1. Approve the Minutes of the Flood Control District meeting for September 24, 2024.

Supervisor Judd made a motion to approve consent agenda item 1. Vice-Chairman Crosby seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

2. Approve Intergovernmental Grant Agreement GA-ARPA-COCH-102124-01, State of Arizona, The Office of the Governor, for the Cochise Conservation and Recharge Network, Coyote Wash Stormwater Management Initiative, in the amount of \$1,500,000, effective October 21, 2024, through December 31, 2025.

Supervisor Judd made a motion to approve Intergovernmental Grant Agreement GA-ARPA-COCH-102124-01, State of Arizona, The Office of the Governor, for the Cochise Conservation and Recharge Network, Coyote Wash Stormwater Management Initiative, in the amount of \$1,500,000, effective October 21, 2024, through December 31, 2025. Vice-Chairman Crosby seconded the motion.

Jackie Watkins, Engineering and Natural Resources Director, presented this item. Ms. Watkins stated the Coyote Wash Project has now secured full funding, totaling \$6.85 million, through a combination of grants, including recent funding that filled the last \$1.5 million gap. She stated the project is designed to reduce flooding over Moson Road by channeling floodwaters into a former gravel pit. She stated the setup will not only control flooding but also support local aquifer recharge, benefiting nearby wells. Ms. Watkins stated the project's design phase is scheduled to be completed by year's end, with construction starting next year.

Vice-Chairman Crosby called for the vote and it was approved 2-0.

Vice-Chairman Crosby adjourned the meeting at 10:04 a.m.
