LOCAL LAW TO BE ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE LOCAL LAW INTRO. – NO. __2-1___ - 2024 LOCAL LAW – NO. _____ - 2024

A LOCAL LAW requiring transparent, searchable databases for expenditures accessible and available to the public.

SECTION 1. Title

This law shall be entitled and known as "The Tax Dollar Disclosure Act."

SECTION 2. Legislative Intent

The Erie County Legislature recognizes that taxpayers should have easy access to details on how the county is spending their tax dollars and what performance results are achieved for those expenditures. It is the intent of the Legislature, therefore, to direct the Erie County Comptroller to create and maintain a searchable budget database website detailing where, for what purpose, and what results are achieved for all taxpayer investments in county government.

SECTION 3. Definitions

AGENCY

A county department, division, office, bureau, board, commission, committee, or unit. This includes individual county agencies and programs, as well as those programs and activities that cross agency lines. "County agency" includes all elective offices in Erie County government.

AUDIT OR REPORT

Shall include any audit or report issued by the state, county, legislature, legislative committee, comptroller or executive body relating to the entity or recipient of funds or the budget program/activity or agency.

COMPTROLLER

The Erie County Comptroller.

ENTITY/AND OR RECIPIENTS

- A. a corporation,
- B. an association,

- C. a union,
- D. a limited liability company,
- E. a limited liability partnership,
- F. any other legal business entity including non-profits,
- G. grantees,
- H. contractors, and
- I. a county, city, or other local government entity.
- J. "Entity/and or recipients" does not include an individual recipient of public assistance.

FUNDING SOURCE

The account from which the expenditure is appropriated, inclusive of all budgeted accounts.

FUNDING ACTION OR EXPENDITURE

Shall include details on the type of spending (grant, contract, appropriations, etc.). This includes tax exemptions or credits. Where possible, a hyperlink to the actual expenditure document (in a format that is, at a minimum, as searchable as a searchable PDF format) shall be provided.

LEGISLATURE

The Erie County Legislature.

SEARCHABLE BUDGET DATABASE WEBSITE

A website that allows the public, at no cost, to:

- A. Search and aggregate information for the following:
 - 1. the name and principal location or residence of the entity/and or recipients of funds,
 - 2. the amount of funds expended,
 - 3. the funding or expending agency,
 - 4. the funding source of the revenue expended,
 - 5. the budget program/activity of the expenditure,

- 6. a descriptive purpose for the funding action or expenditure,
- 7. the expected performance outcome for the funding action or expenditure,
- 8. the past performance outcomes achieved for the funding action or expenditure,
- 9. any audit or report relating to the entity or recipient of funds or the budget program/activity or agency,
- 10. and any other relevant information specified by the Comptroller.
- B. Programmatically search and access all data in a serialized machine-readable format (such as XML) via a web-services application programming interface.

SECTION 4. Searchable Budget Database Website Created

By October 1, 2024, the Comptroller shall develop and make publicly available a single, searchable budget database website including the required data for the most recent county budget. The website shall be given a unique and simplified website address. Each county agency that maintains a generally accessible Internet site or for which a generally accessible Internet site is maintained shall include a link on the front page of the agency's Internet site to the budget database website.

SECTION 5. Updates

The Comptroller shall provide guidance to agency heads to ensure compliance with this section. The searchable budget database website shall be updated as new data becomes available, if feasible, but no later than 30 days upon receipt of data from the agency.

The Comptroller shall ensure that all data added to the searchable budget database website remains accessible to the public for a minimum of six years.

SECTION 6. Compliance with the Act

The Comptroller shall not be considered in compliance with this act if the data required for the searchable budget database website is not available in a searchable and aggregate manner and/or the public is redirected to other government websites, unless each of those sites has information from all agencies and each category of information required can be searched electronically by field in a single search.

SECTION 7. Severability

If any part or provision of this chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this chapter or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances. The County of Erie hereby declares that it would have passed this chapter or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

SECTION 8. Repealer

All ordinances, local laws, and parts thereof inconsistent with this chapter are hereby repealed; provided, however, that such repeal shall not affect or impair any act done or right accruing, accrued, or acquired, or penalty, charge, liability, forfeiture, or punishment incurred or owing prior to the time such repeal takes effect, but the same may be enjoyed, asserted, collected, enforced, prosecuted, or inflicted as fully and to the same extent as if such repeal had not been effected. All actions and proceedings, civil or criminal, commenced under or by virtue of any provision of any County of Erie local law, ordinance or resolution so repealed, and pending immediately prior to the taking effect of such repeal, may be prosecuted and defended to final effect in the same manner as they might if such provisions were not so repealed.

SECTION 9. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect on October 1, 2024.

A LOCAL LAW requiring meetings of Erie County Boards and Advisory Committees to provide access to information to the public.

SECTION 1. Title

This law shall be entitled and known as "The Meetings Transparency Act."

SECTION 2. Legislative Intent

The Erie County Legislature recognizes that taxpayers should have easy access to details discussed and acted upon at public meetings. The Erie County Legislature prepares an agenda which it posts prior to session, streams and has available for replay video of the meeting and posts the minutes of meeting for review. Readily available technology should be used to increase access to similar discussions and actions of commissions and boards.

SECTION 3. Definitions

BOARD

Any government board, commission, council, committee, advisory committee, panel or similar group that is created pursuant to the Erie County Charter, Code or Local Law.

SECTION 4. Meeting Minutes

Boards shall keep written minutes summarizing all official actions, discussions, public comments, and votes taken at each meeting.

Draft minutes shall be made available to the public within 10 business days after each meeting.

Minutes shall be officially approved at the board's next public meeting and a final version posted publicly online within 5 business days after approval. The minutes also must be submitted to the Clerk of the Legislature to be included in the official record.

SECTION 5. Notice and Agendas

Boards shall give public notice at least 7 calendar days prior to any regular meeting by prominently posting the date, time, location, and agenda on the general Erie County website, as well as the website of the Erie County Legislature.

For special or emergency meetings, notice should be provided as soon as is practicable.

Meeting agendas shall include a list of topics to be discussed, a list of invited speakers, and indicate if any votes or official actions are anticipated.

SECTION 6. Broadcast and Recording of Meetings

To the extent feasible, boards should also provide a live stream of meetings for public viewing. Erie County is required to make appropriate accommodation for each board to make this possible. If a live stream is not possible, meetings should at minimum be video recorded and the recording should be posted on the general Erie County website.

SECTION 7. Public Access to Records

Boards shall maintain information to be posted on Erie County's website providing access to board member information, past meeting minutes, agendas, recordings, reports, resolutions, and other official documents.

Upon public request, boards shall provide copies or electronic access to such records in a timely manner as allowable by public records laws.

SECTION 8. Public Comment

Boards should provide reasonable opportunities for public comment at each meeting.

Any restrictions on public comment shall be viewpoint-neutral and clearly stated in the board's policies.

SECTION 9. Compliance

Originating governmental bodies shall establish procedures to monitor and ensure compliance with this law.

SECTION 10. Severability

If any part or provision of this chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this chapter or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances. The County of Erie hereby declares that it would have passed this chapter or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

SECTION 11. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect on September 1, 2024.

COUNTY OF ERIE

LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. ____-2024

LOCAL LAW NO. ____-2024

A Local Law amending Local Law 1-1959, constituting the Erie County Charter, as amended, in relation to the amending of Section 202.2 for the purpose of setting the terms of legislative office to four (4) years and limiting the number of consecutive terms for that can be held to three (3) consecutive four-year terms for all elected officials.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

The intent of this legislation is to amend the terms of office for the Erie County of Legislature to a term of four (4) years and to limit the number of consecutive terms for all elected officials that can be served to three (3) consecutive four-year terms.

Section 2. CHANGING THE TERM OF LEGISLATIVE OFFICE AND LIMITING THE NUMBER OF CONSECUTIVE TERMS FOR ALL ELECTED OFFICIALS

Erie County Local Law number one of nineteen hundred fifty-nine, as amended, constituting the Erie County Charter, is hereby amended as follows:

Article 2, Section 202.2. Election and terms of office. County legislators shall first be elected at the general election in the year nineteen hundred sixty-seven and shall assume office on January first, nineteen hundred sixty-eight. All elected County legislators shall hold their respective offices for a term of two years; provided, that legislators elected in the year two thousand twenty-six and in subsequent years shall hold their offices for four years. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as County legislator if that person had previously held such office for three or more consecutive four-year terms.

Article 3, Section 301. The County Executive; election; term; qualifications. The executive branch of County government shall be administered by the County Executive who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election and shall be for four years, except that the term of the County Executive elected in nineteen hundred sixty shall be for three years. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as County Executive if that person had previously held such office for three or more consecutive four-year terms. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or her office and shall hold no other public office, except as provided in section three hundred seven hereof.

Article 18, Section 1801. Election; Comptroller's Act repealed. There shall be a County Comptroller who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election and shall be for four years. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as County Comptroller if that person had previously held such office for three or more consecutive four-year terms. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or her office and shall hold no other public office. The Erie County Comptroller's Act, being chapter four hundred twenty three of the laws of nineteen hundred thirty-nine as amended, is hereby repealed, as of January first, nineteen hundred sixty-one.

Article 19, Section 1901. Election. There shall be a County Clerk who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election, and shall be for four years except as otherwise provided in this Charter. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as County Clerk if that person had previously held such office for three or more consecutive four-year terms. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or her office and shall hold no other public office.

Article 20, Section 2001. Election. There shall be a District Attorney who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election, and shall be for four years except as otherwise provided in this Charter. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as District Attorney if that person had previously held such office for three or more consecutive four-year terms. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or her office and shall hold no other public office.

Article 21, Section 2101. Election. There shall be a Sheriff who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election and shall be for four years except as otherwise provided in this Charter. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as Sheriff if that person had previously held such office for three or more consecutive four-year terms. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or her office and shall hold no other public office.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect the first day of the first fiscal year after receiving an affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified electors of the County of Erie in a manner consistent with the provisions of New York State Municipal Home Rule Law Section 3 and upon its subsequent filing with the New York Secretary of State.

