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5. Presentation and Discussion of Engineering Project Updates

Brad Moery presented the quarterly engineering updates.

- 2nd Street sidewalk project (Santa Fe to I-35) ODOT November letting construction early 2026.
- Arcadia Lake Trail – NW Connector – ODOT August letting construction late 2025 to early 2026.
- Broadway Downtown ADA and Traffic Signal Improvements – Completion by approximately end of summer.
- Creekbend Trail – Phase 1 done; Striping concerns being addressed. Phase 2 – Property acquisition in progress. Approximately 60% complete.
- Danforth and Kelly Intersection Improvements – Awarded to Built Right construction and should start in a few weeks.
- I-35 NB Frontage Road Trail – Tied to I-35 ramp and frontage road project. This should be bid out later this year.
- Kickingbird Bike Lane – Overlay Kickingbird Rd first, then separated bike lanes with vertical

delineators.

- SH66 from Post Road to Westminster – 60% deliverable in upcoming weeks.
- Spring Creek to Carl Reherman Park – Currently in preliminary design
- Vista Lane Trail (Hafer Park N to 2nd St) – Completion approximately early 2026
- West Downtown Walkability and ADA Improvements – Construction mid to late 2026.

6. Discussion of a Pedestrian Crossing at 5th across Boulevard.

Steve Lawrence, Director of Engineering, and Corson Smith, Senior Traffic Engineer, spoke about the possible need for a pedestrian crossing at 5th and Boulevard. Corson Smith spoke about the HAWK signal and went over the cost and effectiveness of the signal. He stated the cost would be approximately \$250,000 with all construction included versus \$550,000 for normal traffic signal.
