President Alton Joe Shepherd welcomed everyone. Penny Adams called roll and a quorum was present.

Minutes for Consideration and Approval

Supervisor Lynne Pancrazi made a motion to approve the minutes of the January 30, 2026, CSA Legislative Policy Committee meeting. Supervisor Sonny Borrelli seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

CSA Legislative Agenda

Legislative Context. Jacob Emmett provided an overview of the current legislative context, including how many bills, resolutions, and memorials have been introduced this session. He noted the House of Representatives has surpassed 1,000 bills introduced this session, which has the new number designation jumping to the 4,000s. He noted today marked the 26th day of the legislative session, and is the deadline to request bill folders be opened.

Adopted Budget Priorities and Adopted Policy Priorities. Jacob reported on the status of the Association's adopted budget priorities and legislative priority bills, giving details on a few of the bills.

Legislative Bills for Discussion and Possible Action

FOR ACTION

- *Public Health*
 - 1) **HB 2118:** mobile food vendors; licensure. Kaytlin King reported CSA had reached out to the bill sponsor for clarification of the bill after mixed feedback from the counties had been received. Supervisor Lynne Pancrazi made a motion to oppose HB 2118, and Supervisor Lena Fowler seconded the motion. Discussion occurred. The motion passed unanimously.
 - 2) **SB 1462:** animal control officers; mandatory training. Kaytlin explained SB 1462. Supervisor Lena Fowler moved to oppose SB 1462 and Supervisor Rex Scott seconded the motion. Discussion occurred. The motion passed unanimously.
 - 3) **SB 1270:** correctional officers; supplemental contributions. Vanessa Fielder explained SB 1270 and indicated staff was looking for direction. Discussion occurred. Craig Sullivan noted he and Vanessa would meet with the proponents of the bill and discuss the issue with the county managers.
 - 4) **SB 1504:** PSPRS; service requirement; cost-of-living adjustment. Vanessa indicated SB 1504 was scheduled for the Senate Public Safety committee next week. She provided a detailed explanation of the legislation and the fiscal impact. Discussion occurred. Supervisor Paul David moved to oppose SB 1504 as is. Supervisor Lena Fowler seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.
- *Planning and Zoning*
 - 5) **SB 1241:** municipalities; counties; private permitting providers. Jacob explained SB 1241 and stated it would be in Senate Regulatory Affairs & Government Efficiency next week. Discussion occurred. Supervisor Duce Minor made a motion to oppose SB 1241. Supervisor Sonny Borrelli seconded the motion and the motion passed with Supervisors Steve Miller and Luis Carlos Davis in opposition.
- *Short Term Rentals*
 - 6) **SB 1261:** short-term rentals; vacation rentals; occupancy &
 - 7) **HB 2429:** vacation rentals; short-term rentals; occupancy. Jacob presented the two short term rental bills, SB 1261 and HB 2429, together. He noted the League of Cities and Towns is focused on moving the two bills forward. He stated CSA will continue to monitor the bills as they relate to the resolution CSA adopted at the Summit. Discussion occurred.
- *Small Land Subdivisions*
 - 8) **HB 2100:** small land subdivision; requirements. Jacob presented HB 2100 for information only. Discussion occurred.
- *Court Costs*
 - 9) **HB 2265:** courts; fees; assessments. &
 - 10) **HB 2972:** protected persons; jury trial right &
 - 11) **SB 1330:** family court; right to jury. Kaytlin presented HB 2265, HB 2972, and SB 1330 as comparable bills that fall in line with the court resolution CSA adopted at the Summit. Discussion occurred. Supervisor Lynne Pancrazi made a motion to oppose HB 2265, HB 2972, and SB 1330, seconded by Supervisor Lena Fowler. The motion passed unanimously.