Section 4. SEVERABILITY

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this Local Law or the application thereof, to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional such order of judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

WHEREAS, Erie County is committed to providing equitable treatment and benefits similar to those received by its unionized workforce, respecting the rights of non-exempt employees under the Fair Labor Standards Act regarding overtime and wage regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Personnel Commissioner has been tasked with reviewing and drafting policies that address the unique needs of non-exempt managerial and confidential employees, including provisions for overtime compensation and work hour regulations; and

WHEREAS, feedback on the drafted policies has been solicited and incorporated from various stakeholders, ensuring that the proposed policies are comprehensive and meet the needs of all affected parties.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the document titled "Personnel Policies for Hourly Managerial and Confidential Employees" is hereby adopted, effective June 29, 2024; and be it further

RESOLVED, that these policies will provide clarity on the accrual and use of overtime, the designation of working hours, and the rights to rest and meal breaks as per federal guidelines; and be it further

SUMMARY

The Erie County Legislature is requested to receive and file the enclosed Erie County Sewer Agency Report (hereinafter referred to as the "enclosed report") regarding an Increase & Improvements of Facilities (2024) for Erie County Sewer District (ECSD) No. 3.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no fiscal implications associated with receiving and filing the enclosed report.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

Pursuant to Article 5-A of New York State County Law, maps and plans must be prepared for the creation of a new bond account to implement capital improvements for sewer district purposes. The enclosed report is intended to meet that requirement.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Your Honorable Body previously approved of an Increase & Improvements of Facilities for the proposed ECSD No. 3 Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility (AWTF) expansion project. The enclosed report provides updated details on the expansion project, including new cost estimates based on recent bids and the latest information from the design engineering consultant, along with the various financial impacts.

The ECSD No. 3 Board of Managers approved the enclosed report during their April 17, 2024 meeting.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

If the enclosed report is not received by Your Honorable Body, ECSD No. 3 may not proceed with the entire Southtowns AWTF expansion. This could jeopardize the sewer district's ability to properly serve the customers of ECSD No. 3, protect public health and the environment, and meet applicable regulatory responsibilities.

STEPS TO FOLLOW APPROVAL

The Division of Sewerage Management will submit a resolution requesting that the Legislature call for the public hearing on the proposed Increase & Improvement of Facilities. It is a requirement of Article 5-A of New York State County Law to have a public hearing prior to approving the action.

ERIE COUNTY SEWER AGENCY REPORT ERIE COUNTY SEWER DISTRICT (ECSD) NO. 3 INCREASE & IMPROVEMENT OF FACILITIES (2024)

INTRODUCTION

ECSD No. 3 is located in central Erie County (Exhibit A) and provides wastewater collection, conveyance, and treatment services for the Villages of Blasdell, Hamburg and Orchard Park, as well as portions of the Towns of Boston, Eden, Hamburg, Holland, Orchard Park and West Seneca. Services are also provided by ECSD No. 3 to the Mount Vernon Sewer District, the Town of Orchard Park Sewer Districts, the Woodlawn Sewer District, and a limited number of non-residential properties in the Town of Elma.

The original District was created in the early 1960's. In the late 1970's and early 1980's, extensions to the original District known as the Boston Valley, Armor-McKinley and Holland Extensions were formed. In 2003, the District was consolidated to include all previous extensions and the new Blasdell Extension into a single District. The Blasdell extension was added to incorporate the existing Village of Blasdell system as well as the Ford Motor Company stamping plant. In 2005, the District was extended to include the Village of Hamburg sanitary sewer collection system, and in 2007 and 2008, ECSD No. 3 was again extended to include the remaining sewer districts owned by the Town of Hamburg, along with the Village of Orchard Park and the Wanakah Sewer District.

All flows generated within Erie County Sewer District No. 3 (with the exception of a small portion of the Town of West Seneca and the Town of Holland) – as well as out of district customers in the Town of Elma, the Town of Orchard Park, the Mount Vernon Sewer District, and the Woodlawn Sewer District – receive treatment at the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility (AWTF).

BACKGROUND

The Southtowns AWTF, located at S3690 Lakeshore Road, Hamburg, New York became operational in December 1980. After many years of discussion and negotiations, ECSD No. 3 and the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) came to terms on a new State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) Permit for the Southtowns AWTF in late summer of 2012, with an effective date in the fall of 2012. The "Schedule of Compliance" section of this SPDES permit NY0095401 included, amongst other conditions, the following items:

- Total Residual Chlorine (TRC) Study: for more restrictive chlorine residual limitations on both the main outfall and overflow retention facility (ORF).
- Ammonia Study, for new daily maximum ammonia limits on the main outfall.
- Phenolics & Cyanide Study: for new cyanide and phenolics limits on the main outfall.
- No Feasible Alternatives Analysis: addressing the utilization of the onsite ORF.
- Facility Report: to develop a plan to manage peak flows and meet new SPDES permit limitations.

In October 2015, ECSD No. 3 submitted an "Updated Facilities Plan" detailing the proposed Southtowns AWTF improvements. The "Updated Facilities Plan" included in its appendices previously submitted reports for the TRC Study, Ammonia Study, and Phenolics & Cyanide Study. Presently the average daily flows for the Southtowns AWTF are approximately 20 million gallons per day (MGD) with a peak flow rate through the treatment process limited to a maximum of approximately 40 MGD. After completion of the expansion program, the average rated capacity of the Southtowns AWTF is expected to more than double and the peak flow throughput is expected to increase by 37.5%.

In September 2016, the NYSDEC issued a comment letter regarding the "Updated Facilities Plan" submission. The September 2016 NYSDEC comment letter primarily focused on the plant hydraulics and the amount of flow managed during different scenarios. ECSD No. 3 and NYSDEC subsequently met several times to discuss the September 2016 comment letter and address various questions / concerns. In April 2017 the "No Feasible Alternative Analysis" for the Southtowns AWTF was submitted to the NYSDEC, further refining the upgrade plan.

After additional meetings and discussions with the NYSDEC, in September 2019 ECSD No. 3 submitted an "Updated Facility Plan – Summary Letter Report" providing further hydraulic and ammonia analyses and formally amending the October 2015 submission. The amended plan as presented in the "Summary Letter Report" updated the proposed improvements to be implemented, the proposed schedule, and cost estimate.

The phased approach as detailed in the "Updated Facility Plan - Summary Letter Report" is as follows:

Phase 1

 Disinfection and Effluent Pumping Improvements: including ultraviolet (UV) disinfection or chlorination/dechlorination via a new chlorine contact tank and a new effluent pumping station. ORF/Outfall Modifications: including replacement of existing outfall diffuser ports, replacement
of existing ORF discharge pipe, and construction of onshore hydraulic relief point.

Phase 2

- Aeration/UNOX Expansion: including two (2) new UNOX tanks, new UNOX influent distribution chamber, various modifications to change the flow path and liquid depths in the UNOX system, new UNOX mixers, and general rehabilitation of existing tanks.
- Bioclarifier Upgrades: including four (4) circular or eight (8) new rectangular bioclarifiers and a new distribution chamber.

Phase 3

 Solids Handling Enhancements: new gravity thickener, new thickener distribution chamber, thickener covers, and dewatering improvements.

In February 2020, the NYSDEC issued an approval letter for the "Updated Facilities Plan" as amended via the "Summary Letter Report." The NYSDEC approval letter included a caveat regarding the dilution factors utilized by the NYSDEC in the 2012 SPDES permit limitation calculations and subsequently incorporated into the analyses completed for the "Updated Facility Plan – Summary Letter Report." Additionally, the February 2020 NYSDEC approval letter included implementation schedule milestones that were concerning to ECSD No. 3. As a result, technical memorandums titled "Action Levels for Zinc, Copper, and Nickel; at the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility – FINAL" and "Effect of Reduced Dilution Factor on Cyanide and Phenol in the Treated Effluent at the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility" were completed to evaluate the impacts associated with the potential dilution factor changes. These memorandums were transmitted via an August 2020 letter that also addressed ECSD No. 3's concerns regarding the aforementioned implementation schedule.

In a September 2020 response letter, the NYSDEC verified the conclusions in the technical memorandums and corrected/clarified the approved implementation schedule. ECSD No. 3 responded via letter in October 2020 requesting additional consideration on the schedule impacts. In February 2021 the NYSDEC provided a revised schedule.

With NYSDEC final approval and an amended schedule, ECSD No. 3 issued a request for proposals in April 2021 to retain an engineer to implement Phases 1 and 2 in the "Updated Facility Plan – Summary Letter Report", as well as conduct an additional needs evaluation for other components of the Southtowns

AWTF (including Phase 3). Hereinafter Phase 1, Phase 2, and the additional needs identified will collectively be referred to as the "Southtowns AWTF expansion." Following receipt of engineering proposals in June 2021 and interviews in August 2021, Arcadis was awarded the Southtowns AWTF expansion engineering work by the Erie County Legislature in October 2021. After finalizing the necessary professional services agreement, a notice to proceed was given to Arcadis in December 2021.

With the commencement of engineering design services, in 2022 ECSD No. 3 initiated the process of an "Increase & Improvement of Facilities" for the Southtowns AWTF expansion. Utilizing estimates developed in the "Updated Facility Plan – Summary Letter Report", the expansion program costs were estimated to be a total of \$100 million:

- Phase 1 Project: Disinfection Systems, ORF and Outfall Modifications, Effluent Pumping and Hydraulic Improvements: approximately \$25 million
- Phase 2 Project: Bioclarifier and Aeration/UNOX System Improvements: approximately \$45 million
- Additional Needs: "non-regulatory" items including electrical systems, overall backup power
 generation, equipment replacements, IT infrastructure, physical plant, HVAC, office / laboratory /
 locker room space, select Phase 3 improvements, and the like: approximately \$30 million

The Sewer Agency Report for the \$100 million Increase & Improvement of Facilities was approved by the ECSD No. 3 Board of Managers on April 6, 2022. The report was subsequently filed with the Erie County Legislature, a public hearing was held on September 22, 2022, and the Legislature subsequently directed that ECSD No. 3 submit an application to the New York State Comptroller's office on December 19, 2022 through an approving resolution. After the New York State Comptroller's office offered its consent to proceed with Increase & Improvement of Facilities on July 6, 2023, the Erie County Legislature approved the Southtowns AWTF expansion bond resolution on July 20, 2023.

During the period in which ECSD No. 3 was obtaining necessary approvals for the Increase & Improvement of Facilities, Arcadis had been proceeding with design of the expansion program. Phase 1 improvements, along with select electrical and backup power generation, were bid in August 2023. Bids were opened on October 12, 2023 and the lowest responsible bid was \$54,961,454.00.

