Revisions made following May 28 work session

- Separate FUTS into paved and unpaved
- Requirement to provide “current address” along with truthful name and date-of-birth
- Includes regular bicycles in provisions that make it unlawful to operate under the influence





Paved and unpaved FUTS

- Separate FUTS into “paved/hard-surfaced” and “unpaved/gravel”
- Class 1 and 2 electric bicycles are allowed on paved FUTS
- Class 3 are prohibited on paved FUTS
- All classes prohibited on unpaved FUTS

Name, DOB, address

- “Current address” added to truthful name and date-of-birth
- Requires truthful name, date-of-birth, and current address when detained by police under reasonable suspicion that a violation of the bicycle code has occurred



Operating under the influence

- Added regular bicycles
- Now applies to bicycles, electric and motorized bicycles, electric scooters, and electric personal assistive mobility devices
- Unlawful to operate under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Minimum five days in jail plus \$250 fine; may be reduced to one day in jail plus \$250 if program is completed
