

WHEREAS, Past Chief William G. Karl has served the people of the Town of Amherst for 48 years; and

- WHEREAS, Mr. Karl joined Main-Transit Fire Department in 1974 as a third-Generation firefighter, following his grandfather Past President George Karl Sr. and Father Past Chief George Karl Jr; and
- WHEREAS, Bill has shown exemplary leadership, teamwork abilities, and passion for service throughout his career with the Main-Transit Fire Department; and
- WHEREAS, Bill has been instrumental to the Main-Transit Fire Department and Town of Amherst, with his wealth of knowledge and experience for 48 years of service until his passing in March 2023; and
- WHEREAS, Bill was a staple at Main-Transit Fire Department, always willing to do any task at hand whether it was during his time and quickly rose through the ranks of the firematic side early on in his career, serving as Lieutenant, Captain, and Assistant Chief; and
- WHEREAS, William Karl was elected Chief of the fire department in January 1987 and served in that position till December 1991; and
- WHEREAS, during his Chief tenure, Bill purchased the first ever RD Murray custom pumper that was produced in Hamburg NY for the Main-Transit Fire Department; and
- WHEREAS, Chief Karl was instrumental in an upgraded Main-Transits' own training facility at their station 1 and making sure training standards for Main-Transit were incorporated for providing a high quality of service to the Town of Amherst; and

WHEREAS, Bill Karl is the only person to hold all three top leadership positions which include Chief, President, and Chairman of the Board in Main-Transit Fire Departments history to the present day; and

WHEREAS. Chief Karl was also a strong contributor in the Main-Transit Fire Department, being awarded the honor of hosting the NYS Drill team Championship and Parade in Western New York in 1990 and continuing to host 9 other times during that span to present day with departments from all over the state attending; at the George Karl training facility. Chief Karl was a strong supporter of the Main-Transit Slo-Pokes Drill team and competed during the 70's, 80's, 90's and 2000's on the drill team in some capacity; and

WHEREAS, Bill's unwavering commitment and passion for the service at the Main-Transit Fire Department and his unconditional love as a loving husband to his wife Sharon, devoted father to his five children, and many grandchildren is a trait that we wish to teach to many other individuals; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT



- WHEREAS, CMS serves more than 500 students each year at its main location in Hamlin Park and satellite branches in Clarence Center, Lockport, Snyder, and West Seneca; and
- WHEREAS, professional faculty and administrative staff, together with many volunteers at Community Music School, believe that anyone who has a genuine interest in music can benefit from musical study and all people deserve the opportunity to pursue music; and
- WHEREAS, the staff at Community Music School pride themselves on learning about each student's musical goals and matching them with a caring teacher who will foster their musical growth; and
- WHEREAS, CMS provides a multitude of programs including: Individual Classes, Group Classes, Performance Ensembles, Music Therapy and Summer Camps; and
- WHEREAS, 30% of CMS' students are from racially diverse communities, more than 75% are children, and 15% receive financial assistance through investments from various funding sources; and

WHEREAS, the *Community Music School of Buffalo* continues its work on their mission to provide inner-city youth with an instrumental education and lead generations of Buffalo-bred professionals on their path to success in various vocations; and

WHEREAS, Community Music School of Buffalo has been thoroughly working to take advantage of every available opportunity for the purpose of continually advancing its commitment to our community by ensuring that individuals are provided with the chance to experience a culture of exceptional teaching and create their own musical experience.

and celebrate Open Buffalo on 10 years of phenomenal service in the Buffalo community.



WHEREAS, National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week has been recognized each year during the month of October to remind us of the harm bullying does; and

WHEREAS, each year, National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week is a call to bring together individuals, organizations, industry, and tribal, state and local governments to reduce childhood exposure to lead by increasing lead poisoning prevention awareness; and

WHEREAS, the goal of NLPPW is to raise awareness about lead poisoning prevention and encourage actions to reduce childhood lead exposure; and

WHEREAS, programs such as the *Community Health Equity Research Institute* were created in response to the crisis of race-based health disparities, especially in African Americans who live on the city's East Side; and

WHEREAS, their mission is to perform research to advance understanding of the root causes of health disparities and develop and test innovative solutions to eliminate health inequities amongst residents in the five zip codes (14204, 14206, 14211, 14214 and 14215); and

WHEREAS, within these five zip codes, the *Community Health Equity Research Institute* created a vision to ensure that wellness and social well-being become a reality for all people in Buffalo, specifically, people of color residing in underserved neighborhoods who are more likely to have serious, chronic and often preventable diseases, as well as significantly higher mortality rates; and

WHEREAS, lead poisoning is characterized by exposure to neurotoxin that can cause damage to the brain and nervous system, which can result in learning and behavioral problems, slowed growth and development, and difficulties with hearing and speech; and

WHEREAS, lead is more harmful to children, especially very young children, because their brains and nervous systems are still developing; and

WHEREAS, exposure to children can result from multiple sources and can cause irreversible and life-long health effects; and

WHEREAS, parents and caregivers are encouraged to talk with their healthcare provider or local clinic about the risk of lead exposure in their community and the need to test their kid's blood for lead; and

LOCAL LAW TO BE ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE LOCAL LAW INTRO. – NO. __2-1___ - 2024 LOCAL LAW – NO. _____ - 2024

A LOCAL LAW requiring transparent, searchable databases for expenditures accessible and available to the public.

SECTION 1. Title

This law shall be entitled and known as "The Tax Dollar Disclosure Act."

SECTION 2. Legislative Intent

The Erie County Legislature recognizes that taxpayers should have easy access to details on how the county is spending their tax dollars and what performance results are achieved for those expenditures. It is the intent of the Legislature, therefore, to direct the Erie County Comptroller to create and maintain a searchable budget database website detailing where, for what purpose, and what results are achieved for all taxpayer investments in county government.

SECTION 3. Definitions

AGENCY

A county department, division, office, bureau, board, commission, committee, or unit. This includes individual county agencies and programs, as well as those programs and activities that cross agency lines. "County agency" includes all elective offices in Erie County government.

AUDIT OR REPORT

Shall include any audit or report issued by the state, county, legislature, legislative committee, comptroller or executive body relating to the entity or recipient of funds or the budget program/activity or agency.

COMPTROLLER

The Erie County Comptroller.

ENTITY/AND OR RECIPIENTS

- A. a corporation,
- B. an association,

- C. a union,
- D. a limited liability company,
- E. a limited liability partnership,
- F. any other legal business entity including non-profits,
- G. grantees,
- H. contractors, and
- I. a county, city, or other local government entity.
- J. "Entity/and or recipients" does not include an individual recipient of public assistance.

FUNDING SOURCE

The account from which the expenditure is appropriated, inclusive of all budgeted accounts.

FUNDING ACTION OR EXPENDITURE

Shall include details on the type of spending (grant, contract, appropriations, etc.). This includes tax exemptions or credits. Where possible, a hyperlink to the actual expenditure document (in a format that is, at a minimum, as searchable as a searchable PDF format) shall be provided.

LEGISLATURE

The Erie County Legislature.

SEARCHABLE BUDGET DATABASE WEBSITE

A website that allows the public, at no cost, to:

- A. Search and aggregate information for the following:
 - 1. the name and principal location or residence of the entity/and or recipients of funds,
 - 2. the amount of funds expended,
 - 3. the funding or expending agency,
 - 4. the funding source of the revenue expended,
 - 5. the budget program/activity of the expenditure,

- 6. a descriptive purpose for the funding action or expenditure,
- 7. the expected performance outcome for the funding action or expenditure,
- 8. the past performance outcomes achieved for the funding action or expenditure,
- 9. any audit or report relating to the entity or recipient of funds or the budget program/activity or agency,
- 10. and any other relevant information specified by the Comptroller.
- B. Programmatically search and access all data in a serialized machine-readable format (such as XML) via a web-services application programming interface.

SECTION 4. Searchable Budget Database Website Created

By October 1, 2024, the Comptroller shall develop and make publicly available a single, searchable budget database website including the required data for the most recent county budget. The website shall be given a unique and simplified website address. Each county agency that maintains a generally accessible Internet site or for which a generally accessible Internet site is maintained shall include a link on the front page of the agency's Internet site to the budget database website.

SECTION 5. Updates

The Comptroller shall provide guidance to agency heads to ensure compliance with this section. The searchable budget database website shall be updated as new data becomes available, if feasible, but no later than 30 days upon receipt of data from the agency.

The Comptroller shall ensure that all data added to the searchable budget database website remains accessible to the public for a minimum of six years.

SECTION 6. Compliance with the Act

The Comptroller shall not be considered in compliance with this act if the data required for the searchable budget database website is not available in a searchable and aggregate manner and/or the public is redirected to other government websites, unless each of those sites has information from all agencies and each category of information required can be searched electronically by field in a single search.

SECTION 7. Severability

If any part or provision of this chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this chapter or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances. The County of Erie hereby declares that it would have passed this chapter or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

SECTION 8. Repealer

All ordinances, local laws, and parts thereof inconsistent with this chapter are hereby repealed; provided, however, that such repeal shall not affect or impair any act done or right accruing, accrued, or acquired, or penalty, charge, liability, forfeiture, or punishment incurred or owing prior to the time such repeal takes effect, but the same may be enjoyed, asserted, collected, enforced, prosecuted, or inflicted as fully and to the same extent as if such repeal had not been effected. All actions and proceedings, civil or criminal, commenced under or by virtue of any provision of any County of Erie local law, ordinance or resolution so repealed, and pending immediately prior to the taking effect of such repeal, may be prosecuted and defended to final effect in the same manner as they might if such provisions were not so repealed.

