The original IGA is into its 9<sup>th</sup> year. This IGA serves people of all ages – youth, teens, and adults. The programs address several health priorities, including but not limited to: cardiovascular disease, chronic lower respiratory diseases, Alzheimer's, obesity, teen pregnancy, tobacco and vaping use, worksite wellness, school health wellness, and suicide mortality review. Outreach is provided via group workshops, health fairs, classroom education, policy assistance development, and fatality review. This IGA currently funds 8 county positions. The total budget for all programs within the IGA is \$556,421.

#### **Fiscal Impact & Funding Sources:**

This is a grant-funded fixed-price program through the Arizona Department of Health Services in the amount of \$556,421. All programs are state funded. This IGA currently funds 8 employees.