COST OF THE PROJECT

From 2019-2024, costs have increased well above estimates developed in the "Updated Facility Plan – Summary Letter Report" due to major inflationary pressures, material and labor shortages, a saturated

construction market with limited contractor availability, and other factors. Using the actual bid costs received for Phase 1 (including selected electrical / backup power generation improvements identified in the additional needs evaluation) and the Phase 2 estimates at 60% design, the updated cost of the project is \$215 million. Further details are presented below:

FEDERAL AND STATE AID

ECSD No. 3 has and will be actively pursuing Federal and State aid for the Southtowns AWTF expansion. In December 2023, the Phase 1 project was awarded up to \$17 million through the New York State's Water Infrastructure Improvement Act grant program to cover 25% of net eligible costs (total

eligible costs less any third-party grants). As the grant agreement has not been finalized it is unknown at this time if the full \$17 million of funding will be realized; nevertheless, this grant is expected to provide significant assistance. Additionally, \$12 million of Eric County's American Rescue Plan Act funding was allocated towards the Phase 1 project. Other potential funding sources include the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, Federal Congressionally Directed Spending Requests, the State Water Quality Improvement Project program, and additional funding through the State Water Infrastructure Improvement Act. ECSD No. 3 will be actively pursuing grant funding.

ANNUAL DEBT SERVICE COST

Both the Phase 1 and Phase 2 projects for the Southtowns AWTF expansion are listed on the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation's (NYSEFC's) Clean Water State Revolving Fund intended use plan under Category B. As of October 1, 2023, both projects have a score of 51. Presently, all projects on the NYSEFC's intended use plan in Category B with a total score of at least 10 points qualify for 50% subsidized financing. The NYSEFC's current subsidized rate is 2.35% (Exhibit B). Using a 2.5% interest rate the annual principal and interest payments would be approximately \$10.3 million for \$215 million borrowed over a 30-year term.

The annual cost impact to the average home in ECSD No. 3 would be \$221 based on \$10.3 million in annual debt costs and 46,600 total equivalent dwelling units serviced by ECSD No. 3 (Exhibit C). Again, this is conservative, assuming no grant funding. Note the entire increase would not occur at one time, but rather over a number of years as determined by the staging of capital projects and during a time period in which existing debt will be retired. That said, the Office of the New York State Comptroller requires projecting cost impact on the ratepayer for the entire Southtowns AWTF expansion exclusive of other existing bond debt either owed or being retired.

For informational purposes, the capital improvements associated with Phases 1 and 2 of the Southtowns AWTF expansion program are expected to be operational by September 2029, meaning the full scope of the borrowing will likely not incur until 2030. ECSD No. 3 expects it will retire approximately \$420,000 in existing annual bond debt payments by that time. A total maximum of \$29 million in outside funds through the Federal American Rescue Plan Act and New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement Act grant program are currently available. These items provide an opportunity to offset the total cost impacts.

CONNECTION FEES

There will be no additional costs to property owners serviced by the ECSD No. 3 for items such as connection charges or fees. The project will benefit properties presently serviced by the existing sewer system, so costs for such items are not applicable. However, the Sewer District's existing charges for connection, inspection, and per unit fees will apply to any new construction.

SEORA

On December 1, 2022 the County of Eric adopted a negative declaration for the Southtowns AWTF expansion program pursuant to New York's State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA). The scope of the project has not changed from that considered during the 2022 SEQRA review.

SUMMARY

ECSD No. 3 must proceed with the Southtowns AWTF expansion. This project is necessary to satisfy regulatory requirements, replace aging infrastructure, and increase capacity to service ECSD No. 3 for future decades. The estimated cost is \$215 million. \$215 million in improvements would result in annual principal and interest payments of \$10.3 million and without considering mitigating factors the average home in the Sewer District would see an annual increase of approximately \$221. The maximum potential increase would be implemented over time as construction is completed in phases. This conservative analysis assumes no offsetting grant funding.

NEW YORK STATE COMPTROLLER REVIEW

Submittal of a "Port 85 Application for Permission of State Comptroller" is required as the increased cost to the typical property as a result of this "Increase & Improvement of Facilities" exceeds \$63 annually (Exhibit D). The information required in a Part 85 application is included in Exhibit E.

BOARD OF MANAGERS REVIEW

This matter has been discussed with the Board of Managers. On 417/24, the Board of Managers moved to accept and adopt the Sewer Agency Report and to request the County Legislature approve a Bond authorization for the project in the amount of \$215 million pursuant to Article 5A of New York State County Law. (Exhibit F)

RECOMMENDATION

The recommendations of the Eric County Sewer Agency are that the Legislature should:

- 1. Accept and adopt this Sewer Agency Report;
- 2. Adopt necessary resolution calling for a public hearing;
- 3. Authorize submission of a Part 85 application to the New York State Comptroller's office;
- Adopt the resolutions necessary for an "Increase & Improvement of Facilities" pursuant to Article
 A of New York State County Law;
- 5. Approve a Bond Resolution in the amount of \$215 million.

Map of Erie County Sewer District No. 3

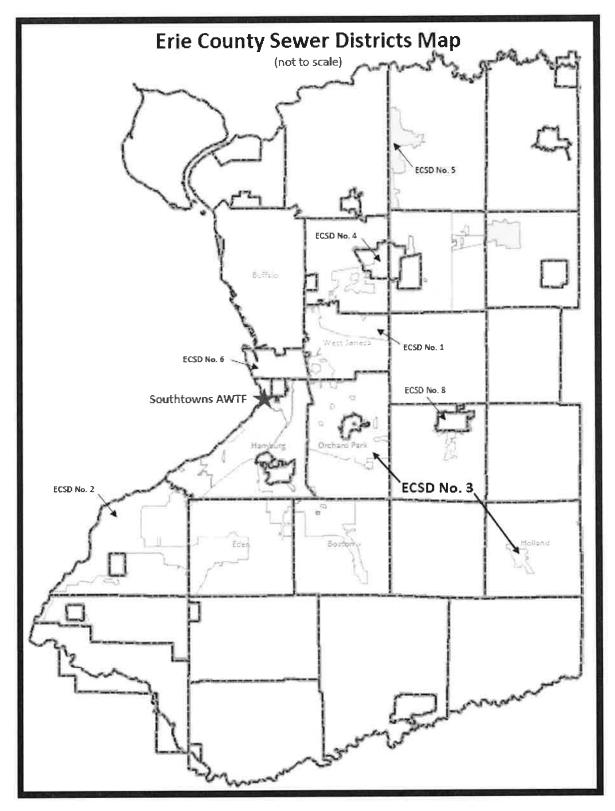

County of Erie response:

Erie County Sewer District (ECSD) No. 3 was created by the Board of Supervisors for the County of Erie on April 9, 1963. The resolution references Article 5-B of New York State County Law; however, present day Article 5-A of New York State County Law (County Water, Sewer, Drainage and Refuse Districts) was derived from former Articles 5-A, 5-B, and 5-C which were repealed in 1963. ECSD No. 3 operates pursuant to Article 5-A of New York State County Law.

All documents and information required for this application are included in this exhibit and Exhibit E-1.

§ 85.4 (b) a description of the proposed improvements;

County of Erie response:

The proposed improvements for the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility (AWTF) expansion in ECSD No. 3 include the following:

- Phase 1: Disinfection Systems, Overflow Retention Facility (ORF) and Outfall
 Modifications, Effluent Pumping and Hydraulic Improvements, select electrical / backup
 power generation improvements identified in the additional needs evaluation
- Phase 2: Bioclarifier and Aeration/UNOX System Improvements
- Additional Needs: "non-regulatory" items including electrical systems, equipment replacements, IT infrastructure, physical plant, HVAC, office / laboratory / locker room space, select solids handling improvements, and the like

The above improvements are referred to as the "Southtowns AWTF expansion." Additional details regarding the proposed improvements are provided in other portions of the "Erie County Sewer Agency Report, Erie County Sewer District No. 3, Increase & Improvement of Facilities (2024)" (hereinafter referred to as "Increase & Improvement of Facilities") and in the subsequent responses within this application.

§ 85.4 (c) a statement setting forth the maximum cost of the proposed improvements. If an application is for the approval of an increase of maximum amount, a statement of the original maximum amount, the amount of the increase, and the circumstances which have made the increase necessary;

County of Erie response:

This application is for the approval of an increase of the maximum amount. The original maximum amount as approved by the Office of the State Comptroller on July 6, 2023 was \$100 million. This \$100 million estimate was based on estimates provided in a "Updated Facility Plan" developed in 2019.

During the period in which ECSD No. 3 was obtaining necessary approvals, design of the expansion program proceeded. Phase 1 of the project was bid in August 2023 and in December 2023 an updated cost estimate for Phase 2 was provided at the 60% design stage. From 2019-2024 costs have increased well above initial estimates. Using the actual bid costs received for Phase 1

Exhibit E Page 1 of 16 (including selected electrical / backup power generation improvements identified in the additional needs evaluation) and the updated Phase 2 estimates, the cost of the project is now approximately \$215 million. The \$115 million increase is due to major inflationary pressures, material and labor shortages, a saturated construction market with limited contractor availability, and other factors.

County of Erie response:

ECSD No. 3 includes portions of the Towns of Boston, Eden, Hamburg, Holland, Orchard Park, and West Seneca, the Villages of Blasdell, Hamburg and Orchard Park, provides service to the Mount Vernon Sewer District, the Town of Orchard Park Sewer Districts, and the Woodlawn Sewer District, as well as a limited number of commercial / industrial customers in the Town of Elma. The Eric County Legislature has previously determined all properties in ECSD No. 3 are benefited by the services provided by the sewer district. No benefited property will be excluded.

The Southtowns AWTF is the largest facility in ECSD No. 3 and has been integral for the protection of public health, for the protection of the environment, and to support the local community / economy since it went online in December 1980. ECSD No. 3 must proceed with the Southtowns AWTF expansion. This project is necessary to satisfy regulatory requirements, replace aging infrastructure, and increase capacity to service ECSD No. 3 for future decades. An expansion of this type was contemplated when planning documents for the Southtowns AWTF were developed in the 1970s. The proposed improvements are in the public interest.