SECTION 9. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect on October 1, 2024.

LOCAL LAW TO BE ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE IN THE COUNTY OF ERIE LOCAL LAW INTRO. – NO. _______ - 2024 LOCAL LAW – NO. ______ - 2024

A LOCAL LAW requiring meetings of Erie County Boards and Advisory Committees to provide access to information to the public.

SECTION 1. Title

This law shall be entitled and known as "The Meetings Transparency Act."

SECTION 2. Legislative Intent

The Erie County Legislature recognizes that taxpayers should have easy access to details discussed and acted upon at public meetings. The Erie County Legislature prepares an agenda which it posts prior to session, streams and has available for replay video of the meeting and posts the minutes of meeting for review. Readily available technology should be used to increase access to similar discussions and actions of commissions and boards.

SECTION 3. Definitions

BOARD

Any government board, commission, council, committee, advisory committee, panel or similar group that is created pursuant to the Erie County Charter, Code or Local Law.

SECTION 4. Meeting Minutes

Boards shall keep written minutes summarizing all official actions, discussions, public comments, and votes taken at each meeting.

Draft minutes shall be made available to the public within 10 business days after each meeting.

Minutes shall be officially approved at the board's next public meeting and a final version posted publicly online within 5 business days after approval. The minutes also must be submitted to the Clerk of the Legislature to be included in the official record.

SECTION 5. Notice and Agendas

Boards shall give public notice at least 7 calendar days prior to any regular meeting by prominently posting the date, time, location, and agenda on the general Erie County website, as well as the website of the Erie County Legislature.

For special or emergency meetings, notice should be provided as soon as is practicable.

Meeting agendas shall include a list of topics to be discussed, a list of invited speakers, and indicate if any votes or official actions are anticipated.

SECTION 6. Broadcast and Recording of Meetings

To the extent feasible, boards should also provide a live stream of meetings for public viewing. Erie County is required to make appropriate accommodation for each board to make this possible. If a live stream is not possible, meetings should at minimum be video recorded and the recording should be posted on the general Erie County website.

SECTION 7. Public Access to Records

Boards shall maintain information to be posted on Erie County's website providing access to board member information, past meeting minutes, agendas, recordings, reports, resolutions, and other official documents.

Upon public request, boards shall provide copies or electronic access to such records in a timely manner as allowable by public records laws.

SECTION 8. Public Comment

Boards should provide reasonable opportunities for public comment at each meeting.

Any restrictions on public comment shall be viewpoint-neutral and clearly stated in the board's policies.

SECTION 9. Compliance

Originating governmental bodies shall establish procedures to monitor and ensure compliance with this law.

SECTION 10. Severability

If any part or provision of this chapter or the application thereof to any person or circumstance be adjudged invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part or provision or application directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this chapter or the application thereof to other persons or circumstances. The County of Erie hereby declares that it would have passed this chapter or the remainder thereof had such invalid application or invalid provision been apparent.

SECTION 11. Effective Date

This Local Law shall take effect on September 1, 2024.

LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 5-2-2024

LOCAL LAW NO. -2024

A Local Law amending Local Law 1-1959, constituting the Erie County Charter, as amended, in relation to the amending of Section 202.2 for the purpose of setting the terms of legislative office to four (4) years and limiting the number of terms for that can be held to three (3) four-year terms for all elected officials.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. LEGISLATIVE INTENT

The intent of this legislation is to amend the terms of office for the Erie County of Legislature to a term of four (4) years and to limit the number of terms for all elected officials that can be served to three (3) four-year terms.

Section 2. CHANGING THE TERM OF LEGISLATIVE OFFICE AND LIMITING THE NUMBER OF TERMS FOR ALL ELECTED OFFICIALS

Erie County Local Law number one of nineteen hundred fifty-nine, as amended, constituting the Erie County Charter, is hereby amended as follows:

Article 2, Section 202.2. Election and terms of office. County legislators shall first be elected at the general election in the year nineteen hundred sixty-seven and shall assume office on January first, nineteen hundred sixty-eight. All elected County legislators shall hold their respective offices for a term of two years: provided, that legislators elected in the year two thousand twenty-six and in subsequent years shall hold their offices for four years. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as County legislator if that person had previously held such office for three or more four-year terms. For the purpose of establishing the term limit, term of office shall be calculated beginning the first day of his or her first full term of office after the effective date hereof.

Article 3, Section 301. The County Executive; election; term; qualifications. The executive branch of County government shall be administered by the County Executive who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election and shall be for four years, except that the term of the County Executive elected in nineteen hundred sixty shall be for three years. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as County Executive if that person had previously held such office for three or more four-year terms. For the purpose of establishing the term limit, term of office shall be calculated beginning the first day of his or her first full term of office after the effective date hereof. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or

her office and shall hold no other public office, except as provided in section three hundred seven hereof.

Article 18, Section 1801. Election; Comptroller's Act repealed. There shall be a County Comptroller who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election and shall be for four years. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as County Comptroller if that person had previously held such office for three or more four-year terms. For the purpose of establishing the term limit, term of office shall be calculated beginning the first day of his or her first full term of office after the effective date hereof. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or her office and shall hold no other public office. The Erie County Comptroller's Act, being chapter four hundred twenty three of the laws of nineteen hundred thirty-nine as amended, is hereby repealed, as of January first, nineteen hundred sixty-one.

Article 19, Section 1901. Election. There shall be a County Clerk who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election, and shall be for four years except as otherwise provided in this Charter. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as County Clerk if that person had previously held such office for three or more four-year terms. For the purpose of establishing the term limit, term of office shall be calculated beginning the first day of his or her first full term of office after the effective date hereof. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or her office and shall hold no other public office.

Article 20, Section 2001. Election. There shall be a District Attorney who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election, and shall be for four years except as otherwise provided in this Charter. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as District Attorney if that person had previously held such office for three or more four-year terms. For the purpose of establishing the term limit, term of office shall be calculated beginning the first day of his or her first full term of office after the effective date hereof. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or her office and shall hold no other public office.

Article 21, Section 2101. Election. There shall be a Sheriff who shall be elected from the County at large. His or her term of office shall begin with the first day of January next following his or her election and shall be for four years except as otherwise provided in this Charter. No person shall be eligible to be elected to or serve as Sheriff if that person had previously held such office for three or more four-year terms. For the purpose of establishing the term limit, term of office shall be calculated beginning the first day of his or her first full term of office after the effective date hereof. At the time of his or her election and throughout his or her term of office he or she shall be a qualified elector of

the County. He or she shall devote his or her whole time to the duties of his or her office and shall hold no other public office.

Section 3. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Local Law shall take effect the first day of the first fiscal year after receiving an affirmative vote of a majority of the qualified electors of the County of Erie in a manner consistent with the provisions of New York State Municipal Home Rule Law Article 3 and upon its subsequent filing with the New York Secretary of State.

Section 4. SEVERABILITY

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this Local Law or the application thereof, to any person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity or circumstance, shall be adjudged by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional such order of judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, section or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, corporation, firm, partnership, entity, or circumstance directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

LOCAL LAW INTRO. NO. 7-1 -2024

LOCAL LAW NO. -2024

A Local Law, named the "STUNT Law", requiring Erie County to expand penalties for speed contests, stunt behavior, and other reckless driving behaviors that endanger Erie County residents.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE ERIE COUNTY LEGISLATURE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Title.

This Local Law shall be known as the "STUNT Law: Safeguarding Traffic, Unlawful Racing, and Noise Transgressions."

Section 2. Legislative Purpose and Intent.

This Legislature recognizes that speeding has been a significant factor in numerous motor vehicle fatalities over the past decades, with motor vehicle accidents being one of the leading causes of death for individuals aged 1 to 54.

The Legislature acknowledges the rise in popularity of illegal vehicle sideshows, demonstrations, and contests; often shared on social media, which pose a great risk to participants and spectators, leading to severe physical injuries and even death.

Moreover, illegal vehicle sideshows, contests, street racing, and related stunt behavior not only endanger lives and property but also create excessive noise during night hours, causing disturbances for residents in neighboring areas.

The current penalties for these illegal activities are insufficient in deterring individuals from participating in them.

Therefore, the purpose of this Local Law is to protect Erie County residents by expanding and strengthening laws and penalties related to unlawful speed contests, sideshows, and related stunt behavior.

Section 3. Definitions.

As used in this Local Law, the following terms shall have the meanings indicated:

"Burnout" – To spin a vehicle's wheel(s) while keeping the vehicle stationary, causing the tires to heat up and emit smoke.

