In 2006, I transferred to the Civil Division of the Cochise County Attorney's Office. As a civil deputy, I was assigned numerous departments within the County structure to include, but not limited to, human resources, the Sheriff's Office, Procurement, the Treasurer's Office, the Health Department, Bankruptcy filings, the Housing Department, the Public Fiduciary, Waste Management, the Assessor's Office and Risk Management.

During my time as a Civil Deputy, I represented the Sheriff's Office throughout the SB1070 litigation. I also negotiated settlements arising from USERRA violations and Hatch Act violations. I successfully represented the health department in administrative hearings, successfully represented the County in EEOC complaints and hearings. In addition, I successfully represented the County in all human resource hearings that arose during my period of employment.

In October 2014, I applied for and was appointed to the Cochise County Superior Court bench as a judge pro tempore until my retirement in September 2025.
