#### SUMMARY

Pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), consideration of the environmental factors is necessary as part of governmental approval of actions. The County of Erie has determined that the projects associated with the "Erie County Sewer District No. 1 Increase and Improvement of Facilities" are essential for the protection of public health, protection of the environment, and will support the local community and economy of the County. As the approving entity pursuant to SEQRA, it is requested that the Erie County Legislature review the Project and make a determination of environmental impact. Based upon a thorough review and examination of the known facts and careful review of all potentially adverse environmental impacts, it is the Department of Environment and Planning's conclusion that the action will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There is no fiscal impact to the County associated with the Environmental Review.

## **REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION**

The existing sewerage facilities in Erie County Sewer District No. 1 are in need of various upgrades and improvements which will require the issuance of bonds. Pursuant to the SEQRA, consideration of the environmental factors is necessary as part of governmental approval of actions. The Department of Environment and Planning determined that most of the projects to be funded in this bond issue will be Type II actions under SEQRA and will not require a review. One project, the Woodlands Pump Station Elimination Project, was determined to be an Unlisted Action. The Department, acting on behalf of the Legislature, conducted an uncoordinated review, completed a Short Environmental Assessment Form, and drafted a Negative Declaration. Therefore, pursuant to the proposed resolution, the Legislature declares themselves Lead Agency and may issue a determination of environmental impact.

## BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Erie County Sewer District No. 1 provides sewage collection and transmission services portions of the Towns of Cheektowaga and West Seneca. Many of the District's facilities are nearing the end of their useful lives and will require rehabilitation and upgrades to continue to meet the District's needs. A SEQRA Declaration must be made to advance the issuance of bonds to finance these projects.

# **CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION**

Erie County Sewer District No. 1 will be unable to advance the necessary capital improvements to the facilities.

## **STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL**

The Department of Environment and Planning, Division of Sewerage Management will advance the next steps in the process necessary to garner approval of the "Increase and Improvement of Facilities" and ultimately issuance of the bonds.

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature declares itself Lead Agency; and be it further

RESOLVED, that based upon a thorough review and examination of the known facts relating to the Actions and its careful review of all potentially adverse environmental impacts, and the entire record and proceedings relating to the Actions, the County finds that the Actions will not have a significant adverse impact on the environment and that a draft environmental impact statement will not be prepared; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the attached negative declaration, incorporated herein by reference, is issued and adopted for the reasons stated in the determination of non-significance; and be it further

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this resolution be sent to the County Executive's Office, Comptroller's Office, Department of Law, Division of Budget and Management, and Division of Sewerage Management.

Erie County Sewer District No. 1 has applied for \$15.9 million of bond authorization to finance various construction projects in the District. Projects include improvements to existing pumping stations, rehabilitation of existing sewerage, and elimination of an existing pumping station.

The District intends to replace the discharge header, roof, and HVAC systems at the Industrial Park Pumping Station, replace the roof and HVAC systems at the Cayuga Pumping Station, and upgrade the electrical systems at the Industrial Park, Cayuga, Borden Clinton, Union Road, and Clinton Transit Pumping Stations. The scope of these projects will be covered under a Type II Action and will fall under 617.5 (c)(1) "maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility;", and 617.5 (c)(2) "replacement, rehabilitation or reconstruction of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, including upgrading buildings to meet building, energy, or fire codes, unless such action meets or exceeds any of the thresholds in section 617.4 of this Part;".

Additionally, various collections system improvements are anticipated with the issuance of this bond authorization and it is anticipated that these activities will fall under 617.5 (c)(1). If the scope of these improvements expands beyond maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes to the existing facilities, the projects will need to be reviewed again.

As the above mentioned actions are listed in the Type II Actions List in 617.5(c) no SEAF will be filed by Erie County for these projects.

The Woodlands Pumping Station Elimination Project has been determined to be an unlisted action. This Action has been reviewed by the Erie County Department of Environment and Planning and their uncoordinated review determined that the proposed project would have no moderate to significant environmental impacts. The Department issued a Negative Declaration for the project. The Short Environmental Assessment Form and a Negative Declaration are attached to this memo. If the final design differs significantly from the previously reviewed design, a new SEQR will need to be conducted.