- "Drifting" The intentional oversteering of a vehicle with loss of traction while maintaining control, resulting in a controlled skid or power slide through a turn.
- "Doughnut" A maneuver performed by rotating the rear or front of a vehicle around the opposite set of wheels, creating a circular skid mark pattern on the road surface.
- "Revving" To rapidly increase the engine speed while a vehicle is stationary or in neutral, producing loud noise and/or causing the vehicle to jerk or lurch.
- "Sideshow" An event in which vehicles gather and engage in reckless behavior, such as performing stunts, burnouts, doughnuts/wheelies, drifting, and/or other dangerous maneuvers.
- "Street Racing" The act of racing or competing with one or more vehicles on a public highway, street, or road, whether prearranged or spontaneous.
- "Stunt Behavior" Performing any maneuver with a vehicle that is not part of normal driving or exceeds the safe limits of the vehicle; including but not limited to stunts, revving, burnout, drifting, doughnuts, acrobatic maneuvers, jumps, and other similar actions.
- "Wheelie" -- Raising a vehicle to the degree that one or more wheels lose contact with the ground.

Section 4. Prohibitions.

- (A) No person shall knowingly participate in, engage in, organize, facilitate, coordinate, plan, aid, or abet any street race, sideshow, contest, exhibition, or stunt behavior involving vehicles upon any public highway, street, sidewalk, public parking lot or area, or any other public property within Erie County.
- (B) No person shall knowingly obstruct or attempt to obstruct any public highway, street, or road with a motor vehicle, or any other object used as a blockade for the purpose of permitting any such race, sideshow, contest, exhibition, or stunt behavior.

Section 5. Enforcement and Penalties for Offenses.

(A) Any person who violates any provision of this article shall be guilty of a violation, punishable by a fine not exceeding \$500 for a first offense, and a fine not exceeding \$1,000 or by imprisonment for a period not exceeding 15 days, or both, for each subsequent offense.

(B) Any person who causes physical injury to another person or damage to real or personal property while violating any provision of this article shall be liable for the payment of restitution, as determined by a court of competent jurisdiction.

Section 6. Severability.

If any clause, sentence, paragraph, section, subdivision, or other part of this local law or its application shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of the local law which shall remain in full force and effect except as limited by such order or judgment.

Section 7. SEQRA Compliance.

This County Legislature determines that this local law constitutes a "Type II action" pursuant to the provisions of the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA), and that no further action under SEQRA is required.

Section 8. Effective Date.

This local law shall take effect immediately following its filing with the Office of the Secretary of State.

WHEREAS, the cost of such project has increased due to major inflationary pressures, material and labor shortages as well as an overall increase in the cost of the project due to these factors; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Managers of the District has duly directed that there be prepared an updated map, plan and report and revised estimate of cost (as so revised and updated, the "Report" and the "Estimate" respectively and, collectively, the "Report and Estimate") by the County Engineers (i.e., the Erie County Department of Environment and Planning) relating to a proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of the District, which Report and Estimate have been approved by the Board of Managers of the District on April 17, 2024, and subsequent thereto the Report and Estimate were filed with the County Legislature pursuant to Section 268 of the County Law; and

WHEREAS, the Report and Estimate describe a proposed increase and improvement of the facilities of the District, generally consisting of improvements to the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility, existing pumping stations, and the sanitary sewer collection system; as more fully described in the Report and Estimate (collectively, "Improvements" or the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, such Project will generally consist of substantial improvements to the Southtowns Advanced Wastewater Treatment Facility, such work being currently anticipated to include, but not necessarily be limited to, disinfection and effluent pumping improvements, ORF and outfall modifications, bioclarifier and aeration/UNOX system improvements including the rehabilitation of existing tanks, solids handling improvements, electrical improvements, equipment replacements and upgrades to backup power generator(s), IT infrastructure and HVAC system improvements, as well as other upgrades that are identified in the additional facility needs evaluation and as more fully identified in (or contemplated by)

the Report, with the foregoing to include all necessary site work, equipment, apparatus and other improvements and costs incidental thereto and in connection with the financing thereof; and

WHEREAS, the increased maximum estimated cost of the Project is \$215,000,000, and unless paid for from other sources or charges, such cost will be apportioned among the benefitted real properties in the District in accordance with charges based on usage and/or special assessments based on units, assessed value and/or footage, as these or other applicable cost apportionment standards may be specified in the District's Benefit and User Charge formulas (as those currently exist or as they may be amended from time to time in accordance with the County's sewer rents local law and the rules and procedures adopted by the Board of Managers of the District); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the County Law the consent of the State Comptroller is required prior to the construction and development of the Project in the District because the cost thereof to the Typical Property (as defined in the County Law) is estimated to exceed the Average Estimated Cost to the Typical Property for similar types of projects, as computed by the State Comptroller, with such cost being estimated to be \$221; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature has given due consideration to the impact that the Project may have on the environment and, on the basis of such consideration, the County Legislature found that no substantial adverse environmental impact will be caused thereby; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature and the County have complied in every respect with all applicable federal, state and local laws and regulations regarding environmental matters, including compliance with the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act, comprising Article 8 of the Environmental Conservation Law and, in connection therewith, duly issued a negative declaration and/or other applicable documentation concerning the project, which has been filed in the office of the County Clerk; and

WHEREAS, the County Legislature adopted Resolution No. 113-2024 on July 25, 2024, calling a meeting of the County Legislature for the purpose of holding a public hearing on the proposed Project in accordance with the Report and Estimate (the "Public Hearing"); and

WHEREAS, such Resolution No. 113-2024 authorized and directed the Clerk of the County Legislature to publish the notice of the Public Hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Public Hearing was duly held at County Hall, in Buffalo, New York, on September 9, 2024, at 2:00 o'clock P.M., Prevailing Time; and

WHEREAS, notice of the Public Hearing was duly published and filed in the manner provided by law and proof thereof was submitted to the County Legislature;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNTY LEGISLATURE OF THE COUNTY OF ERIE, NEW YORK, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Upon the evidence given at the Public Hearing, it is hereby found and determined that it is in the public interest to proceed with the Project and its proposed plan of financing, all as more fully described in the preambles hereto, and the Project is hereby authorized in concept (subject to the County's obtaining the required approval of the New York State Comptroller) at an increased maximum estimated cost of \$215,000,000.

Section 2. It is hereby found and determined that the parcels and lots of the District shall be benefited by the Project.

Section 3. It is hereby found and determined that the maximum estimated cost of the Project is \$215,000,000, and unless paid for from other sources or charges, such cost to be to be apportioned among the benefitted real properties in the District in accordance with charges based on usage and/or special assessments based on units, assessed value and/or footage, as these or other applicable cost apportionment standards may be specified in the District's Benefit and User Charge formulas (as those currently exist or as they may be amended from time to time in accordance with the County's sewer rents local law and the rules and procedures adopted by the Board of Managers of the District).

Section 4. It is hereby found and determined that the cost of the Project shall be financed by the issuance of serial bonds of the County (to be issued pursuant to one or more bond resolutions that are to be adopted by the Legislature in the future) in an amount not to exceed \$215,000,000, and with the balance of the cost of the Project to be annually apportioned within the District as described previously herein.

Section 5. It is hereby found and determined that this resolution shall constitute the declaration (or reaffirmation) of the County's "official intent" to reimburse (to the extent permitted) expenditures toward the Project with the proceeds of bonds, notes or other obligations, as required by United States Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.

Section 6. It is hereby found and determined that the County Legislature has directed that an application for approval be prepared and submitted to the New York State Comptroller's office, believes the contents of the application to be accurate, has determined that the Project (and its proposed plan of financing) for which approval is being sought is in the public interest and will not constitute an undue burden on the properties which will bear the cost thereof, and if the cost of the proposed improvements is to be assessed in whole or in part against a benefited area, that all real property to be so assessed will be benefited by the proposed improvements and that no benefited property has been excluded. The Legislature understands that the attached application has been presented and approved in substantially complete and final form, but nevertheless authorizes and approves, in advance, such non-material modifications, amendments or revisions as may, in the opinion of the County Attorney and the County's bond counsel, be deemed appropriate.

Re: Adjusting from the Income Limits for an Erie County Senior Citizen Property Tax Exemption

WHEREAS, New York State Real Property Tax Law (RPTL) Section 467 allows local municipalities to offer a senior property tax exemption based on income; and

WHEREAS, under state law, if allowed by local option, property that (1) is owned by persons 65 years of age or older, or by certain other persons whose income does not exceed the maximum established by local option, (2) is used exclusively for residential purposes, and (3) has been owned by at least one of its owners for a minimum of 12 consecutive months prior to application for exemption or for a period of time considered to be the equivalent of 12 consecutive months is partially exempt from general municipal taxes; and

WHEREAS, on July 7, 1970, the Erie County Legislature approved Item 16, a resolution opting into state legislation creating a property tax exemption for Erie County tax purposes for the Senior Citizen Real Property Tax Exemption; and

WHEREAS, periodically since July 1970, the maximum income level exemption has been reviewed and updated by the Erie County Legislature; and

WHEREAS, in August 2022, New York State increased the income limits for the senior citizen property tax exemption to provide greater relief for older Americans across the State; and

WHEREAS, because the Senior Citizen Real Property Tax Exemption has not been reviewed or revised since February 2022, it is necessary to review and revise the County's exemption threshold based on maximum income eligibility for senior citizens.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature, pursuant to Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law, as amended, is interested in participating in the local option to increase the maximum income eligibility for senior citizens to receive a real property tax exemption; and be it further

RESOLVED, upon public hearing, the maximum allowable income levels for the Senior Citizen Real Property Tax Exemption for the County property tax purposes are hereby revised to the following levels:

Re: 2025 Tentative Budget Revenue and Major Expenditure Estimates

Dear Honorable Members:

As you know, annually by October 1st, the County Administration is required, under Section 2506 of the Erie County Charter, to submit the revenue estimates and major expenditure estimates for the forthcoming budget to the Comptroller's Office for review. Under Section 1802(o) of the Charter, the Comptroller's Office is also required to review all revenue projections submitted by the Administration, and to submit a report to the Legislature by October 15th opining on these numbers.