Specific to the regulatory requirements, ECSD No. 3 is adhering to schedule milestone dates set forth by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC), established in February 2021 as enforceable under State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) Permit NY0095401:

Phase I: Disinfection, Effluent Pumping, ORF, and Outfall Modifications

Design Complete: March 1, 2023

Construction Complete: September 1, 2025

Phase II: Aeration/UNOX and Bioclarifiers

Design Complete: March 1, 2025

Bioclarifiers Construction Complete: September 1, 2027 Aeration Construction Complete: September 1, 2029

§ 85.4 (e) a statement describing the proposed manner of financing the cost of the improvements. County of Erie response:

Both the Phase 1 and Phase 2 projects for the Southtowns AWTF expansion are listed on the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation's (NYSEFC's) Clean Water State Revolving Fund intended use plan (IUP) under Category B. The current IUP, dated October 1, 2023, assigns both projects a score of 51. The IUP further notes that all projects in Category B with a total score of at least 10 points qualify for 50% subsidized financing. The NYSEFC's current subsidized rate is 2.35% for a 30-year borrowing. In summary, the anticipated amount for this "Increase & Improvement of Facilities" is \$215 million, the type of financing is through the Clean Water State Revolving Fund, the term is 30-years, and the interest rate being made available under the State / Federal loan program is 2.35%.

Exhibit E Page 3 of 16 ECSD No. 3 has and will be actively pursuing Federal and State aid for the Southtowns AWTF expansion. Already \$12 million of funding has been obligated by the County of Erie through the Federal American Rescue Plan Act. In December 2023, the Phase 1 project was awarded up to \$17 million through the New York State's Water Infrastructure Improvement Act grant program to cover 25% of net eligible costs (total eligible costs less any third-party grants). As the grant agreement has not been finalized it is unknown at this time if the full \$17 million of funding will be realized; nevertheless, this grant is expected to provide significant assistance. Other potential funding sources include the Federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, Federal Congressionally Directed Spending Requests, the State Water Quality Improvement Project program, and additional funding through the State Water Infrastructure Improvement Act. ECSD No. 3 will be actively pursuing additional grant funding.

All projections have been prepared with a conservative assumption that no Federal or State aid, including the existing commitments of American Rescue Plan Act will and Water Infrastructure Improvement Act funding, will be realized. Should ECSD No. 3 secure grant funding at a later date, said monies would lower the annual debt service cost of the project. Therefore, this analysis presents a "worst case" scenario.

§ 85.4 (f) an estimate of the cost of operating and maintaining the proposed improvements, including the basis or source of such estimate;

County of Erie response:

When performing engineering analyses in the planning stage for the Southtowns AWTF expansion, life-cycle cost evaluations were performed considering operation/maintenance (O&M costs. For the most part, components of the Southtowns AWTF expansion are augmenting or replacing existing facilities with new, upgraded, more modern installations. The expansion of the secondary treatment process will increase some electrical loads; conversely more efficient operations will be implemented. The proposed dechlorination system to be added as part of Phase 1 is a completely new process. It is estimated the O&M costs for the dechlorination equipment and chemicals will be \$92,000 annually (based on "The Eric County Sewer District No. 3 Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility Effluent Disinfection Evaluation" (AECOM, September 2021)).

The 2024 budget for ECSD No. 3 is \$27,705,960, of which \$25,501,960 is associated with O&M (92%) and \$2,204,000 is associated with debt service (8%). Using 2024 ECSD No. 3 rates, the typical property (single family home) based on one (1) flat usage charge at \$275/unit, 100 feet at \$1.00 / foot of property footage, and a full market (equalized) value of \$317,800 at \$0.492345 per \$1,000 assessed valuation (combined assessed valuation rate at 100% equalization) pays approximately \$531.47. As there is not a single charge in ECSD No. 3's charge formula that is used solely to spread the cost of O&M, a percentage is applied to estimate how much the typical property currently pays for O&M (please see the County of Erie response for Item §85.4 (g) for further details). Using the proportion of the budget allocated to O&M expenses, the current cost of O&M to the typical property is approximately \$489 annually. An extra \$92,000 in O&M expenses would add approximately \$1.75 to the typical property on a proportional basis. Therefore, the total O&M a typical property would pay as a result of the proposed improvements would be approximately \$490.75 (\$489 + \$1.75).

§ 85.4 (g) a statement detailing the manner in which it is proposed to raise the costs of debt service and operation and maintenance. If assessments are to be made on a benefit basis, a description of the proposed benefit formula must be included. If user charges are to be imposed in connection with the improvements, an estimate of the amount of such charges and the basis on which they are to be computed;

County of Erie response:

The manner in which it is proposed to raise the costs of debt service associated with this "Increase & Improvement of Facilities" would be through adjustment of the rates charged as part of ECSD No. 3 s existing benefit/charge formula. The existing formula includes a flat unit usage charge levied on any parcel connected to the sanitary sewer system. The basis of this charge is a singlefamily property (Property Class 210), which is charged one (1) unit. Two family properties (Property Class 220) are charged two (2) units, three-family properties (Property Class 230) are charged three (3) units, and so on. The second is a footage charge levied on any parcel with access to a sanitary sewer. The footage quantity is based on the property dimensions (in most instances, property frontage) and is capped at 150-feet for single-family residential properties. The third charge is assessed valuation applied to any property within the sewer district. There are two (2) separate assessed valuation charges and both are applied to all parcels in the district, except in the limited circumstances where a parcel is classified as a Roll Section 8 property. Specific user charges (flow, biochemical oxygen demand, suspended solids, phosphorous) are levied on nonresidential parcels with high volume and/or high strength wastewaters exceeding certain thresholds (for example - a concentration of 5 milligrams per liter of phosphorus). The typical property (single family home) in Erie County Sewer District No. 3 is not subject to biochemical oxygen demand, suspended solids, phosphorus, or flow (water use) charges.

ECSD No. 3's 3-part formula does not spread the cost of debt service onto specific charges. As part of the annual budget process, all O&M, debt service, and similar costs are estimated. Various revenues are similarly estimated as part of the annual budget process such as interest earned, connection fees, contractual, and fund balances. The difference between the estimated expenses and these revenues is the amount that must be raised from ratepayers to fully fund the needs of the district.

In alignment with Article 5-A of New York State County Law, a multi-component formula is used to fairly assess these costs to ratepayers in proportion as nearly as may be to the benefit in which each lot and parcel may receive, considering the numerous types of properties residing in the sewer district. The formula includes the aforementioned charges:

- A flat unit usage charge levied on any parcel connected to the sanitary sewer system.
- A footage charge levied on any parcel with access to a sanitary sewer.
- Assessed valuation charges applied to any property within the sewer district. "C- Assessed
 Value" includes all properties listed in the ECSD No. 3 tax roll; "M- Assessed Value" is the
 same except it does not include a limited number of properties that are exempt pursuant to New
 York State Real Property Services Roll Section 8.

The ECSD No. 3 Board of Managers annually approves a budget with the various revenues and expenses set. The Board of Managers considers the benefit received by the various lots and parcels in the District and the associated cost impacts when setting the rates for these charges. After approval by the Board of Managers, a public hearing on the assessment rolls is held annually pursuant to Article 5-A of New York State County Law to hear and consider any objections. Ultimately the rolls and budget are approved by the Erie County Legislature.

As noted in the County of Eric response for Item §85.4 (f), approximately 8% of the 2024 budget for ECSD No. 3 is associated with debt service and the typical property (single family home) pays approximately \$531.47. As there is not a single charge in ECSD No. 3's charge formula that is used solely to spread the cost of debt service, a percentage is applied to estimate how much the typical property currently pays for debt service. Using the proportion of the budget allocated to debt service expenses, the current cost of debt service to the typical property is approximately \$42.50 annually. Borrowing the full \$215 million proposed for this "Increase & Improvement of Facilities" through the NYSEFC's Clean Water State Revolving Fund, using an interest rate of 2.5% and a 30-year term equates to annual principal and interest payments of approximately \$10.3 million. The annual cost impact on the typical property (single family home) in ECSD No. 3 would be \$221 based on 46,600 total equivalent dwelling units serviced by ECSD No. 3. Equivalent dwelling units are used for this calculation to account for water usage from non-residential properties, contractual charges, and similar revenues – allowing for an accurate representation of the potential impact to a typical property. The total debt service a typical property would pay as a result of the proposed improvements would be approximately \$263.50 (\$42.50 + \$221). Note this amount does not include any retirement of debt and assumes no Federal or State aid.

Creation of new user charges to be imposed in connection with the improvements is not contemplated. It is the intention of the County of Erie to apply the rate increases made in connection with these improvements using the existing sewer charge methodology for Erie County Sewer District No. 3. These rate increases are anticipated to be the same throughout the entire district, with proper adjustments for equalization and other factors.

County of Erie response:

Using Real Property System (RPS) software, all single-family properties within the various areas of ECSD No. 3 were identified, along with their assessed valuation. Those assessed valuations were equalized based on their town location to determine the full market values. The total number of single-family properties was totaled, as was the sum of the assessed valuations and full market values. Using these data, the assessed value of the typical property (single family home) in ECSD No. 3 is approximately \$109,400 and the full market (equalized) value is approximately \$317,800.

Notice to Proceed for construction of the Phase 1 project was issued in December 2023. Considering the overall cost of the project and available funding, it is estimated \$33 million will be borrowed in mid-2024 as short-term market rate financing (SMRF) through NYSEFC. SMRF through the NYSEFC requires the County of Erie to pay interest costs and per the NYSEFC, the interest rate on 3/14/24 was 3.20%. A rate of 3.5% will be used for this analysis. \$33 million at 3.5% equates to approximately \$1.2 million for debt costs to be paid in the 2025 budget year. As a result, the amount that the owner of a typical property (single family home) in ECSD No. 3 will be required to pay in the first year following approval of the application is estimated to be \$25.75 based on 46,600 total equivalent dwelling units serviced by ECSD No. 3. Per the County of Erie response for Item § 85.4(f), the project will result in additional O&M expenses related to the dechlorination system of approximately \$1.75 annually to the typical property on a proportional basis. While the dechlorination system will not be operational the entire year, it is conservatively assumed that the full amount of these costs will be required in 2025 as well. Therefore, the owner of a typical property (single family home) in ECSD No. 3 will be required to pay \$27.50 in the first year following approval of the application, if granted, for charges related to the proposed improvements.

