B. Legislative Bills for Discussion and Possible Action

- 1) **HB 2318:** state match fund; rural transportation (*Dunn*)
 - **Summary:** Makes changes to the SMART grant program for rural transportation projects. Changes include allowing the State Transportation Board to redistribute unawarded monies in the fund across applicable categories and expanding the eligible entities from a political subdivision to “an entity that is eligible to receive a federal grant”. Makes changes to allowable uses of grant funding to include funding, instead of reimbursing, design and engineering costs and requiring that grant applicants in that category apply for a federal grant within two years. Requires that the Board rescind an award if an applicant receives funding from another source for the same project.
- 2) **HB 2382:** TPT; sourcing; validation (*Carter*)
 - **Summary:** Requires ADOR to make various changes related to appropriate sourcing and tax remission for remote purchases subject to TPT. Changes include:
 - Requires ADOR to establish a Taxpayer Assistance Team to ensure taxpayers are levying the correct TPT rate and sourcing the transaction to the correct jurisdictions.
 - Requires ADOR to create process to certify third-party providers that offer sourcing services to businesses who pay TPT.
 - Requires ADOR to conduct a taxpayer education campaign to educate and obtain feedback from remote sellers, marketplace facilitators, and TPT license holders in unincorporated areas of a county on issues related to the correct use of the TPT rates and transaction sourcing methods by December 31, 2024. ADOR would be required to submit a report on the taxpayer education campaign and feedback received to the Governor and legislature by March 31, 2025.
- 3) **HB 2383:** coordinated reentry planning grant program (*Livingston*)
 - **Summary:** Establishes the Coordinated Reentry Planning Services Grant Program and appropriates \$20 million in opioid settlement money. The Program includes 11 counties, excluding Maricopa, Pima, Greenlee, and Yuma. A strike everything amendment to the bill is similar, however, it adds Greenlee and Yuma counties to the Program and limits total grants to \$2.5m per county in a 2-year cycle.
- 4) **HB 2547:** voting centers ban; precinct size (*Jones*)
 - **Summary:** Prohibits an election precinct from exceeding 1,000 voters. Prohibits a Board of Supervisors from authorizing the use of voting centers.
- 5) **HCR 2032:** voting centers; precinct voting (*Jones*)
 - **Summary:** Amends the Constitution, prohibits an election precinct from exceeding 1,000 voters. Prohibits a Board of Supervisors from authorizing the use of voting centers.

- 6) **HB 2534:** Native American tribes; TPT collection (*Tsosie*)
 - **Summary:** Proposes collecting state transaction privilege tax (TPT) on transactions within *consenting indian tribes* and including the *consenting indian tribes* in the state shared TPT distribution formula. Adds *consenting indian tribes* as a recipient in the county TPT distribution formula. Includes a process for becoming a *consenting indian tribe* which includes Congressional approval and consent from the governing body of the indian tribe.
- 7) **HB 2593:** public records; time frame (*Carbone*)
 - **Summary:** Requires an entity subject to a public records request to provide, within five business days after receipt of the request, a notification including:
 - a. That the request has been received.
 - b. Contact information of the employee or department authorized and able to provide the information requested or able to forward the request to such a department.
 - c. The expected date the request will be processed.Specifies that this section does not prohibit an entity from “subsequently notifying a requestor of a public record of the denial or delay of the request.” States that if it is determined that an entity “willfully or unintentionally refuses to comply ... or otherwise acts in bad faith, the entity shall be assessed a civil penalty of at least \$500 but not more than \$5,000 for each occurrence.” Specifies that the “aggravation or mitigation” of the entity, as well as if the entity has previously been assessed penalties, shall be considered.