The Charter states:

Section 1802. Powers and duties. The Comptroller shall:

o. On or before the 15th of October, review all revenue projections to be used in the proposed tentative budget prepared by the County Executive and submit to the Legislature in writing a report indicating whether or not the projections are suitable estimates for the ensuing year. Should the Comptroller determine that the revenue projections are not suitable for the ensuing fiscal year, the Legislature, upon notice from the Comptroller may revise such projections downward upon a two-thirds majority vote. The Legislature shall not revise such revenue projections upward.

Section 2506. Revenue and certain expense projections reviewed.

On or before the 1st day of October the County Executive shall submit to the Comptroller all revenue estimates and expenditure estimates for Medicaid, public assistance, and pension contributions and health care insurance costs for County employees to be used in the proposed budget. If not otherwise available, property tax revenue estimates shall include a maximum and minimum levy amount, which shall be used in preparing the budget. The Comptroller shall review all revenue estimates and expenditure estimates for Medicaid, public assistance and pension contributions and health care insurance costs for County employees to be used in the proposed tentative budget prepared by the County Executive and submit to the Legislature in writing by the 15th of October a report indicating whether or not such estimates are suitable estimates for the upcoming fiscal year. Should the Comptroller determine that any such revenue or expenditure estimate is not suitable for the upcoming fiscal year, the Legislature, upon notice from the Comptroller may revise any such

revenue estimate downward upon a two-thirds majority vote and may revise any such expenditure estimate upward by a majority vote. The Legislature shall not revise any such revenue estimate upward.

The Division of Budget and Management submitted the 2025 Budget estimates to my office on October 1, 2024. Pursuant to these Charter requirements, I am pleased to provide the following data and comments concerning the tentative 2025 Budget revenue and major expenditure estimates.

Revenues

Property Tax and Property Tax-Related

As is usually the case, the proposed 2025 property tax levy for both the County and the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library) was not included in the estimates. The Director of Budget and Management stated in his letter that the property tax rate per thousand of assessed value will decrease by "approximately \$0.11" and the County Administration told media outlets that the property tax rate will be \$3.28 per \$1,000 of assessed value.

The changes in the six (6) other property tax-related accounts for 2025 are modest and not material, although we note that the revenue from the Interest and Penalties on Real Property Taxes increases from \$15,333,598 in the 2024 Budget to \$18,488,389 for 2025. Given actual revenues in this account between 2020 and 2022 ranged from \$15.7 million to \$18.2 million, the 2025 estimate is not unreasonable.

Sales Tax

Proposed revenue from County share sales tax revenue decreases from \$639,334,423 in 2024 to \$625,895,246 in 2025, or a 2.1% reduction. Based on actual 2024 sales tax data so far, this estimate is reasonable. A similar reduction occurs for sales tax revenue which is distributed to local governments and school districts.

Appropriated Fund Balance

The 2025 estimate includes no mention of using appropriated fund balance for 2025.

Hotel Occupancy Tax

For 2025, under the auspices of the 2024 Hotel Occupancy Tax Modernization Act, the administration has established a new general ledger account for hotel occupancy taxes in the Tourism Promotion cost center and moved the hotel tax revenue from the Countywide Budget Accounts cost center to Tourism Promotion. As you know, the new 2024 local law dedicates all hotel tax revenue to tourism promotion purposes, including Visit Buffalo Niagara. This functionally means a loss of revenue supporting the General Fund if all such revenue is budgeted in 2025 for tourism, convention center expenses and debt service for that facility.

For 2025, the estimate for hotel occupancy tax revenue is \$14 million, an increase from \$13 million for 2024. The estimate is reasonable.

Other Revenues

The County Clerk is projecting an increase in Mortgage Tax revenue from \$617,104 in the 2024 Budget to \$1,577,535 for 2025. Based on recent years' actual revenue in this account, the 2025 estimate is very high. The 2020-2022 actual revenue totaled between \$541,620 to \$572,105 annually, so \$1.57 million is considerably higher. The higher 2025 estimate may potentially reflect changes or developments following this office's audit of the mortgage tax process, although that is speculative.

The County Clerk continues to project that revenue from Recording Fees will be lower than prior years. The 2025 estimate is \$4,725,000, compared to \$4.5 million for 2024. This contrasts with \$6.76 million in actual revenue in 2022. Given the recent reduction in interest rates, and developments in the local real estate market, actual 2025 revenue in this account may differ.

While not material for the purposes of this report, I note that the Sheriff's Office is projecting increases in payments for security services associated with Highmark Stadium (\$110,000 more in 2025) and Key Bank Center (\$60,000 more in 2025).

The 2025 Budget includes the new revenue account, Tax on Adult-Use Cannabis, with an estimate of a County-share revenue of \$370,000 for 2025. 2024 revenue from the State for recreational marijuana has been low and inconsistent. The State's administration of this program has been problematic in a number of ways. The 2025 estimate is not necessarily unreasonable, and given the low value, not objectionable.

For 2025, the Community College Respread (chargeback of prior year expenses to local governments) is projected to generate \$9,026,388 in revenue, compared to \$7,784,245 in 2024. This estimate is reasonable given community college chargeback costs and the number of Erie County residents attending community colleges in other counties in New York state.

The proposed 2025 Budget includes an Administration-requested increase in general investment interest earnings in the Comptroller's Office. The proposed revenue for 2025 is \$8 million, compared to \$3.6 million in the 2024 Budget. Given substantial 2024 actual revenue in this account, the 2025 estimate is reasonable. The administration is also budgeting \$2 million in revenue from the Interest and Earnings-3rd Party account, up from \$50,000 for 2024. We do not object to this estimate.

In the Department of Probation, a new revenue called Community Engagement Services is budgeted for 2025, at \$69,720.

In the Emergency Medical Services Division of the Department of Health, proposed revenue from the Ambulance Service is projected to increase from \$250,000 budgeted in 2024 to \$375,000 for 2025. Given the nascent nature of the service, this account bears monitoring, although it is not material to the overall 2025 Budget.

In the Public Health Laboratory Division of the Department of Health, two revenue accounts are budgeted to increase in 2025: Individual Sewage System-Optional (increasing from \$425,000 in 2024 to \$725,000 in 2025) and Public Health Laboratory Fees (increasing from \$245,000 to \$381,000 in 2025). This suggests that fees are being increased in some fashion.

In the STOP-DWI cost center in the Department of Central Police Services, revenue from the DIW program is budgeted to increase from \$745,569 in 2024 to \$982,802 in 2025. Actual revenue in 2022 was \$298,530. It is not clear if this estimate is reasonable.

The Administration is budgeting \$352,975 in revenue from a residual equity transfer for 2025, after not doing so in 2024. While we do not know the source of this revenue for 2025, in recent years, it has previously consisted of revenue associated with the closure of dormant capital project accounts.

In the Countywide Budget Accounts cost center, Interfund Revenue Non-Subsidy revenue is budgeted to decrease from \$9,823,386 in 2024 to \$5,448,410 in 2025. Without additional information, we cannot opine on this revenue account presently.

State Aid

There are a few modest revenue changes proposed in 2025 pertaining to State Aid.

In the Department of Social Services, State Aid for Social Services Administration decreases from \$36.6 million in 2024 to \$32.4 million for 2025. In the Youth Detention Division, State Aid for Raise the Age increases from \$8 million to \$9.3 million. In the Youth Bureau, a new revenue account called Youth Team Sports is included, with state aid of \$472,082.

In the Persons with Special Needs Division of the Department of Health, State Aid for the NYS Education Department Special Needs Preschool Program increases from \$40.2 million to \$41.8 million.

In the Department of Law, State Aid is increasing from \$1,356,477 to \$1,700,000 for 2025.

We have no basis under which to dispute these estimates at this time.

Federal Aid

In the Department of Social Services, five (5) revenue accounts have material changes in 2025 compared to the Adopted 2024 Budget. Federal Aid for TANF FFFS (Temporary Aid for Needy Families – Flexible Fund) increases from \$39 million in 2024 to \$41.4 million for 2025. Federal Aid for Family Assistance increases from \$35.5 million to \$37.6 million for 2025. Federal Aid for Social Services Administration increases from \$21.5 million to \$24.9 million for 2025. Federal Aid for SNAP Administration (Supplemental Assistance Nutrition Program) increases from \$16.6 million to \$19.0 million for 2025. Federal Aid for the Daycare Block Grant increases substantially from \$44.9 million to \$57.8 million for 2025.

We have no basis under which to dispute these estimates at this time.

Expenditures

Under the Charter, the Administration is required only to provide expenditure estimates for Medicaid, public assistance and pension contributions and health care insurance costs for County employees.

Health/Dental Costs

The Administration is forecasting health/dental insurance costs for County employees of \$93,542,006 for 2025, compared to \$89,732,393 for 2024. This estimate, while certainly at the higher range, could be valid. In recent years, positive variances in fringe benefit accounts have been utilized to provide funds during mid-year for other funding needs, so it is possible this projection of expense is overstated.