Exhibit E-1 Page 2 of 12 The amounts to be used in Column 1 should be the amounts shown on such rolls after the hearing of grievances and the filing of the final completed assessment rolls, regardless of subsequent changes. In Column 1, include the assessed valuations of special franchises but exclude the assessed valuations of all exempt properties to the extent they are exempt from general taxation. Full valuation (Column 3) is determined as follows: Divide the taxable assessed valuations (Column 1) by the final equalization rate (Column 2) established by the State Board of Equalization and Assessment for such valuation. Where boundary changes have occurred and in the case of newly-created municipalities, see section 2.00 (7)(a) of the Local Finance Law. 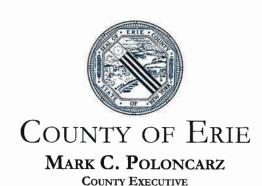

SUMMARY

The Erie County Legislature (the "Legislature") is requested to approve the attached resolution calling for a public hearing on September 9, 2024 (the "Public Hearing") regarding a proposed Increase and Improvement of Facilities in Erie County Sewer District No. 3 (the "Sewer District"). In addition to the resolution, and included within, is a Notice of Public Hearing that the Department of Environment and Planning (the "Department") will publish in the official County newspapers prior to the public hearing.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no fiscal implications with the recommended action of holding the public hearing.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The attached resolution is being submitted to the Legislature so that the Department can hold the Public Hearing on the proposed Increase and Improvement of Facilities. It is a requirement of New York State County Law, Article 5A to have a public hearing prior to approving the project.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Currently there is a need for new/updated bonding authorization to make needed improvements at the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility, existing pumping stations, and the sanitary sewer collection system. These existing facilities in many cases have reached or exceeded the end of their useful life and are in need of replacement or upgrade.

The Sewer District's Board of Managers approved a Sewer Agency Report recommending the Increase & Improvement of Facilities pursuant to Article 5A of New York State County Law to fund the necessary improvements (the "Report"). The Report will be the subject of the Public Hearing and will be separately filed with Your Honorable Body.

CONSEQUENCES OF A NEGATIVE ACTION

The Sewer District would not be able to make the necessary improvements.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

- 1. The Department will publish the Public Hearing Notice in the County's official newspapers.
- 2. A Public Hearing will be held on Monday September 9, 2024 at 2:00 p.m. local time.

WHEREAS, pursuant to proceedings heretofore had and taken in accordance with the provisions of Article 5-A of the County Law, including approving orders of the State Comptroller, County Sewer District No. 3 (the "Sewer District") of the County of Erie, New York (the "County"), has heretofore been established, and

WHEREAS, this County Legislature (the "Legislature") has heretofore duly directed that there be prepared a report and estimate of cost by the County Engineers (Erie County Department of Environment and Planning) relating to a proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of the Sewer District (the "Report"), which Report has been approved by the Board of Managers of the Sewer District on April 17, 2024, and filed with the Legislature pursuant to Section 268 of the County Law; and

WHEREAS, the Report describes a proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of the Sewer District, consisting of improvements to the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility, existing pumping stations, and the sanitary sewer collection system, all as more fully described in the Report; and

WHEREAS, the total maximum estimated cost of the aforesaid increase and improvement of the facilities of the Sewer District is \$215,000,000, which will be apportioned in accordance with applicable flat charges and charges based on units, assessed value and footage specified in the Sewer District's Benefit and User Charge formulas, as such formulas currently exist and as the same may be amended from time to time; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to applicable provisions of Section 268 of the County Law, as amended by Chapter 397 of the Laws of 1995, the consent of the State Comptroller is required prior to the expenditure of funds for such increase and improvement because the estimated \$221.00

cost thereof to the Typical Property (as defined in the County Law) exceeds the applicable threshold for Average Estimated Cost for County Districts on similar types of expenditures, which was computed by the State Comptroller to be \$63.00 for calendar year 2024; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to call a public hearing to consider such increase and improvement in accordance with the provisions of Section 254 of the County Law.

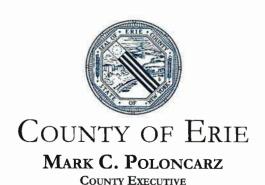

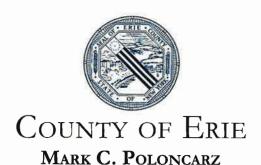

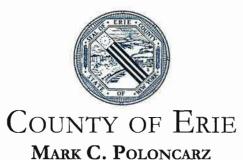

SUMMARY

The Department of Health Office of Health Equity ("Health Equity") is requesting authorization to amend its 2024 General Fund Budget to purchase supplies needed to implement the Health to Your Home Pilot Program with a cohort of Erie County residents. The Health to Your Home Pilot Program will utilize social networking as a novel strategy to address health care access among three key minority, marginalized, and disadvantaged populations as defined by the Erie County Health Equity Act of 2021: Black residents, the LGBTQ+ community, and rural populations. The pilot will provide 200 Erie County residents with training on a variety of health topics as well as home medical testing supplies to be shared with up to 10 people in their social networks who do not currently engage with or underutilize the health care system. Home medical testing supplies will directly relate to health disparities in serious, chronic, and often preventable diseases including heart disease, diabetes, asthma, cancer, and lead poisoning. Educational content and materials will be distributed utilizing community-based organizations as community hubs.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The total cost of supplies needed to implement the Health to Your Home Pilot Program is \$150,000.00. Sufficient funds will be moved from Fund 110, Funds Center 12713, Account 516020 - Professional Services, Contracts & Fees into Account 505800 - Medical & Health Supplies and into Account 530000 - Other Expenses to purchase medical and health testing supplies and program evaluation incentives, respectively.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

We are seeking approval of this resolution so that Health Equity can implement the Health to Your Home Pilot Program with a cohort of Erie County residents. The pilot will test a novel strategy to address health care access among marginalized, and disadvantaged populations of Erie County.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

As stated in the Erie County Health Equity Act of 2021, there are significant disparities in participation in public health programs and services as well as in the health outcomes of minority, marginalized, and disadvantages groups, including Black residents, LGBTQ+ residents, and rural residents in Erie County. 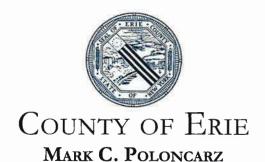

SUMMARY

ECDOH's Children with Special Needs Division contracts with many Preschool Special Education Programs to provide related services to children, but are currently experiencing capacity issues. Children are on waiting lists to receive mandated services listed in their Individualized Education Plans. New York State Education Department (NYSED) requires that if a school district within Erie County mandates therapy services for children, Erie County must contract with agencies to provide those services. ECDOH is looking to increase the number of contracted agencies available to meet these mandates. This resolution seeks waiver of the procedures in Section 26.08 of the Erie County Administrative Code because rates paid to providers are non-negotiable and are listed in the New York State Special Education Database.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Funding was budgeted for and is currently available in Fund 110, Funds Center 12750, Account 528000 - Services to Special Needs Children to cover the costs incurred. There is one rate listed in the New York State Special Education Database for all Related Services and providers are reimbursed per completed therapy session. This is a 100% reimbursement with no cost to the County.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

NYSED Part 200 of the Regulations of the Commissioner of Education pursuant to special education programs and services for students with disabilities requires that counties contract with agencies to provide related services authorized by District Committee's on Special Education, funding is available, and Erie County is looking to increase the number of contracted agencies to address present capacity issues.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Erie County would not be in compliance with NYSED Part 200 and children would remain on waiting lists for mandated services.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

ECDOH will work with Budget and Management and County Attorney's Office on executing all terms of the contract.

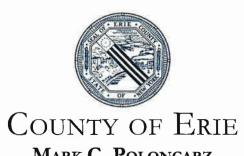

SUMMARY

The Department of Environment and Planning (DEP) is conducting the Erie County Low Income Program for Sustainable Energy (ECLIPSE) grant project funded by the New York State Energy and Research Development Authority (NYSERDA) to develop a program to reduce energy cost burden and improve access to renewable energy for low-income residents. Based on the recommendations of the ECLIPSE Feasibility Study conducted by a consultant team led the Pace University Energy and Climate Center, DEP and the Department of Social Services (DSS) wish to move forward with the implementation of a community solar program that will reduce energy costs and provide access to renewable energy for low- and moderate-income (LMI) participants in DSS programs including the Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP).

It is estimated that in the first year ECLIPSE Community Solar Program will enroll approximately 1,000 HEAP households, saving them up to \$132K annually in electric costs and \$3.3M over the life of the solar projects while providing the County a one-time fee of \$125 per subscriber from the solar developer, or a total of \$125,000 in the first year. Overall, there are more than 80,000 HEAP households who could eventually be enrolled in community solar through the ECLIPSE program. All residents will need to 'opt in' to the program, and no one will be automatically enrolled into the program.

Creating the program necessitates contracting with a specialized community solar services (CSS) contractor to support enrollment into the program, coordinate bill credits with solar developers and the utilities, and provide customer services to the program participants. DEP issued an RFP for the CSS contractor on May 8, 2024, to support the project for a two-year term. Two national, well-known CSS contractors provided proposals by the RFP deadline. A selection committee made up of staff from DEP, DSS, the Department of Public Works, and Fluent Energy reviewed the proposals and conducted interviews of the respondents, and recommended the selection of Ampion, a Public Benefit Corporation (PBC), based on both qualifications and fees.

This community solar program increases the administrative, reporting, and technical complexity of the responsibilities on an existing DEP staff position who is already assigned to DEP's existing NYSERDA-funded ECLIPSE Grant. Therefore, it is requested that a new JG-9 Administrative Assistant position (B100 #14401) be created in the ECLIPSE grant budget, replacing an existing JG-7 Junior Administrative Assistant position, and resulting in no net additional positions. The JG7 position will be eliminated from the DEP budget and will not be backfilled.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No County funds are necessary to support this request. The current grant pays for the staff to administer the project. This CSS contract will provide acquisition fee revenue of \$125 per

subscriber, estimated to be \$125,000 in the first 12-18 months of the program to the County. The fee revenue will be placed into the grant budget to help meet a match requirement with the grantor. As the program evolves, it is anticipated that the fees could support the program.

Regarding the upgrade of the JG-7 position to the JG-9 position, the net annualized salary cost difference is \$9,094. This difference will be paid by the grant.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

A high proportion of Erie County's LMI residents are classified as burdened by high energy costs. Also, many LMI residents are unable to receive cost savings from traditional solar energy for many reasons, including that they are renters, their home's roof or electrical system will not allow for a solar installation, or they are unable to afford the up-front costs of a solar system. The ECLIPSE community solar program will connect LMI residents to community solar projects, reduce energy cost burden and provide access to renewable energy.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Without approval the County will be unable to implement the ECLIPSE Community Solar Program and will be unable to reduce energy costs and improve access to renewable energy for the County's residents.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

DEP will execute an agreement for community solar services with Ampion, PBC, and will replace an existing JG-7 Junior Administrative Assistant position in the grant budget with a new JG-9 Administrative Assistant position.

