President Lynne Pancrazi welcomed everyone. Penny Adams called roll and a quorum was present.

CSA Legislative Agenda

Adopted Budget Priorities and Adopted Policy Priorities. Craig Sullivan reported this was the last week to hear bills in policy committees, but Appropriations will meet next week. He noted legislation will need to move through committee of the whole, floor committees, and then, hopefully, budget action. Craig reported CSA has several meetings scheduled with legislators to discuss the budget stance.

Craig reported SB 1035 postconviction relief proceedings; hourly rate passed out of House Judiciary and the CSA team worked to get the Appropriations committee chairman to hear the bill, but he insisted on a cap. Craig stated CSA then checked with Maricopa, Pima, and Pinal counties. The bill is scheduled to be in House Appropriations next week.

Craig reported SB 1217 counties; publication requirements; electronic newspaper was not heard in committee this week and is dead.

Legislative Bills for Discussion and Possible Action

1) Bills for POSSIBLE ACTION

- a) **HB 2706**: mental health; intensive treatment orders. Jacob Emnett presented HB 2706 and said he received concerns from counties about the costs associated with the services listed in the bill. Jacob stated the LPC had previously opposed the bill, staff convened a stakeholder group of counties, and staff now recommends a neutral position. Discussion occurred.
- b) **SB 1257**: impaired persons; court-ordered stabilization. Jacob presented SB 1257 and noted the CSA board had taken a position of opposition at the last board meeting. He indicated the proponents have produced an amendment that would alter the legislation to apply to only Pima County. Discussion occurred. Supervisor Sonny Borrelli moved to support SB 1257. Supervisor Rudy Molera seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

2) Bills for UPDATES

- a) **HB 2104**: emissions; voluntary vehicle repair; timeline & **HB 2105**: violation; unlawful open burning; enforcement. Kaytlin King reported the LPC had initially supported HB 2105 strike-everything, but the bill was not heard in a committee. She noted HB 2104 passed Senate Natural Resources. Kaytlin reported HB 2105 was amended onto HB 2104 and then passed its committee.
- b) **SB 1227**: **NOW**: ACJC; continuation revision & **SB 1223**: ACJC; continuation. Kaytlin reported the LPC initially supported SB 1223, but it did not move in its original chamber. SB 1227 strike-everything passed Judiciary this week.
- c) **HB 2704**: tax; distribution; county stadium district. Vanessa Fielder provided an update on the various amendments to the bill. She noted it passed Senate Finance and is scheduled for House Appropriations next week. Discussion occurred.
- d) **HB 2433**: county treasurers; continuing education. Craig Sullivan reported on the various amendments to the bill and the new training requirements. He noted the bill passed out of committee 6-1. Craig reported the sponsor had requested CSA's support of an amendment in committee to which CSA complied. Discussion occurred.
- e) **HB 2927**: public meetings; records; requirements; penalties. Jacob reported on the number of changes to HB 2927. He reported that Senator Hoffman asked for CSA's support (CSA is at neutral currently) and it will be brought to the LPC next week for consideration. Discussion occurred.
- f) **HB 2928**: accessory dwelling units; requirements. Jacob reported CSA met with county planning and zoning personnel to discuss concerns. He noted CSA shifted its position to neutral after the proponents agreed to address concerns produced by county planning and zoning.

Other Legislative Issues