Pension Obligation

In order to avoid sudden shocks and increases in pension obligations based on the stock market's performance, the State Comptroller uses a five-year average in order to calculate a local government's annual pension payment. This helps to reduce significant fluctuations.

In October 2023, the Administration estimated our 2024 net General Fund pension costs (after State/Federal reimbursement is factored in) to be \$41,400,666. The County's estimated December 15, 2024 pension payment is \$56,221,500.

The Administration is forecasting 2025 net General Fund pension costs (after State/Federal reimbursement is factored in) of \$48,564,101. The current December 2025 pension payment estimate from the State Comptroller's Office is \$65,030,985. If that pension payment estimate remains static, the 2025 Budget estimate of \$48,564,101 appears low.

The County's pension costs have been rising dramatically, in part due to State decisions, as well as the County's late 2023 decision to allow correctional officers and sheriff deputy officers in the Jail Management Division to retire with 25 years of service.

Medicaid/Intergovernmental Transfer Obligations

The Administration is forecasting \$213,379,184 in Medicaid-MMIS costs in 2025 against the 2024 Budget number of \$214,648,032. The estimate for 2025 appears reasonable, in part because the County had one additional payment week cycle for 2024.

While not required to do so under the Charter, the Administration has not provided any estimates for Disproportionate Share (DSH) or Upper Payment Limit (UPL) costs associated with Erie County Medical Center Corporation (ECMCC) for 2025. As you know, this mechanism allows Erie County to leverage federal and County funds for the support of ECMCC. These accounts and costs require close monitoring.

Indigent Care Adjustment expenses (related to DSH) rise from \$6,902,172 in 2024 to \$9,298,931 for 2025.

Major Social Services Accounts

The Administration is forecasting a \$1.4 million increase in costs for the Family Assistance program in 2025 and a \$1.4 million increase in costs for the State's Safety Net Assistance program in 2025.

These estimates appear reasonable. It is not known what the CWS-Foster Care program expense will be for 2025 (because it was not provided). That has been a rapidly growing cost for the County.

Conclusion

Overall, based on the data provided to my office, the proposed 2025 revenue and expenditure estimates are generally reasonable. We reserve the right to change our opinion once the Executive Recommended 2025 Budget is released and we can review the Budget and all accounts in their entirety. WHEREAS, the Clerk's Office is endeavoring to ensure all charges and fees are properly and legally carried over in the transition to the new recordkeeping software; and

WHEREAS, that absent any Legislative directive or legal opinion from the County Attorney, the Erie County Clerk's Office will continue to charge bulk data fees while this matter is being considered by the Erie County Legislature, to prevent any interruption of business to customers.

The Erie County Clerk's Office is requesting authorization to charge bulk data fees to interested customers.

Monthly or "bulk" data fees have been charged on interested customers since before the current administration. At this time, there are approximately thirteen (13) customers who utilize the option to purchase monthly or "bulk" data from the Clerk's Office. However, the June 2023 Audit of the Clerk's Office by the Erie County Comptroller's Office commented that there was no legislative resolution or local law authorizing the Clerk's Office to charge bulk data fees. In preparing for the transition to new software authorized by this Honorable Body on October 10, 2024, the Clerk's Office staff has also been unable to find documented legal authority to charge bulk data fees.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS AND REASON FOR RECOMMENDATION

The Clerk's Office is endeavoring to ensure all charges and fees are properly and legally carried over in the transition to the new recordkeeping software.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

The Clerk's Office will be required to discontinue bulk data agreements which will frustrate customers, especially the thirteen entities currently utilizing the service. The Clerk's Office notes that absent any Legislative directive or legal opinion from the County Attorney, the Erie County Clerk's Office will continue to charge bulk data fees while this matter is being considered by the Erie County Legislature, to prevent any interruption of business to customers.

SUMMARY

The Division of Budget and Management is requesting authorization to reorganize the use of remaining American Rescue Plan Act funding within a number of Parks Department-related capital projects in advance of the December 31, 2024 deadline to have all funding fully obligated.

As a result of remaining funding upon completion of projects and delays related to the Wendt Beach Mansion and Stable renovation project, \$1,724,890.48 of ARPA funds remains unobligated in advance of the December 31, 2024 obligation deadline.

Specifically, a total of \$1,724,890.48 in ARPA Revenue Replacement funds will be transferred from Parks Department Capital Projects A.21161 and A.21162 into Environment and Planning Capital Projects A.22054 – Isle View Enhancement Project and A.20009 – Agribusiness Park Project. These projects have both progressed to the point where Environment and Planning is ready to enter into contract for construction and has, subsequently, submitted resolutions to this Honorable Body requesting such authorization.

As a result of the influx of ARPA funds into these projects, displaced pay-as-you-go funding from A.19075, A.20009, and A.22054 in the amount of \$1,550,000 will be transferred into Parks Capital Project A.24005 for later use.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Positive. No additional funding is being requested or used. This resolution is reorganization of existing funds in order to ensure full obligation of all ARPA dollars in advance of the December 31, 2024 deadline.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The reorganization of ARPA funds will ensure that all dollars are obligated by the upcoming December 31, 2024 deadline

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Department of Parks, Recreation and Forestry received a total of \$14.4 million in ARPA Revenue Replacement funding under the Revenue Replacement Expense Category as part of COMM. 13E-15 (2021) American Rescue Plan Omnibus Spending Package – the "RENEW Plan." Through September 2024, Parks has fully expended nearly \$8.4 million in funding on dozens of construction projects including a number of shelter and restroom renovations at

Chestnut Ridge Park, Emery Park, Ellicott Creek Park and Como Lake Park. Additionally, funding was provided for the full reconstruction of the main parking lots at Chestnut Ridge Park and Wendt Beach. Funding was also provided for a variety of upgrades at Grover Cleveland Golf Course including the restoration of the Schenck House, recognized as the oldest standing structure in the City of Buffalo.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

If this resolution is not approved, the remaining ARPA funding may remain unobligated at the December 31, 2024 deadline and would be required to be returned to U.S. Treasury. Additionally, there will not be sufficient funding for the Isle View Enhancement Project where authorization to enter into contract for construction is being sought as part of a subsequent resolution submitted by the Department of Environment and Planning.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Division of Budget and Management will work with the Departments of Parks, Recreation and Forestry and Environment and Planning to effectuate the complete transfer of all funds discussed within this resolution as quickly as possible so that subsequent resolutions authorizing the entering into contract for use of these funds may proceed.

WHEREAS, capital projects related to major enhancements at Isle View Park in Tonawanda and the Agribusiness Park in Eden managed by the Department of Environment and Planning have been identified as being in a shovel ready state and able to obligate funds in advance of the December 31, 2024 deadline; and

WHEREAS, the Isle View Enhancement and Agribusiness Park Projects are eligible for American Recue Plan Act funding under the Revenue Replacement Expense Category 6.1 – Provision of Government Services; and be it further

WHEREAS, resolutions have been submitted to this Honorable Body by the Department of Environment and Planning requesting authorization to enter into contracts for the use of these funds upon re-appropriation of these funds

SUMMARY

The Isle View Enhancement Project will comprehensively update Isle View Park's facilities and provide additional recreational options and new connections to implement the Erie County Parks Master Plan recommendations for the Park. The Proposed resolution seeks authorization to accept \$500,000 in additional grant funding from the Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation and \$500,000 from the Niagara River Greenway Commission. The proposed resolution also makes an environmental determination and authorizes contracts for construction services, construction inspection, construction engineering and construction administration to implement the project.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The County owns and is responsible for capital improvements of Isle View Park in the Town and City of Tonawanda. The total cost of the project is anticipated to be \$4,252,390. The Department of Environment and Planning previously secured \$1,702,068 in grant funding for this project. Additionally, in this resolution the acceptance of a \$1,000,000 is being requested. Grant funding is from Niagara River Greenway, New York State Department of State, Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation totaling \$2,702,068, enabling the County to fulfill this capital maintenance obligation at a reduced amount of \$326,026.74.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The Erie County Parks Master Plan Update (2019) adopted by your Honorable Body is the planning policy document for the for the Erie County Park's system. The proposed project will implement many of the recommended actions to improve Isle View Park. The proposed resolution will issue an environmental determination consistent with SEQR requirements, authorize a contract with for construction engineering and construction inspection services, and award the construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder, A-1 Land Care, Inc.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Erie County applied and was awarded multiple grants totaling \$1,702,068 to offset the cost of the County's capital maintenance in Isle View. The proposed resolution accepts \$1,000,000 in additional grants from the Niagara River Greenway and the Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation, totaling \$2,702,068 in grant funding. Improvements will include repairs to existing overlooks, delineation of the maintenance area from the public entrance, landscaping, a new pedestrian and cyclist ramp connection to River Road with viewing platform, new inclusive and nature-based playground, repaving existing parking lots, demolition of former River Dogs Hot Dog stand, replacement with new pavilion, new natural gas fire pit, replacement of benches and picnic tables.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

In the event the proposed resolution is not passed, Erie County will be unable to enter into a contract to accept \$1,000,000 in grant funding. Additionally, the \$1,702,068 in previously accepted grant funded will be forfeited. The County will need to find alternative sources to fund the County obligations of capital maintenance within Isle View Park. The condition of the Park will continue to deteriorate.



