MEMORANDUM

To: Honorable Members of the Erie County Legislature

Re: Western NY Stormwater Coalition: Intermediate Mapping Project

SUMMARY

It is recommended that the Legislature approve the attached resolution prepared by the Erie County Department of Environment and Planning authorizing the County Executive or Deputy County Executive to enter into an agreement with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation to accept \$400,000 in grant funding and establish a project budget to commence the WNY Stormwater Coalition (WNYSC): Intermediate Mapping Project.

This new grant effort entails data collection and GIS mapping of storm sewers discharging to impaired waters, and high functioning inspection apps that will interface with WNYSC's Online Mapper. The project will utilize student interns from Buffalo State University's Department of Geography and Planning, which will require a contract for \$8,000. The University has provided student interns with Geographic Information Systems (GIS) expertise since 2012, when DEP secured funding for its first storm sewer system mapping grant, as well as for four subsequent mapping grants.

The preexisting positions that will be transferred into the new grant budget from an expiring grant 162WNYCSMPMP2527 consists of:

1. Information Technology Specialist (JG-8), fully funded.

2. Chief Environmental Compliance Specialist (JG-15), partially funded at 50%; an existing position in DEP. The remaining funds for this position come from the WNY Stormwater Coalition Grant 162WNYSCMS4AP1112.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There are no fiscal implications associated with the Western NY Stormwater Coalition: Intermediate Mapping Project. The requested staff positions and program expenses will be funded by the grant. No County funds are required. Additionally, both positions are pre-existing and will be transferred from a predecessor grant that is ending.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATION

Approval of this resolution will enable Erie County to access the \$400,000 in State funding to assist regulated municipal entities with mapping that is required by New York State's General Permit for Stormwater Discharges from Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems.

BACKGROUND

The primary objective of the Western NY Stormwater Coalition: Stormwater Management Practice Mapping Project is to collect field data and process the data to create GIS maps of storm sewers discharging to impaired waters for 43 municipal entities located throughout Erie and Niagara County. The proposed work is imperative for the regulated communities to meet New York State's municipal stormwater permit requirements related to impaired waters.

CONSEQUENCES OF NEGATIVE ACTION

Without approval of the attached resolution, Erie County will be unable to access the \$400,000 in State grant funding earmarked for storm sewers discharging to impaired waters for the 43 municipal entities in WNYSC.

STEPS FOLLOWING APPROVAL

An agreement with the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation will be executed by the County Executive or Deputy County Executive, a project budget and two existing positions will continue in DEP, and a contract will be executed with Buffalo State University.

WHEREAS, the Erie County Department of Environment and Planning (DEP) provides technical assistance to municipalities to assist them in complying with environmental regulations; and

WHEREAS, the State of New York, through its Department of Environmental Conservation, provides financial aid for stormwater compliance assistance projects; and

WHEREAS, the State of New York, through its Department of Environmental Conservation, granted Erie County \$400,000 to commence the Western NY Stormwater Coalition: Intermediate Mapping Project; and

WHEREAS the project will partially or fully fund two existing positions that will be transferred from a predecessor grant that is ending, with the balance of funding coming from a separate Stormwater Coalition Grant 162WNYSCMS4AP1112; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary that a contract by and between the people of the State of New York, herein called the "State", and Erie County be executed for such State aid; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for the County of Erie to enter into an agreement with the Research Foundation of SUNY at Buffalo State University for student interns to assist with the Western NY Stormwater Coalition: Intermediate Mapping Project; and

WHEREAS, the acceptance of this funding necessitates the creation of a grant budget.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, that the Erie County Legislature hereby authorizes the County Executive or Deputy County Executive to enter into contract to accept \$400,000 in funding from the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation for the WNY Stormwater Coalition Intermediate Mapping Project and be made available as a multi-year grant to the Department of Environment and Planning in Fund 281, Funds Center 16200 as follows:
