I have been actively engaged in the delivery and management of fire and EMS in southern Arizona for over 40 years. This experience has crossed over multiple disciplines including military, civilian, ground and air.

Most recently, I was the assistant EMS Chief in northern County for HCI. I was responsible for the supervision of 35+ FT and PT EMT's and Paramedics and a fleet of six(6) vehicles. We were the primary 911 EMS responder for over 3500 sq miles of northern Cochise County.