SUMMARY

It is recommended the Erie County Legislature authorize the County Executive to enter into contracts with the Erie County Industrial Development Agency for the purpose of engaging a qualified construction contractor to construct a new access road and demolish four unused buildings to develop the Agribusiness Park. The proposed construction will provide the infrastructure necessary to open a portion of the Agribusiness Park for development.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The proposed funding of \$2,500,000 is designated for this purpose in the Erie County Capital budget and is in the following Capital Accounts:

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

In 2012, the *Erie County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Plan* identified the need for the County to develop new markets for agricultural producers. The Plan recommended that the County explore developing an agribusiness-focused industrial park to provide new and expanded markets for raw agricultural products like dairy, vegetables, and fruits produced by local farmers.

In 2015, the County commissioned the *Erie County Agribusiness Park Feasibility* Study to study the concept, determine the market feasibility, identify sectors in which the region possesses a competitive advantage and identify a site suitable for an agribusiness park. The Feasibility Study concluded that Erie County market could support an industrial park dedicated to food processors. It also concluded, after reviewing 30 potential locations, that the Evans Industrial Park at the former Eden Angola Airport offered the best location.

The former Eden Angola Airport and an adjacent parcel, which total a combined 242 acres, was purchased by the Buffalo and Erie County Industrial Land Development Corporation (ILDC) a land-owning subsidiary of the Erie County Industrial Development Corporation (ECIDA) in April 2020.

In May 2024, the ILDC, acting as lead agency, issued the Final Generic Environmental Impact

Statement (FGEIS) for the adoption and implementation of a master plan for development of the former Eden Angola Airport site into an Agribusiness Park. The master plan calls for the development of road infrastructure to initiate redevelopment of the site. Phase I of infrastructure development includes construction of a main access road and utilities, using a portion of the former airport runway, to provide access to the site from Eden Evans Center Road. The project will also require the demolition of four one-story former airport hangar buildings.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

ECIDA has contracted with a civil engineering firm to provide design documents, construction administration, and resident engineer services during construction of the Phase I road and utility infrastructure project. ECIDA has staff that are experienced in subcontracting with consultants to complete the construction of road infrastructure projects of this nature, having recently completed this type of work at Renaissance Commerce Park, the former Bethlehem Steel site.

The construction of the Phase I road infrastructure project is necessary to facilitate the development of the site into an Agribusiness Park. The project will involve construction of approximately 325 feet of new roadway extending north from Eden Evans Center Road to connect with the former north-south aircraft runway, a portion of which will be converted to a new road with utility infrastructure capable of supporting the future buildout of development parcels for Agribusiness Park tenants.

The project will also require the demolition of four one-story metal buildings, totaling approximately 14,700 sf, which were used by the former airport for various purposes including warehousing and offices.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

If a resolution to enter into a contract is not approved, Erie County and ECIDA will not be able to complete this work. The development of the Agribusiness Park site will be delayed until additional funding is secured to complete the development of road infrastructure. The Project will be delayed until additional funding is secured and will potentially jeopardize the existing grant funds previously secured.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

Upon approval of the resolution, contracts will be executed with the ECIDA, and a consultant will be hired to complete the work.

SUMMARY

It is recommended that the Erie County Legislature authorize the County Executive to enter into agreements to implement the FeedMore Western New York Consolidated Campus capital project. FeedMore is the primary hunger relief organization in the region, distributing food to thousands of residents and food banks throughout its four-county service area. The organization is constructing the Campus to better meet the needs of the community in response to rising food insecurity in the region.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

FeedMore is currently constructing its new Consolidated Campus on a 74-acre parcel at 4832 Camp Road in the Town of Hamburg. Currently, due to capacity constraints at its existing facilities, the Organization is renting approximately 30,000 square feet of refrigerated, frozen, and dry storage space. It has also turned away an estimated 1.2 million pounds of food in recent years due to a lack of adequate storage and repackaging areas. The 197,700 square foot facility will be comprised of the main warehouse and logistics, as well as commissary, food production, office, and meeting spaces.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

FeedMore WNY was formed through the 2019 merger of the Food Bank of WNY and Meals on Wheels for WNY. Demand for the Organization's services has spiked in recent years, far outpacing its present capacity. The new facility will advance the Organization's mission by providing greater operational efficiency and enabling further program development.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

If a resolution to enter into a contract is not approved, Erie County and FeedMore will not be able to complete the project as proposed. The project will not occur as scheduled, and work may be delayed until such time that additional funds are raised.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

Upon approval of the resolution, contracts will be executed.

SUMMARY

It is recommended that the Legislature approve the attached resolution prepared by the Erie County Department of Environment and Planning authorizing the County Executive or Deputy County Executive to enter into an agreement with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to accept \$400,000 in grant funding and establish a project budget to commence the WNY Stormwater Coalition (WNYSC): Stormwater Management Practice Mapping Project.

This new grant effort entails data collection and GIS mapping of stormwater management practices for the 43 municipal entities in the WNYSC. The project will utilize student interns from Buffalo State University's Department of Geography and Planning, which will require a contract for less than \$6,000. The University has provided student interns with Geographic Information Systems (GIS) expertise since 2012, when DEP secured funding for its first storm sewer system mapping grant, as well as for four subsequent mapping grants.

The County staff funded by the new grant budget consists of:

- 1. Information Technology Specialist (JG 8), fully funded, a new staff position in DEP.
- 2. Chief Environmental Compliance Specialist (JG-15), partially funded, a transfer of an existing position in DEP. The remaining funds for this position come from the WNY Stormwater Coalition.

SUMMARY

The resolution authorizes the County Executive to execute a PILOT Agreement extension with Artspace Affordable Family Housing Development Fund Corp., Artspace Affordable Family Housing I, L.P., and the City of Buffalo.

The owner is seeking the extension of a PILOT from the City of Buffalo and Erie County, consistent with the PILOT Policy adopted by the Erie County Legislature on December 16, 1999.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

In accordance with the PILOT policy, the proposed PILOT payment for the Artspace Buffalo Lofts project shall be based on a payment of \$29,988 in year 1 and would escalate by 3% each year for an additional fifteen-year term. The payment Schedule A lists the payments for the 15 years of the Agreement.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The City of Buffalo supports the PILOT and on October 1, 2024, the Common Council of the City of Buffalo approved the Artspace Buffalo Lofts PILOT Agreement extension. The project conforms to the provisions of Article XI of the New York Private Housing Finance Law.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The residential project is located at 1219-1233 Main Street, 19, 29 and 33 Northampton Street and 12 Coe Place in the City of Buffalo, zip code 14209. The project consists of the existing development containing sixty (60) units. All units in the project will continue to be low-income, for households earning between thirty percent (30%) to sixty percent (60%) area median income (AMI), with sixty percent (60%) of the tenants earning no more than forty percent (40%) of the area median income (AMI). The original PILOT Agreement was approved in 2006.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Without the PILOT, it would not be economically feasible for Artspace Affordable Family Housing Development Fund Corp. and/or Artspace Affordable Family Housing I, L.P. to operate the project as it is currently structured.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The County Executive or Deputy County Executive will enter into a PILOT Agreement extension with the noted parties.

SUMMARY

The resolution authorizes the County Executive to execute a PILOT Agreement extension with AD Price I Housing Development Fund Corp., AD Price I LLC, and the City of Buffalo.

The owner is seeking the extension of a PILOT from the City of Buffalo and Erie County, consistent with the PILOT Policy adopted by the Erie County Legislature on December 16, 1999.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

In accordance with the PILOT policy, the proposed PILOT payment for the AD Price I project shall be based on a payment of \$12,441.48. in year 1 and would escalate by 3% each year for an additional fifteen-year term. The payment Schedule A lists the payments for the 15 years of the Agreement.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The City of Buffalo supports the PILOT extension and on October 1, 2024, the Common Council of the City of Buffalo approved the AD Price I PILOT Agreement extension. The project conforms to the provisions of Article XI of the New York Private Housing Finance Law.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The residential project consists of ten (10) existing buildings, containing a total of fifty-five (55) units of affordable housing located at: 282 Madison Street, 477 Jefferson Avenue, 489 Jefferson Avenue, 455 Jefferson Avenue, 566 Jefferson Avenue, 482 Jefferson Avenue, 490 Jefferson Avenue, and 514 Jefferson Avenue, zip code 14204. All units in the project will be low-income for households earning no more than thirty (30) percent of the area median income (AMI). The original PILOT Agreement was approved in 2007.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Without the PILOT extension, it would not be economically feasible for AD Price I Housing Development Fund Corp. and/or AD Price I LLC to operate the project as it is currently structured.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The County Executive or Deputy County Executive will enter into a PILOT Agreement extension with the noted parties.



SUMMARY

The Department of Public Works (DPW) along with the Department of Parks, Recreation & Forestry is seeking authorization for the County Executive to enter into a contract with the lowest responsible bidder for the Wendt Beach Mansion and Stables Core and Shell Renovation project, located at 7676 Old Lake Shore Road, Derby, New York 14047.

