CSA President Steve Miller welcomed everyone. Jacob Emmett called roll and a quorum was present.

CSA Legislative Agenda

Adopted Budget Priorities. Adopted Policy Priorities. Jacob Emmett provided a report on CSA's legislative agenda and the status of the legislative session. He noted it is the 110th day of session and the focus is on floor action and the budget. He provided an update on legislation pertaining to the Supreme Court decision on the abortion issue. CSA recognized today was Kavya Venkatraman's last day with CSA and thanked her.

Legislative Bills for Discussion and Possible Action

- 1) **SB 1370:** Youth businesses; licenses; tax: exemptions

Jacob Emmett explained SB 1370. Supervisor Lynne Pancrazi agreed that the issue is parents listing the business under their child's name to avoid licensing, even though the child is not involved in the business.

Supervisor Richard Lunt moved to oppose the bill as written. Supervisor Lynne Pancrazi seconded

the motion. Supervisor Paul David agreed with the group, however, would like to see If the bill could be amended, to include payment of sales taxes and the business license fee waived. He felt it may help keep the youth from going into an underground economy after they turn of age 18.

Jacob clarified the CSA plan of action: CSA will ask the sponsor to amend the bill. Jacob stated SB 1370 has already been passed by both the Senate and the House, and any changes would require the bill to be sent to a conference committee for an amendment.

The motion to oppose SB 1370 passed unanimously.
