Increase students receiving services, from 20% → 25%

Reduce the student-provider ratio in the county from 804:1 to 459:1 within five (5) years.

Create Consortium

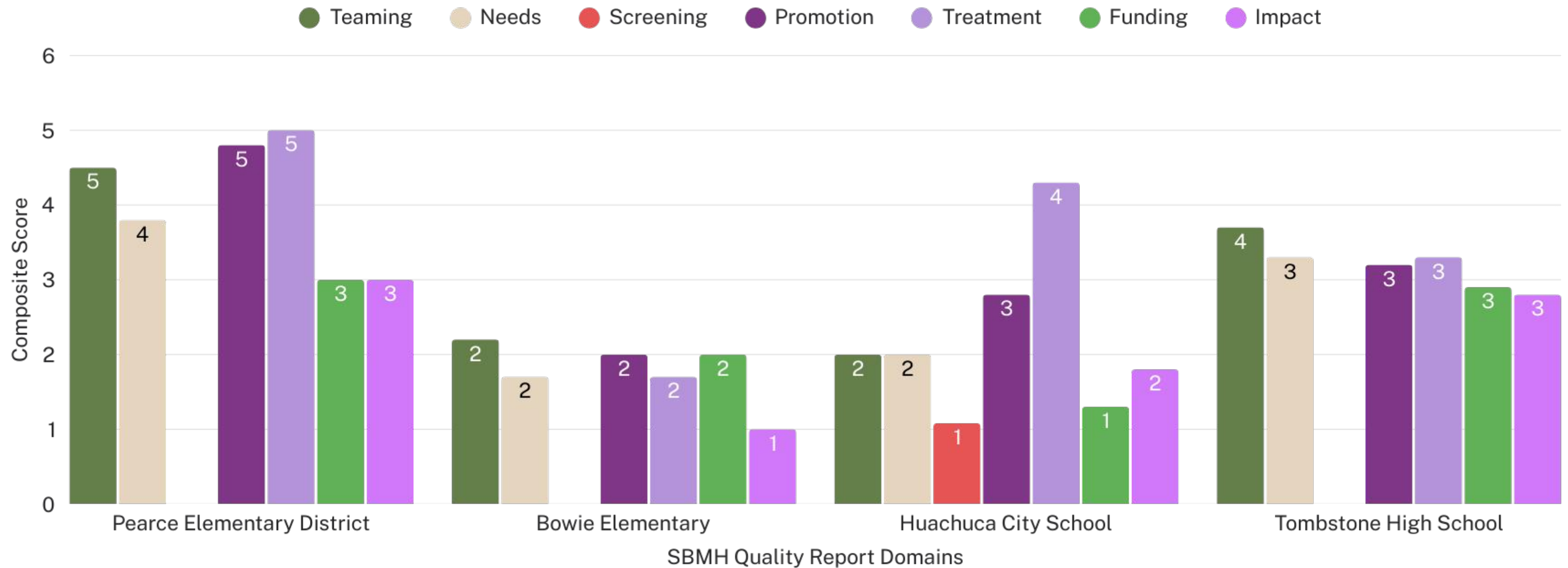
From the data collected, Consortium is created so schools buy into, to continue services, post-grant.

Why This Matters?

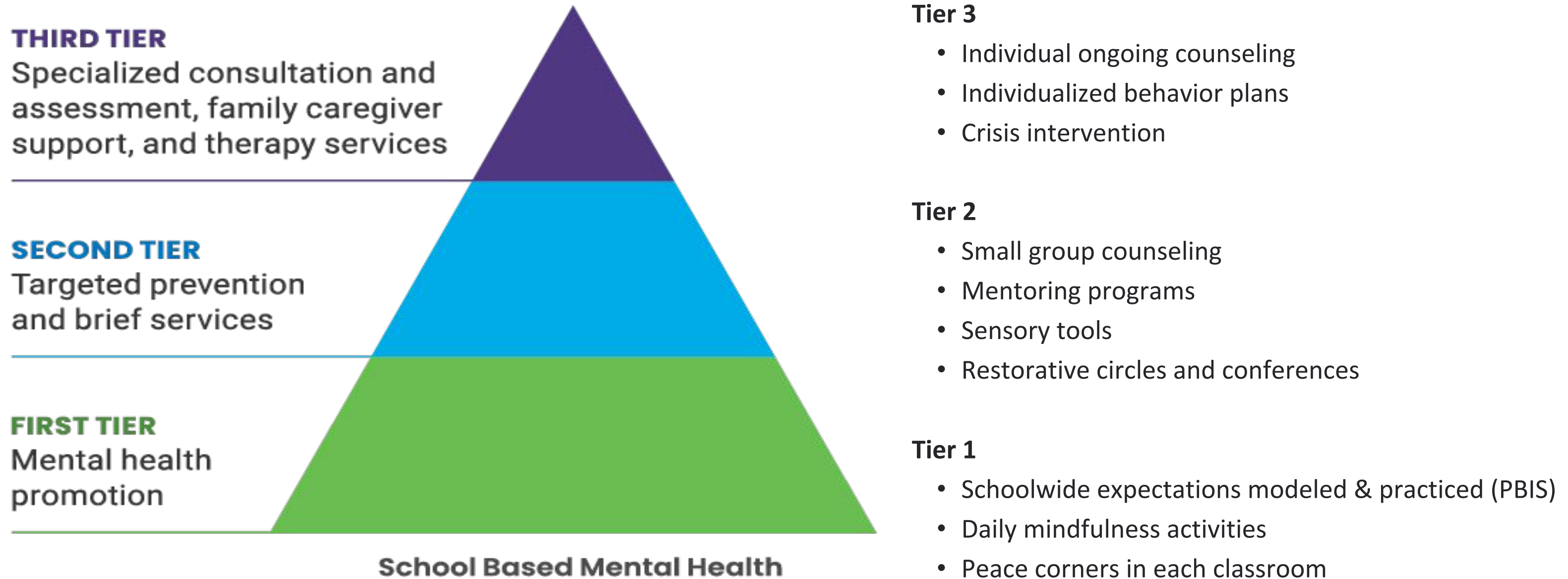
- Earlier support = better outcomes