This project involves exterior improvements to the Mansion and exterior stabilization of the Stables. Improvements to the mansion include select reframing of the exterior enclosure, new roofing, siding, insulation, plywood substrates, new windows, new doors, and reconstruction of the terrace. Stabilization of the Stables includes select foundation repair, select reframing of the exterior enclosure, redirecting select areas of roof drainage, select areas of substrate replacement, and select areas of siding.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Funds for the project are currently available from the approved Capital Budget, Funds Center 122, Fund 410, as follows:

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

This project will replace the existing roof, windows, and doors and siding which have exceeded their life expectancy to protect the structural integrity of the building. This project will also include temporary and exterior lighting, emergency fixtures, and exit signs. This project will also incorporate installing a new gas line and furnace. This project will make the necessary repairs and prevent future deterioration of these buildings.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Wendt Beach Park is a 164-acre, multipurpose park with beach related and passive activities, as well as active recreational offerings. The park features the historic Wendt Beach Mansion, previously used as a residence, and a Stable Building. If this project does not progress, the mansion and stables will continue to deteriorate, and the loss of these historic buildings is likely.

The bid opening for the Wendt Beach Mansion and Stables Core and Shell Renovation Project was on August 27, 2024 and General bids were received and opened.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

If this project is not completed, the Wendt Beach Mansion and Stables will continue to deteriorate beyond repair.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

Upon Legislative approval, the County Executive will enter into a contract with the lowest responsible bidder.

The goal of this project is to improve fire communications and incident management within Chestnut Ridge Park and surrounding areas.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SUMMARY

The attached resolution requests authorization to transfer funds between expense accounts to cover anticipated shortfalls in the operating accounts of the Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Services.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No impact on County tax dollars. Funds are available within the Adopted 2024 Operating Budget.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION/BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Services met with the Division of Budget & Management to analyze the status of their 2024 Budget and discuss the forthcoming 2025 Budget. At that meeting, a number of immediate fiscal needs were identified. The need for a standardized uniform to be issued to each of the 33 Part Time Fire Instructors, who provide training to Fire Departments across the County will require a transfer of funds to the Account 505200 – Clothing Supplies in the amount of \$17,000. An increase in hourly rates in the contract with Asset Protective Services for security at 608 William Street will result in a shortfall of \$34,000 in Account 516080 – Life and Safety Contracts. Additionally, there is an urgent need to repair the Second Floor Burn Room in the Fire Tower located at the Erie County Fire Training Academy in Cheektowaga. A transfer of funds in the amount of \$23,000 to Account 506200 – Repairs and Maintenance would allow Emergency Services to make this repair. It was also determined that a surplus of \$17,000 from Account #516020 – Professional Service Contracts & Fees and a surplus of \$57,000 from Account # 559000 County Share of Grants would be available for transfer to the required accounts.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Without this legislation, the Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Services would be unable to meet its financial obligations for the balance of 2024.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Erie County Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Services will initiate the transfer of funds in coordination with the Division of Budget and Management.

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Services recently met with the Division of Budget and Management to analyze the status of the department's 2024 budget and discuss the forthcoming 2025 Budget; and

WHEREAS, during that meeting several immediate fiscal needs were identified: and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Services utilizes 33 Part Time Fire Instructors to conduct training to Fire Fighters throughout the County: and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Homeland Security and Emergency Services would like to provide a standard uniform to each of these Instructors requiring an expenditure of \$17,000 from Account 505200 – Clothing Supplies; and

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Homeland Security & Emergency Services anticipates a shortage of \$34,000 in Account – 516080 – Life and Safety Contracts due to increased hourly rates for the Asset Protective Services contract; and

SUMMARY

Legislative authorization is requested to accept \$3,000,000 in grant funding from the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC), authorization to establish a representative to execute the Grant Agreement, and to approve the SEQR determination for the project.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The grant funding for this action is derived from New York State Grant dollars. It requires an 11% match in the amount of \$333,333. This funding is currently available from the approved and adopted 2023 Capital Budget Funds Center 122, Fund 490 as follows:

F.23001 – Buffalo & Erie County Public Library Roof Replacement

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

The EFC has committed to providing a \$3,000,000 grant to help fund the addition of a green roof to the Buffalo & Erie County Downtown Library. The grant requires a formal resolution to acknowledge receipt of the grant and designate an authorized signatory to execute any agreements. This resolution would satisfy those requirements and provide access to the \$3,000,000 grant.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

The Buffalo & Erie County Downtown Library requires a new roof and is currently in design as authorized by your Honorable Boday in COMM. 4E-17 (2024) on March 7th, 2024. This presented an opportune time to implement a green infrastructure project and therefore Erie County pursued funding through NYS EFC's Green Infrastructure Grant Program (GIGP). This grant program will provide funding for up to 90% of the cost to implement a green infrastructure project. In February of 2024 we were notified that we were awarded \$3,000,000 for the installation of a green roof on the Downtown Library. Installing a green roof will provide numerous financial benefits including reducing the utility bills by providing additional insulation and tripling the lifespan of the roofing material. It will also improve local air quality and ambient temperatures while reducing and delaying stormwater runoff.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Not authorizing the acceptance of the funding sources would increase the cost of the project and possibly jeopardize the viability of the project. The County would have to forfeit the \$3,000,000 grant award.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

The Department of Public Works will work with the Division of Budget and Management to establish the funds which will be incorporated into the project account.

COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE REVIEW

The proposed legislation has been reviewed by the Comptroller's Office and is related to an authorized capital project for which there are sufficient appropriations for the action proposed.



These contracts and contingency are for the Reconstruction of Pine Street, from Main Street (US 20A) to Porterville Road in the Village of East Aurora. The scope of this project is to replace storm drainage and a full reconstruction of the pavement. Bids for the subject Project will be received by the Department of Public Works on October 10, 2024.



Seeking Erie County Legislative approval that will allow the Director of Real Property Tax Services, on behalf of the County of Erie, to purchase 2024 and any other unsold Tax Lien Certificates.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Positive for Erie County. The purchase of the unpaid taxes and the creation of a Tax Lien Certificate places the County of Erie in first position in redemption of such Tax Lien Certificates with interest.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

Erie County will be able to collect previous taxes owed on unpaid tax liens. Additionally, once due and unpaid for a period of at least two years, the County will be able to commence foreclosure proceedings upon the subject Tax Lien Certificates.



The program provides employees with access to a wide range of discounts on products and services, helping them save money and improve their financial well-being. This agreement is expected to launch in January 2025 and will provide Erie County employees with an easy-to-use platform, supported by PerkSpot's robust customer service and promotional efforts.

Fitness, Orange Theory, AMC Theaters, Regal Theaters, Six Flags Darien Lake, Highmark Stadium, University at Buffalo Stadium, Harborcenter, KeyBank Center, Seneca Niagara Casino, Rec Room, Town Ballroom, Asbury Hall, and Shea's Performing Arts Center. In addition to local options, employees will also enjoy discounts from national brands such as Nike, Under Armour, Samsung, Apple, Kindercare, Teleflora, Rocket Mortgage, Enterprise, and Avis.

These discounts will be available across various categories, including apparel, electronics, entertainment, education, flowers, health and wellness, home and family, and travel and events.

The contract is for an initial term of three years, with the option of two one-year extensions. All services will be provided at no cost to Erie County.

Upon information and belief, the claim first arose on or about March 23, 2024, when officers CITY OF BUFFALO POLICE OFFFICERS AHMED ABDO, JOSEPH MELI, ALANNA LAGUERRE, ALEXANDER QUINCY, ELNUR KARADZHA, CHRISTOPHER WILSON, SEAN FORD, JOHN GRAVIUS, LIEUTENANTS VINCENT JUDGE, COURTNEY TRIPP, ADAM O'SHEI, and CITY OF BUFFALO POLICE OFFICERS JOHN DOE(S) of Respondent CITY OF BUFFALO unlawfully removed, seized, detained, and arrested Claimant in the City of Buffalo, County of Erie and State of New York, and then brought to the custody of

Respondents COUNTY OF ERIE and Sheriff JOHN GARCIA as a pre-trial detainee of the Erie County Holding Center, located in the City of Buffalo, County of Erie and State of New York, wherein Claimant then suffered from a medical event that was not properly or timely addressed.

- 5. The claim arose in substance as follows: On or about March 23, 2024, Claimant LAMAR BRAZZLE was traversing on Busti Avenue, in the City of Buffalo, County of Erie, State of New York, when officers AHMED ABDO, JOSEPH MELI, ALANNA LAGUERRE, ALEXANDER OUINCY, ELNUR KARADZHA, CHRISTOPHER WILSON, SEAN FORD, JOHN GRAVIUS, LIEUTENANTS VINCENT JUDGE, COURTNEY TRIPP, ADAM O'SHEI, and CITY OF BUFFALO POLICE OFFICERS JOHN DOE(S) unlawfully elongated a traffic stop, subjecting Claimant to unlawful detention, search of his person, search of his car, and ultimately an arrest. Claimant remained in custody for no less than 29 days, held within the Erie County Holding Center. The subject criminal charges initiated by the officers in the incident of March 23, 2024 were ultimately dismissed on or about July 12, 2024. During his custodial status, Claimant had complained of an ongoing tooth issue, which Respondents COUNTY OF ERIE, SHERIFF JOHN GARCIA, and JOHN and JANE DOES, medical providers of the Erie County Sheriff's Office whose identities remain to be discovered, failed to properly address. Claimant's initial tooth concern began within days of his initial arrest, March 23, 2024, and included an unnecessary and/or improper filling of a separate tooth on or about May 23, 2024 by JOHN and JANE DOES, medical providers of the Erie County Sheriff's Office whose identities remain to be discovered.
- 6. CITY OF BUFFALO POLICE DEPARTMENT OFFICER(S) above-named, together with those not yet identified, did not only opt to unlawfully detain Claimant, but subjected his own person and his vehicle to an unlawful search. The charges resulting from any unlawful search and seizure precluded Claimant from release from custody. All such previously described acts,

together with those not yet discovered or herein described were done without probable cause or proper authority to do so.