SUMMARY

The accompanying resolution requests authority for the County Executive to execute a change order to accommodate an agreed upon change in scope to an existing Construction Agreement for the Reconstruction/Slope Stabilization of Back Creek Road (CR438), authorized by COMM. 3E-17 on February 16, 2023 with Union Concrete and Construction Corp. (UCC).

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Funding for this Amendment is not to exceed \$75,492.95, and is available in Fund 420, Funds Center 123, Capital Project B.19050 – 2019 Capital Overlay Program - \$75,492.95

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

UCC was required, due to unforeseen site conditions, to delay the permanent construction of the roadway, gutters, and guiderail in October 2023, additional remediation of the embankment slope is required. The work required to complete the project includes re-establishment of project detours and work zone traffic controls, removing and replacing the temporary asphalt base course, implementation of the additional embankment remediation, and completion of the remainder of the construction work at the site in accordance with the contract plans. The Embankment remediation includes excavation of the roadway section more than 4' below the top of roadway, installation of additional stone filled shear key trenches to a depth greater than 8' below the top of the roadway and reconstruction of the roadway subbase with multiple layers of stone, biaxial geogrid and geotextile fabrics.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This project aims to stabilize the slope and reconstruct the highway including new closed drainage and a relocated waterline. Project limits on Back Creek Road extend from the intersection with Rice Hill Road to 400 feet north of the intersection with Rice Hill Road.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

SUMMARY

The Department of Public Works is seeking authorization to execute an agreement with the New York State Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services (NYS DHSES) for the above-mentioned project which was awarded a Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMPG) grant. This grant includes the Engineering Design, Right of Way incidental and acquisition, Construction, and Construction Inspection and Administration phases for the project.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The total cost of this project is currently estimated at \$1,600,000. This Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMPG) grant provides a Federal reimbursement of \$1,080,000, with a required local share of \$520,000. The exact funding source for each phase of the design and construction will be identified in the future as contracts for the phases are established. The agreement with NYS DHSES needs to be executed prior to any reimbursable work commencing.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

This project was submitted to FEMA for a grant under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMPG), as it was previously identified as a location in need of repair and is included in the 2022-2027 Erie County Hazard Mitigation Plan. The project received the grant award under this program on May 17, 2024.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Ellicott Creek streambed along North Forest Road (CR 294) near Stahl Road in the Town of Amherst, is eroding away compromising the safety and stability of the road, railing, and drainage. This is a highly travelled roadway with nearly 13,000 vehicles per day. It provides access to an elementary school, fire department, police department, several senior and assisted living facilities, and the University at Buffalo.

Ellicott Creek is within the 100-year floodplain, so any slope stabilization work for this project must not increase the water elevations in Ellicott Creek during flood events. Additionally, all work must be performed to meet New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (NYSDEC) and FEMA requirements.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

This action is required to ensure project advancement and financing through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. Negative action would halt design and result in continued erosion of the streambank, as well as jeopardize existing and future reimbursement funding available through this program.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Highway Division will proceed with execution of agreements in accordance with the Federal and NYS DHSES guidelines. Upon the Erie County Legislature's approval, an agreement will be executed between the County and the NYS DHSES by the County Executive.

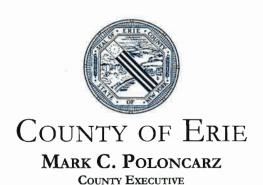

Bids were received by the department on June 18, 2024. A copy of the bid tabulations is attached for your reference. The project involves the replacement of (2) original air-handling units (AHU) serving the gymnasium, associated structural and electrical work, and other miscellaneous scope at the Bell Sports Center.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The (2) AHU's are original to the 1958 building and have reached the end of their service life. In order to reduce maintenance costs associated with temporary "stop-gap" measures to keep the heating equipment functioning, a full replacement is warranted.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

This mechanical scope is part of a larger upcoming roof replacement project at the Bell Sports Center. The existing AHU's serve the gymnasium and are located inside two existing roof-top penthouses on the flat roof that have significant entrapped insulation, roof gashes and extensive standing water, with a failed insulation status of 82% to 100%. The mechanical scope is bidded ahead of the roof replacement scope to allow for the long equipment delivery lead time.

The mechanical scope is also part of a larger campus-wide multi-phased Power Distribution/Wiring and Mechanical upgrade project as capital funds are secured and become available. This is also consistent with the sports field conceptual masterplan.

SUMMARY

The accompanying resolution requests authority for the County Executive to execute an Inter-Municipal Agreement ("IMA") with the Town of Amherst (the "Town") participating in the above referenced project. This IMA incorporates a 100% County funded share for a paving betterment (the "Betterment") into the above town project. The resolution also makes provisions for the County to provide the related funds to the Town.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The estimated cost of the construction of the Betterment is estimated not to exceed \$350,000. The County will pay for this work, including any approved betterment. These funds will be provided by Fund Center 123, Fund 420, B.21150 - 2021 Capital Overlay.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The Pedestrian and Bicycle Improvements of Casey Road (CR 295) presents a unique and time limited opportunity for the County to construct the desired Betterment which includes milling and resurfacing of Casey Road. The milling and resurfacing will consist of 1.5" mill and resurface from Gott Creek to near Transit Road and a 3.5" mill and resurface from Gott Creek to near Paradise Road, as required. It is in the County's interest to have this work done while the road is being rehabilitated rather than disturb the newly established pedestrian and bicycle improvements later to address paving problems.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Town is undertaking a federal aid project to add pedestrian and bicycle facilities to Casey Road from near (just west of) Paradise Road to just west of Transit Road. The County desires to improve the structure and riding surface of Casey Road, a County owned road, through milling and resurfacing the two 11' wide travel lanes within the Project area.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Summary of Recommended Action

The attached resolution requests authorization to award RFP #2024-022VF and enter into agreement with Trinity Services Group, Inc. for food management services at the Erie County Holding Center and Erie County Correctional Facility. The agreement is a one (1) year contract, with additional one (1) year renewals.

Fiscal Implications of the Proposal

The contract will be funded by the Jail Management Division Operating Budget (Fund 110, Fund Center 116), Account 505400 – Food & Kitchen Supplies. The chart below indicates the agreed upon price per meal per incarcerated individual.

While the number of incarcerated individuals in Jail Management Division custody fluctuates day-to-day, it is fair to say that the daily census is typically around 750. At three meals per day, the cost under the Trinity agreement amounts to approximately \$4,077 per day, or \$1,488,105 per year. In the first half of 2024, the Jail Management Division spent \$1,014,054 in food and kitchen costs, putting us on pace to exceed \$2 million for all of 2024. Thus, we estimate a cost savings of at least \$500,000.

Reasons for Recommendation

The Erie County Sheriff's Office is responsible for providing meals for incarcerated individuals. As part of this office's commitment to the delivery of efficient services, an RFP was issued seeking vendors to provide high-quality meals. Trinity Services Group, Inc. presented the only proposal.

Consequences of Negative Action

The Erie County Sheriff's Office will be unable to enter into an agreement with Trinity Services Group, Inc. to provide meal services at the Erie County Holding Center and Erie County Correctional Facility.

Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature:

As I reflect on the first two and a half years of serving as the Superintendent of the Jail Management Division within the Erie County Sheriff's Office, I am proud of the progress made under the leadership of Sheriff Garcia. Below is a brief mention of some of the accomplishments:

- We implemented the State mandated Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) program months before the effective date.
- Pursuant to the HALT Act, we ended the practice of using solitary confinement as a disciplinary sanction.
- It has been a difficult process, but I am confident that we are on the right track with addressing staffing shortages. A large academy class is expected to commence in July.
- We have upgraded the camera system within the Erie County Holding Center and are currently working hard to secure funding for phase two of the project a camera upgrade at the Erie County Correctional Facility.
- All Deputies and Correction Officers that are in contact with the detained population are now wearing body cameras.
- We have deployed tablet technology for incarcerated individual use at both facilities. The
 tablets make communicating with loved ones easier and allow the detained population to
 watch movies, listen to music, read books and access self help resources.
- Both jails received re-accreditation from the New York State Sheriff's Association.
- We were recently awarded full accreditation by the National Commission on Correctional Health Care. This prestigious award signals our commitment to quality health care services.

- We are currently working to achieve full accreditation from the American Correctional Association (ACA). ACA is the gold standard in the corrections profession. It promotes staff and incarcerated individual safety and security and improves the function of the facilities at all levels.
- The Department of Justice Stipulated Order of Dismissal was terminated after the ECSO maintained sustained substantial compliance with each provision for a period of three consecutive six (6) month monitoring periods. Two technical Compliance Consultants found that Erie County achieved compliance with the Medical and Mental Health provisions of the Stipulated Order of Dismissal as well as the Protection from Harm and Environmental Health and Safety provisions.
- It is also anticipated the New York State Commission of Correction Consent Decree will be terminated soon. This follows three years of monitorship by a third party. Many changes to policy, training and practices were implemented.
- Under the leadership and direction of Chief Tom Diina, the Community Reintegration
 Division has continued to expand efforts to improve outcomes for those returning from a
 period of incarceration. Project Blue is our award-winning local jail reentry program that
 provides intensive case management and sustained post release engagement for enrolled
 participants.

Though we are proud of our accomplishments, there is still much work to do.

Over these past two and a half years, Chief Diina and I have attended almost every monthly Erie County Corrections Specialist Advisory Board (ECCSAB) meeting. Initially, I was excited to participate and looked forward to productive dialogue to update the Board on jail related matters, address concerns and work collectively to earn the public's trust. Sadly, I have concluded that participating in the monthly meetings have been counterproductive and not a good use of time. I am hard pressed to think of one positive outcome resulting from our participation. The tone of the meetings has gradually become more adversarial amongst some board members towards the Sheriff's Office and quite frankly, the meetings have become a distraction from efforts to build on the great work being done.

