Competitive Predator Hunts

Overview

- March of 2019
 - ✓ Competitive Predator Hunt or “Coyote Calling Contest” will be held on public lands near Leupp Road.
 - ✓ Entry fee is paid by each competitor.
 - ✓ Points are awarded based on the type of animal killed.



Competitive Predator Hunts



Overview Continue

- Contest involves using manufactured calls to attract animals to an area where a team of shooters waits
- Goal of the contest is to kill as many animals as possible in the shortest period of time.
- Benefits a local 4H group

Competitive Predator Hunts

Arizona Game and Fish Department Continue

- AZGFD does not regulate any type of contest regarding the taking of wildlife.
- If a person and/or group has:
 1. *proper hunting license, and*
 2. *within a legal area, and*
 3. *have a legal firearm or archery*

then the person and/or group is legal under AZGFD hunting regulations.



Competitive Predator Hunts

Similar Competitions/Resolutions

- Yavapai County called “Santa Slay Coyote.”
 - *December of 2018*
- Others have taken place within Arizona and other states for years.
- Resolutions passed opposing:
 - City of Tucson
 - Pima County
 - Yavapai County Board of Supervisors and
 - Town of Dewey-Humboldt
 - Coconino Board of Supervisors considering passage of resolution.