- 7. Upon information and belief, on or about July 12, 2024, the charge against the Claimant (Penal Law § 265.03) herein was dismissed "in the interest of justice" by the Erie County District Attorney's Office in the City of Buffalo.
- 8. Upon information and belief, the incident herein described and the resultant damages sustained were caused as a result of the negligence, carelessness, reckless disregard and/or unlawful conduct, false arrest, false imprisonment, malicious prosecution, and abuse of process on the part of the agents, servants and/or employees of the CITY OF BUFFALO, CITY OF BUFFALO POLICE OFFFICERS AHMED ABDO, JOSEPH MELI, ALANNA LAGUERRE, ALEXANDER QUINCY, ELNUR KARADZHA, CHRISTOPHER WILSON, SEAN FORD, JOHN GRAVIUS, LIEUTENANTS VINCENT JUDGE, COURTNEY TRIPP, ADAM O'SHEI, and CITY OF BUFFALO POLICE OFFICERS JOHN DOE(S), ERIE COUNTY, ERIE COUNTY SHERIFF JOHN C. GARCIA, and JOHN and JANE DOES, medical providers of the Erie County Sheriff's Office whose identities remain to be discovered.
- 9. Upon information and belief, as a result of the afore said incident, LAMAR BRAZZLE, sustained damages for the deprivation of his constitutionally guaranteed rights and privileges, emotional distress and consequential damages, generally, when CITY OF BUFFALO, CITY OF BUFFALO POLICE OFFFICERS AHMED ABDO, JOSEPH MELI, ALANNA LAGUERRE, ALEXANDER QUINCY, ELNUR KARADZHA, CHRISTOPHER WILSON, SEAN FORD, JOHN GRAVIUS, LIEUTENANTS VINCENT JUDGE, COURTNEY TRIPP, ADAM O'SHEI, and CITY OF BUFFALO POLICE OFFICERS JOHN DOE(S), did unlawfully

detain Claimant, search him and his vehicle, and charged him after violations of his constitutional rights.

10. Further, upon information and belief, as a result of the aforesaid incident, LAMAR BRAZZLE, sustained damages for the deprivation of his constitutionally guaranteed rights and privileges, physical injuries, emotional distress and consequential damages, generally, when COUNTY OF ERIE, SHERIFF JOHN GARCIA, and/or and JOHN and JANE DOES, medical providers of the Erie County Sheriffs whose identities remain to be discovered, did fail to provide Claimant with proper medical attention.

11. Re: August 2024 Budget Monitoring Report

Dear Honorable Members:

Please find attached the Budget Monitoring Report (BMR) for the period ending August 31, 2024. Additionally, please see a position vacancy report as of August 31, 2024.

The BMR shows that for the first eight (8) months of 2024 the County has a \$10,232,384 positive variance, which can be attributed to several key factors.

On the positive, total Interest Earnings revenue is more than \$13 million over budget for the period and has exceeded the total budgeted amount for the year by more than \$9.9 million (\$18 million total earned; \$8.1 million budgeted). Given the County's strong cash position, the continuation of historic interest rates and the Comptroller's aggressive investment strategies, we should expect Interest Earnings to continue to be a significant source of overall positive variance within the 2024 Adopted Budget.

Also, the County has realized nearly \$5.4 million in county-share savings for the period on total personnel related costs which can be mostly attributed to vacancy savings. This is despite being nearly \$3.7 million over budget on overtime expenses for the period, two-thirds of which (\$2.2 million) is exclusively within the Sheriff's Police Services Division, which has now exceeded (\$6.2 million) their annual budget (\$6 million) with four (4) months remaining in the year. Other relevant departments over budget for the period include: Sheriff's Jail Management (\$971,552), Buildings & Grounds (\$198,672), Clerk's Auto Bureau (\$125,853), and Health Division (\$116,925). An additional item of note is that the Sheriff's Police Services Division has nearly exhausted its seasonal wages (\$636,075 of \$662,336) budget, which is used for reserve deputies on the gameday stadium detail, in August before the 2024-25 NFL regular season even began. This will become a small, but increasingly noticeable negative variance for the remainder of the year.

Lastly, the County Attorney's Office is showing a nearly \$2 million new positive variance related to the return of prior year surpluses as a result of lesser than anticipated Indigent Legal expenses in 2023.

On the negative side, while sales tax receipts continue to be a concern, the recently received 3rd quarter reconciliation payment has provided a significant sales tax boost and is actually a contributing factor to the \$4.5 million jump in positive variance since we last reported for July. As a result, August-related payments were 7.7% (or \$4.5 million) greater than for August 2023. Year-to-date sales tax receipts are now even (vs -1.25% through July) with 2023.

To meet the 2024 Adopted Budget for sales tax (\$639.3 million), it would require growth of 14% for the remainder of the year. However, the projected year-end sales tax shortfall has reduced to approximately \$19.9 million (from \$22.5 million). We remain optimistic that sales tax revenues will continue to rally through the 4th quarter of the year and close this year-end gap further.

As the year progresses, we will continue to closely monitor sales tax receipts and growth trends and report to your Honorable Body. I think it is also important to note that even though sales tax is among the largest individual variables in determining an overall budget variance, it is not the only variable. As you can see in this BMR, as of the first eight (8) months of 2024, we still have a modest positive variance, despite the underperformance of sales tax.

As always, I am available to attend a meeting of your Honorable Body's Finance and Management Committee to report on the March BMR or any other fiscal matters.

OVERVIEW

Per section 303-b of New York Agriculture and Markets Law, the Erie County Legislature set the month of September as the annual 30-day period to consider property owner requests for predominately viable agricultural land to be added to an agricultural district. Section 303-b requires the Erie County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board (AFPB) to report to the Erie County Legislature with its recommendations as to whether the land requested to be included in an agricultural district consists of viable agricultural land as defined in 301(7) of New York Agriculture and Markets Law and serves the public interest by assisting in maintaining a viable agricultural industry within the district.

PROPERTY OWNER REQUESTS

During the 2024 open enrollment period, the AFPB received applications for the inclusion of eighteen parcels into Erie County's existing Agricultural Districts, one of which is already enrolled in an existing Agricultural District and was subsequently withdrawn.

The AFPB considered these requests and based recommendations upon Agricultural District Law, which states that parcels to be included in agricultural districts must be "land highly suitable for agricultural production" that will continue to be feasible for farming if conditions remain the same. Each parcel requested for inclusion was analyzed in detail by the AFPB. Each application received, along with corresponding maps and aerial images are included as Attachments 1-8.

The following table contains information for each request and indicates the AFPB's recommendation on whether to include or not include the parcel in an existing Erie County Agricultural District:

PART 1 – Project and Sponsor Information, Question 4 Narrative

INTENT

The intent of this action is to modify existing Agricultural Districts in Erie County, NY pursuant to New York State Agriculture and Markets Law Section 303-b. Section 303-b requires an annual thirty-day period during which landowners may submit requests to include predominantly viable agricultural land into an existing certified agricultural district.

DESCRIPTION OF ACTION

During the 2024 Open Enrollment Period, Erie County received nine applications. One of these applications pertained to land already in an Agricultural District and was withdrawn. The remaining eight applications requested the addition of 54 acres to the North #1 District, 27.2 acres to the Southwest #8 District, and 114.1 acres to the Southeast #15 District. The Erie County Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board recommended the inclusion of 47 acres to the North #1 District, 27.2 acres to the Southwest #8 District, and 114.1 acres to the Southeast #15 District. This totals the inclusion of 188.3 acres.

ENVIRONMENTAL RESOURCES

- Land Use Plan or Zoning Regulations: Each application was analyzed for consistency with local land use plans and zoning regulations. In most cases each application was found to be consistent with such documents and agriculture was identified in each community's comprehensive plan as an industry to support and protect, and some degree of agricultural uses were permitted in each community's zoning ordinance and in the zoning district of each proposed enrollment. Application 8 for the inclusion of a 11.8 parcel (SBL 266.18-1-2) in Farnham conflicts with the underlying zoning district which does not permit agricultural activities.
- Intensity of Use of Land: Proposed enrollments encompass land that is already being farmed and/or land that has been previously developed and will not result in a significant change in the use or intensity of the land.
- Community Character: Each application's surrounding land uses were analyzed to ensure
 consistency with existing community character. In each case, enrollment into an
 agricultural district was found to be consistent with the rural, agricultural, and forested
 nature of the surrounding community.
- Critical Environmental Area: No significant impact on Critical Environmental Areas will
 occur because of these enrollments in an agricultural district.
- Transportation: No significant impact on transportation infrastructure will occur because
 of these enrollments in an agricultural district.