Further, the board may not be adhering to Local Law #3 of 2019, from which it derives its power. The Local Law states the "Advisory Board will produce, annually, a report on the progress of the Board for the previous year and their goals for the upcoming year." Now, nearly halfway through 2024, the most recent annual report listed on the ECCSAB's webpage is still from 2022. We are not aware whether an annual report for 2023 currently exists. Additionally, there have reportedly been multiple meetings in which there were not enough board members to constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.¹

Now that Bishop Kim Moses has been appointed to the Board as the member recommended by the Sheriff, I believe it is a good time to announce that Chief Diina and I will no longer attend the monthly Board meetings. We will continue to dedicate our time towards initiatives to improve all aspects of the Jail Management Division. Should the Board need information from the Sheriff's Office, we will continue to be accessible. Any questions and concerns from the Board can be sent by email and we will ensure an appropriate and timely response.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that pursuant to Section 50(e) of the General Municipal Law, the undersigned, I/I BRIGID BUSEMAN | Din # 23-G-0667 intends to file a CLAIM against the county of ERIE for medical negligence for failure to protect for injuries suffered as I was bitten by an insect on October 2, 2023 in which I am still receiving continuous medical care as a state inmate.

1. The post office of the claimant is:

Taconic Correctional Facility, 250 Harris Road, Bedford Hills, New York 10507, County of Westchester.

- 2. The claimant is submitting this notice *pro se*.
- The nature of the claim is as follows: This claim is for medical negligence while I was confined in the Erie County Holding Center, and Alden Correctional Facility due to an incident that occurred on October 2, 2023, when I was bit by an insect, which progressively got worse. Then I was denied seeing a doctor (at the Erie County Holding Center) for several days. Then I went septic, which resulted in

immediate surgery. Presently I am unable to do many things with my left hand (which is the hand that was bit). I am currently incarcerated at Taconic Correctional Facility and I am receiving continuous medical care, which includes seeing a neurologist, physical therapist, and a hand specialist.

- 4. This Claim arose on October 2, 2023 in the middle of the night while I was sleeping at the Erie County Holding Center (on block Alpha Long). Within 2-3 days my insect bite became infected and I saw a doctor who prescribed mild antibiotics. I did see nurses on a daily basis; however, my infection rapidly spread up my arm all the way to my left shoulder. Beginning septic stages set in. Even though the infection was rapidly spreading, I did not see another doctor at the Erie County Holding Center.
- 5. On or about October 10, 2024, I was transferred from the Erie County Holding Center to Alden Correctional Facility. (Note: My left hand/wrist had swelled so badly that the Erie County Sheriffs were unable to cuff me for transport). On the second day of being at Alden Correctional Facility I was medically evaluated by a nurse who had me immediately see a doctor and the Erie County Sheriffs transported me directly to the Erie County Medical Center ("ECMC"). I was immediately admitted to ECMC and I had surgery there.

- As a result of this incident, the damages or injuries sustained by the claimant are as 6. follows: Neither set of medical staff at both the Erie County Holding Center and Alden Correctional Facility followed the specific instructions of the hand surgeon and as a result my hand did not heal properly. I am left handed and I cannot write more than a paragraph with my left hand. I currently have only 23% use of my left hand and I cannot make a fist. 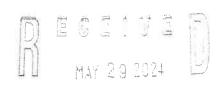

It is of note that the Family Law statues have copyrights attached Thompson Reuters is the distribution company and the publishers are Publisher: Lawyers Cooperative Publishing | Copyright: 2023 that is known as THOMPCORP HOLDINGS INC. and PRENTICE HALL CORP as Agent. The Forms being used at the state level are used through cooperative agreement MOU through the American Bar Association and NYS Bar Association, Local Bar Associations. This means that it is all contract law in place with the use of clauses, to create orders by consent under contract law. Grant proposals that have been made through the USDA, Department of Agriculture, HHS, OTDA, OCA, DoD, GSA, DLA, provide other cooperative agreements to allow defense contractors to use public purchased equipment, hardware as Vendors to implement "enforcement actions" by proxy of contracts and performance bonds on those contracts of adhesion. Conduent State & Local Solutions Inc is the Vendor for contract control and child support enforcement. Why are we allowing contractors to have enforcement powers under the local municipal corporations? I have requested this contract from OTDA, ECDSS, OCSE SCU, Family Court the modifications exist there the controlling contract was the Judgment of Divorce with the arbitration clause. That arbitration clause falls under treaty law and Hague Convention and to have a true meeting of the minds you must have full disclosure. Please provide the record that specifically records that private international law that is codified in New York state. Since Lawyers Cooperative Publishing holds the copyrights to the forms NYS uses for Family Court where are the disclosure forms that have been placing before the legislation at the municipality, county, state and federal corporations.
- 4. Correspondence between the New York State Assembly and any relevant stakeholders, including but not limited to, the American Bar Association, New York State Bar Association, Bar Association of Erie County, family law advocacy groups (ushered through pass through agencies as ACH), and Erie County Family Court. It is noted that Erie County Family Court is a private corporation that does not fall under local government. Per the IRS.

- 5. Any memos or statements of legislative intent related to the adoption or amendment of the Domestic Relations Law and Family Court Act and when did the 62 counties known as the OTDA ADM publications as the "sixty-two". These actions of abstractions, obfuscate the people from being able to find material for adequate defense.
- 6. Documents related to the implementation and enforcement of these laws within Erie County, including any guidance issued to local courts or officials. I have filed to have access to the State Supreme Court and provided a rescission of contract, withdrawn consent, and have made Constitutional claims of deprivation of unalienable rights. I also request that you inform me of the appeal procedures available under the law. Within five days it is expected that you in good faith will respond to this FOIL request and within 25 days acknowledge in writing why there has been reasonable delays. The records requested should be on the public record if no response is given then you have confirmed my three stipulated data points.

The claimant, John Calvin Seth Lehmann, brings this claim against the Offices of the State of New York that are listed in the Notice of Claim see above, alleging failure to provide full disclosure and unwittingly making the claimant a surety under a trust agreement. The claimant seeks rescission of the suretyship, compensatory damages, restitution, and other equitable relief. Per, the united states of America, Constitution, V amendment. I am not a 14th amendment citizen and you are hereby noticed that, I AM a natural born Citizen of the several states, pursuant to Article I. Section 9 of the United States Constitution and reserve my inalienable rights. The petitioner, is a natural born Citizen of the united states of America, of the several states, as part of Article II, Section 1, Clause 5, of the United States Constitution.

The privileges and immunities clause of Article IV Section 2 of the United States Constitution, was derived from the Articles of Confederation. Article IV, of the Articles of Confederation promised the petitioner, in part, that he is a free Citizen, one of the people of America. See, Corfield v. Coryell (6 Fed. Cas. 546, no. 3,230 C.C.E.D.Pa. 1823) and Buckley v. Valeo, 424 US 1 - Supreme Court 1976. "Under our Constitution it is We The People who are sovereign see United States v. Automobile Workers, 352 US 567 - Supreme Court 1957.

Dissenting opinion of Justice Marshall Harlan: Downes v. Bidwell, 182 U.S 244 (1901). Article 2. Section 1. Clause 5, provides two types of citizens, (1) a natural born Citizen, and (2) a citizen of the "United States". A natural born citizen of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, is a free Citizen, subject to the natural laws and the common laws derived therefrom. The "central government" is the United States of America, and congress "acts" as a unitary state, as a single entity. In fact, congress has "treated" the "United States" like a "state" in more than 500 Federal laws. The constitution of the United States assigned to congress responsibility for organizing the executive and judicial branches, raising revenues, declaring war, and making all laws necessary for executing these powers. see Office of the Secretary of the Senate with the assistance of Johnny H. Killian of the library of congress - Senate Publication. But, nowhere in the United States constitution does it say that congress has jurisdiction or

power over the People of the United States of America. Congress cannot "convert" the People of America, into statutorily created "artificial persons" in an attempt to steal the Republic form of government that I fought for, and promised to defend.

Thus, the 14th Amendment of the U.S Constitution, along with its jurisdictional clause, and the "Incorporation doctrine" is inapplicable, in regards to the petitioner. In the Slaughter-House Cases, 83 U.S. (16 Wall.) 36 (1873), the Court argued that the 14th Amendment textually distinguished between citizens of the United States and Citizens of the several states. The following paragraph is proof of such found in the U.S v. Anthoney case decided in (1873). This case supports that the petitioner is not a citizen of this state, and therefore is not subject to the jurisdiction, thereof. Zone Improvement Program or ZIP© code are a way and means of distributing voting districts, that allow legislative reach from county to county, or should I say foreign reciprocating countries. I am not a resident of New York I am a transient, sojourner that is seeking shelter near one of these Zone Improvement Program areas. Which now are attached to Demonyms according to the GPO Manual 2016, I am a Missourian and being natural born Citizen of that Missouri state, now incorporated STATE OF MISSOURI. America being signatories to the American Convention on Human Rights define Organization of American States (OAS) member countries. Article 20 Right to Nationality, Article 21 Right to Property. The United States are signatories to this treaty. Is the STATE OF NEW YORK, municipal corporation stripping me of my Nationality? Nationality and Citizenship, Nationality are the ties to the soil and geolocation of origination. See, Legal Notice published in Missouri Claiming my Nationality. Third party affidavit shows dates and times of publishing.

The United States Supreme Court has recognized the difference between the different "citizenships" as explained above. "The term resident and citizen of the United States is distinguished from a Citizen (national of the United States of America) of one of the several states, in that the former is a special class citizen created by congress" U.S v. Anthoney, 24 fed., 829 (1873). This "special class of citizen", created by congress, is classified as property and franchise of the federal government see Wheeling Steel Corp. v. Fox, 298 U.S. 193, 80 L. Ed., 1143, 56 S. Ct. 773 (1936). This begs the question, why was the "pledge of allegiance to the United States of America" taken out of the schools, and elsewhere? Why was God taken out of schools as well? "Natural" as used in the term, "natural born Citizen", at the time the constitution was adopted, meant: "the opposite as provided by statute", see Sir William Blackstone commentaries and English common Law. In this, as in other respects, it must be interpreted in the light of the common law, the principles and history of which were familiarly known to the framers of the Constitution. In eighteenth century, legal language "natural" meant arising from the nature of things —a usage reflected, for example, in natural law (as opposed to statutory law) and natural rights (as opposed to statutory rights). Under this common meaning of natural, "natural" citizenship should be distinct from—not coextensive with— statutory citizenship See: Journal of Constitutional law by Michael D. Ramsey. Furthermore,

"natural" was defined in JOHNSON, supra note 19, at 1349–50. Bailey's 1765 edition as both "[o]ne born in any place, an original inhabitant" and "conferred by birth also see ASH, supra note 19 (definitions of "Natural," "Naturalized" and "Native."). 43 Ex parte Grossman, 267 U.S. 87, 108–09(1925); see also Calder v. Bull, 3 U.S. (3 Dall.) 386, 390–91(1798).

