Community-Driven Planning Process

Our comprehensive plan reflects the voices of residents across Cochise County through surveys, website feedback, and community meetings. The Comprehensive Plan 2045 process featured one of the most robust engagement efforts in Cochise County's history. From mid-2024 to fall 2025, the project website had over **4,100 visits**, with more than **400 contributions** and **360 registered participants**. Residents engaged through **11 online tools**, including surveys on growth, housing, and water resources. The County also hosted **nine public meetings** between October 2024 and March 2025.

Key priorities identified:

- Housing affordability and availability
- Preserving rural character and landscapes
- Water security and conservation
- Infrastructure improvements
- Youth retention and economic opportunity

Water Resources Element

Water availability is Cochise County's most pressing challenge, requiring immediate action and long-term planning.

Current Sources

Groundwater aquifers, surface water (San Pedro River, Parker Canyon Lake), reclaimed effluent

Key Challenge

Declining aquifer levels, climate stress and drought threatening long-term sustainability, intensive use by key industries

Keep the Water Flowing

Coordinate with ADWR, municipalities, irrigation districts, and private providers



Pure & Protected

Safeguard water quality through best management practices, source protection, and land use coordination



Use it Wisely

Promote conservation, efficiency measures, effluent reuse, stormwater capture, and recharge projects



Recharge & Restore

Protect aquifers and restore riparian systems for natural water storage, Participate in CCRN initiatives



Plan Ahead

Build resilience to drought and climate change through adaptive management, evaluate emerging supply strategies (desalination, inter-basin transfers, advanced reuse)

Revitalize Our Neighborhoods

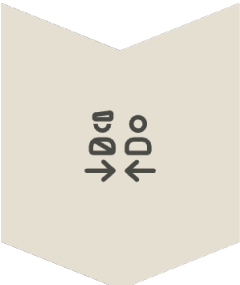
Strategic investment in infrastructure, code compliance, and enhanced waste services will transform distressed areas. Community engagement remains central to successful revitalization efforts.

Expanding rental assistance programs and reducing housing insecurity through policies aligned with state affordable housing initiatives.

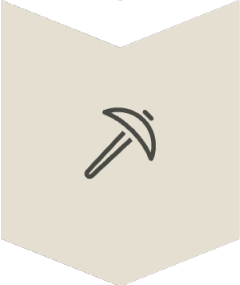

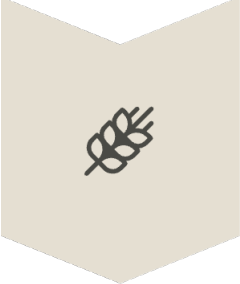

Enhancing port facilities and infrastructure to boost cross-border trade and create local employment opportunities

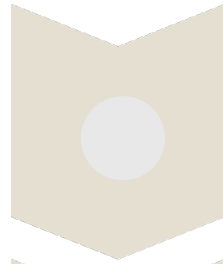

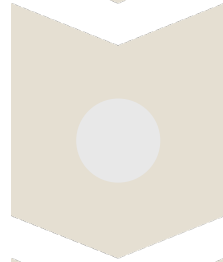

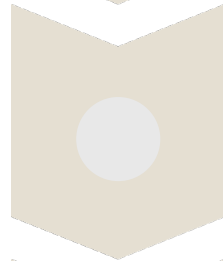

Gather Input, Authorize 60-day Review



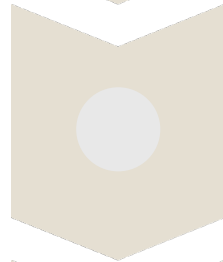
Agency & Local Review

Post on website, share draft with state agencies, SEAGO, military, neighboring counties, city/town in the county, additional public meetings



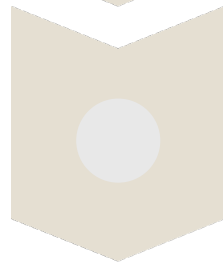
Planning Commission Hearing (February)