A natural born Citizen of the United States of America, of the several states, is not a statutory creation. I am a creation of God, Jesus Christ, naturally born in the United States of America, and thus was promised that the Constitution thereof, would work as a restriction on the national and state governments power over the People of America.

No act of Congress, state legislatures, or state court doctrines shall curtail those rights and restrictions, so promised See all United States Supreme Court Case laws in relation to such.

The petitioner, is not claiming to be a "natural born citizen" "with sovereignty, and fully understands that he is subject to the judgment of God, the true sovereign. He also understands that as a natural born Citizen of the United States of America, of the several states, that he is also subject to the "natural laws" of said country (United States of America). When Jurisdiction was questioned and a demand for authority requested not one Officer of the Court or State Office or Vendor or Contractor gave retort. My claims are Constitutional and are now equitable.

The defendants however, claim that I am not a natural born Citizen of the United States of America and that I am a statutory creation subject to statutory regulations not known to the natural laws. The defendants also claim that I do not possess my God given and inalienable rights and that the United States of America Constitution does not work as a restriction on state and federal governments power over the People of America, so promised to the petitioner. 10th Amendment to the United States of America Constitution: The powers not delegated to the United States by the Constitution, nor prohibited by it to the States, are reserved to the States respectively, or to the people." Congress, nor the defendants have the constitutional authority to force the petitioner into their jurisdiction. Thus, the petitioner exercises his 10th Amendment right to not participate in any treaties and "programs" or be subject to any codes, rules, regulations, and statutes exercised under the jurisdiction of the United States or of this state.

Constitution prohibits the STATE OF NEW YORK from exercising 14th Amendment jurisdiction over the petitioner. Therefore, a neutral and detached Judge of a lawful court of record must make the defendants bring forth evidence that prove their alleged jurisdiction and/or authority as follows:

- I. Defendants must prove that I am a person born or naturalized in the United States, which therefore, would be "subject" to the jurisdiction of the United States and of this state. I was not naturalized in court.
- II. Defendants must prove that I am not a natural born Citizen of the United States of America, and that the United States of America constitutional restrictions on their

- power and authority in Article I Section 10 Of the United States Constitution allows defendants to implement a treaty as part of the Title IV Part D of the Federal Social Security Act.
- III. Defendants must prove that the defendants had jurisdiction to exercise codes, rules, statutes, and regulations over the petitioner which are not known to the natural laws of the United States of America.
- IV. Defendants must prove that the petitioner cannot exercise the 10th Amendment to the United States Constitution as stated herein.

CONCLUSION

When the respondent's failed to provide proof of jurisdiction and/or authority, the State of New York is the party at fault because the agents acting on behalf of the state in their respective Offices. These same Offices has come to the table with unclean hands and biased fashion by ignoring their Oath's of Office that was sworn to uphold the Constitution of the united state of America and New York state Constitution. How can equity be had unless there is full disclosure to the terms of the contract? See the Title 41 of the United States Code (U.S.C.), Section 8701-8707 "Procurement Integrity Act" My, Writ of Habeus Corpus and Constitutional Claims documents have been open and read over 1,060 times via electronic communication: email. Obviously, this has struck a chord with those that refuse to provide access the New York State Court System. The controlling contract of SF2019-903055 rescission was given with no acknowledgement to family court would made the modifications to said contract, judgments, rulings and decisions void for lack of jurisdiction and/or authority in IV-D case number BV15080G1. A court of record proceeding according to the natural law must first determine if the defendants have jurisdiction before the petitioner can assert any constitutional claims.

This claim arises from the respondent's ECDSS, OCSE SCU, Erie County Family Court, Erie County Supreme Court, failure to disclose material information related to a trust agreement and the claimant's subsequent role as a surety. 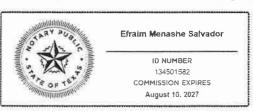

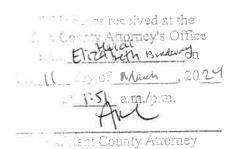

- 3. This claim is founded in negligence for personal injuries, economic damages, emotional distress and/or other damages sustained by Claimant as a result of the negligent conduct of Respondents.
- 4. This claim arose on or about December 13, 2023, at the Erie County Correctional Facility (ECCF), located at 11581 Walden Avenue, Alden, New York 14004, within the OSCAR Unit.

- 5. Upon information and belief, on or about December 13, 2023, Inmate Pierce, an inmate housed on the OSCAR unit with Claimant, met with Corrections Nurse Judy Doe during a sick call.
- 6. During the examination, Corrections Nurse Judy Doe discovered that she or some other Erie County Corrections Health personnel had given Inmate Pierce the wrong medications.

 Inmate Pierce had been given medications meant for Claimant.
- 7. Corrections Nurse Judy Doe told Inmate Pierce that a mix-up had occurred. She proceeded to disclose Claimant's name, the names of his medications and the conditions for which they were prescribed.
- 8. Specifically, Corrections Nurse Judy Doe told Inmate Pierce that he had been given one of Claimant's medications to manage the HIV virus.
- 9. After returning to the OSCAR unit, Inmate Pierce told Claimant about the unauthorized disclosure made by Corrections Nurse Judy Doe.
- 10. During the first day after the unauthorized disclosure, Claimant overheard various comments about his HIV status. One inmate named Sledge, said that Claimant should not be allowed to use the showers or the microwave.
- 11. By the next day, inmates began making hostile and threatening remarks about Claimant sharing common areas and questioned why he wasn't placed on an "AIDS unit."
- 12. With the growing hostility and intolerance in the OSCAR unit, Claimant feared for his safety.
- 13. Claimant met with 'Kevin,' a counselor in the forensics unit, who requested that Claimant be placed in protective custody.

- 14. Respondents granted the request and placed Claimant in protective custody.
- 15. Thereafter, Claimant filed a grievance, which was accepted and reviewed by Respondents.
- 16. Upon information and belief, Respondents confirmed that the Corrections Nurse Judy Doe had made an unauthorized disclosure of Claimant's HIV status to Inmate Pierce.
- 17. On or about January 22, 2024, Claimant moved from protective custody at ECCF to Lakeview Correctional Facility.
- 18. Soon after his arrival, Inmate Wolfson approached Claimant. Inmate Wolfson said that although he had been housed in another unit at ECCF, he had heard about the unauthorized disclosure of Claimant's HIV status.
- 19. To date, Claimant remains incarcerated with an untold number of inmates who know of his HIV status as a result of Respondents' negligence. Claimant is in a constant state of heightened anxiety and has recurring fears for his safety.
- 20. Respondents' unauthorized disclosure of Claimant's HIV status to an inmate, violated New York Public Health Law Article 27-F § 2782.
- 21. Respondents had an obligation to protect Claimant's privacy rights surrounding his confidential health information while he was in the custody and control of Respondents.
- 22. Respondents failed to meet this obligation by carelessly, negligently and recklessly disclosing Claimant's HIV status to another inmate, following a medication mix-up.

Re: May 2024 Budget Monitoring Report

Dear Honorable Members:

Please find attached the Budget Monitoring Report (BMR) for the period ending May 31, 2024. Additionally, please see a position vacancy report as of May 31, 2024.

The BMR shows that for the first five (5) months of 2024 the County has a \$5,194,575 positive variance, which can be attributed to several key factors.

On the positive, Interest Earnings revenue is nearly \$8 million over budget for the period and has exceeded the total budgeted amount for the year by \$3.6 million (\$11.1 million total earned; \$7.5 million budgeted). Given the County's strong cash position, the continuation of historic interest rates and the Comptroller's aggressive investment strategies, we should expect Interest Earnings to continue to be a significant source of overall positive variance within the 2024 Adopted Budget.

Additionally, the County has realized \$3.6 million in county-share savings for the period on total personnel related costs which can be mostly attributed to vacancy savings. This is despite being \$2 million over budget on overtime expenses, almost exclusively within the Sheriff's Police Services Division, which has expended 65% (\$3.9 million) of their annual budget (\$6 million) through the first five months of the year.

On the negative side, sales tax receipts continue to be a concern and, likely, will be for the remainder of the year. Although we are awaiting the final May-related sales tax payment on July 12th, current receipts for the month (which include a 2nd quarter reconciliation) grew by 0.22% (\$99,437). With one payment remaining for the 2nd New York State Sales Tax Quarter (March-May), growth stands at 3.78% (or \$5.1 million) compared to the 2nd Quarter 2023. For perspective the 1st Sales Tax Quarter (Dec-Feb) underperformed the prior year by -5.1% (or -\$7.6 million).

Year-to-date receipts are now down -1.99% (from -2.51%) or -\$4.7 million (from -\$4.8 million) compared to the same period of 2023. As a result of this lesser growth in May thus far, I now estimate a year-end sales tax shortfall of approximately \$21.7 million (up from \$17.6 million in April).

As the year progresses, we will continue to closely monitor sales tax receipts and growth trends and report to your Honorable Body. I think it is also important to note that even though sales tax is among the largest individual variables in determining an overall budget variance, it is not the only variable. As you can see in this BMR, as of the first five months of 2024, we still have a modest positive variance despite the underperformance of sales tax.

As always, I am available to attend a meeting of your Honorable Body's Finance and Management Committee to report on the March BMR or any other fiscal matters.

Dear Erie County Legislators,

Several months ago, the county barred anyone from parking in front of Old County Hall and directed police to ticket journalists' vehicles. As a result, local journalists – including those lugging heavy equipment – have arrived late at news conferences for lack of parking or been fined for parking illegally.

We request your assistance in restoring news media parking rights, which had existed for decades, at 92 Franklin St. This parking location is the only one where news media can quickly access Old County Hall, Erie County Court and the Rath Building.

When this concern was raised with County Executive Mark Poloncarz at a news conference in the Rath Building three months ago, he said there were complaints about handicap accessibility and that the county would be installing physical parking barriers. He also said his office would acquire dedicated parking spaces for news media. That has not occurred.

The parking area in front of Old County Hall has ample room to accommodate both news media and pedestrians while still ensuring that it remains accessible to people with disabilities. If nonnews media drivers are abusing this parking location, perhaps new signage regarding parking restrictions would be appropriate. However, the answer is not to ban all vehicles.

We again ask that the Erie County Legislature restore news media parking. The current situation presents a needless barrier to providing timely local news, including news from the County Legislature and county administration.
