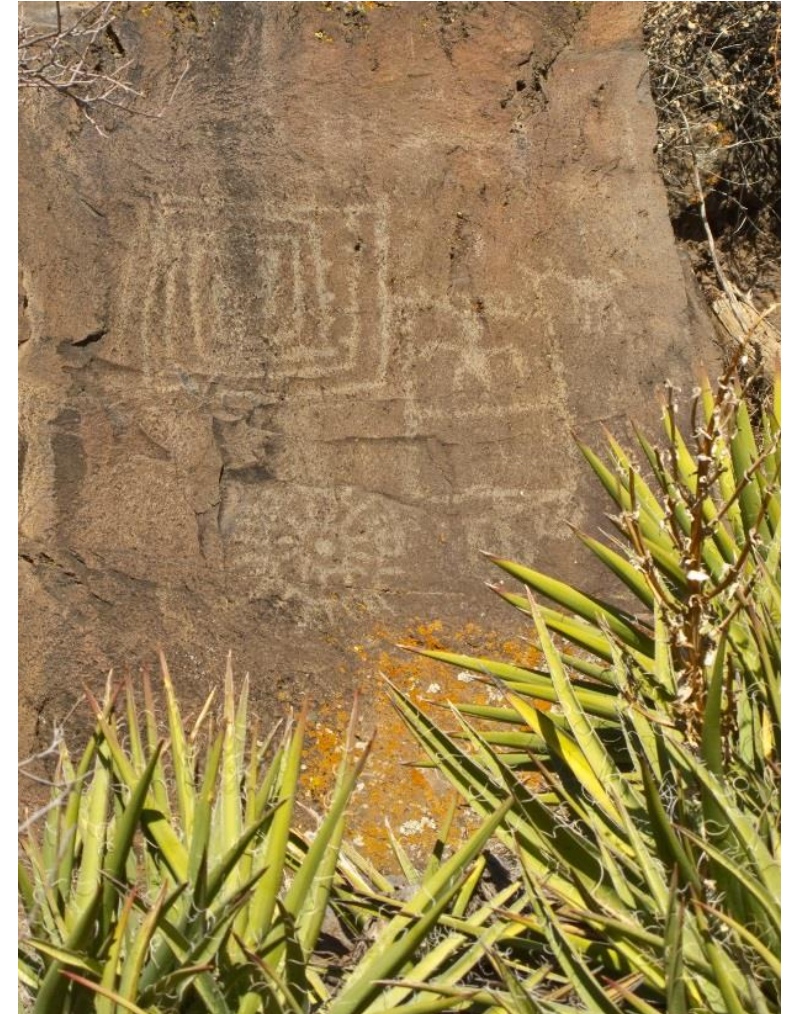


Site Steward Program



Background:

- Administered by Arizona State Parks
- Supports the protection of cultural sites on public lands
- Main objective is to report destruction or vandalism of prehistoric/historic sites
- Volunteer supported program
- No financial commitment from the City





Site Stewards Programs



Outcomes:

- In 2013, Council approved the 1st IGA with Arizona State Parks
- Volunteers reported graffiti to cultural sites that may have otherwise gone unreported
- Between June 30th, 2017 and July 1st, 2018, Site Stewards donated 90 hours to monitoring Picture Canyon

- Designated Site Steward program coordinator, Sean Hammond
- Appoint a regional coordinator that oversees volunteer efforts
- Provide field training and support to volunteers
- Supports Site Steward Code of Ethics
- Assures all regional monitoring commitments are met



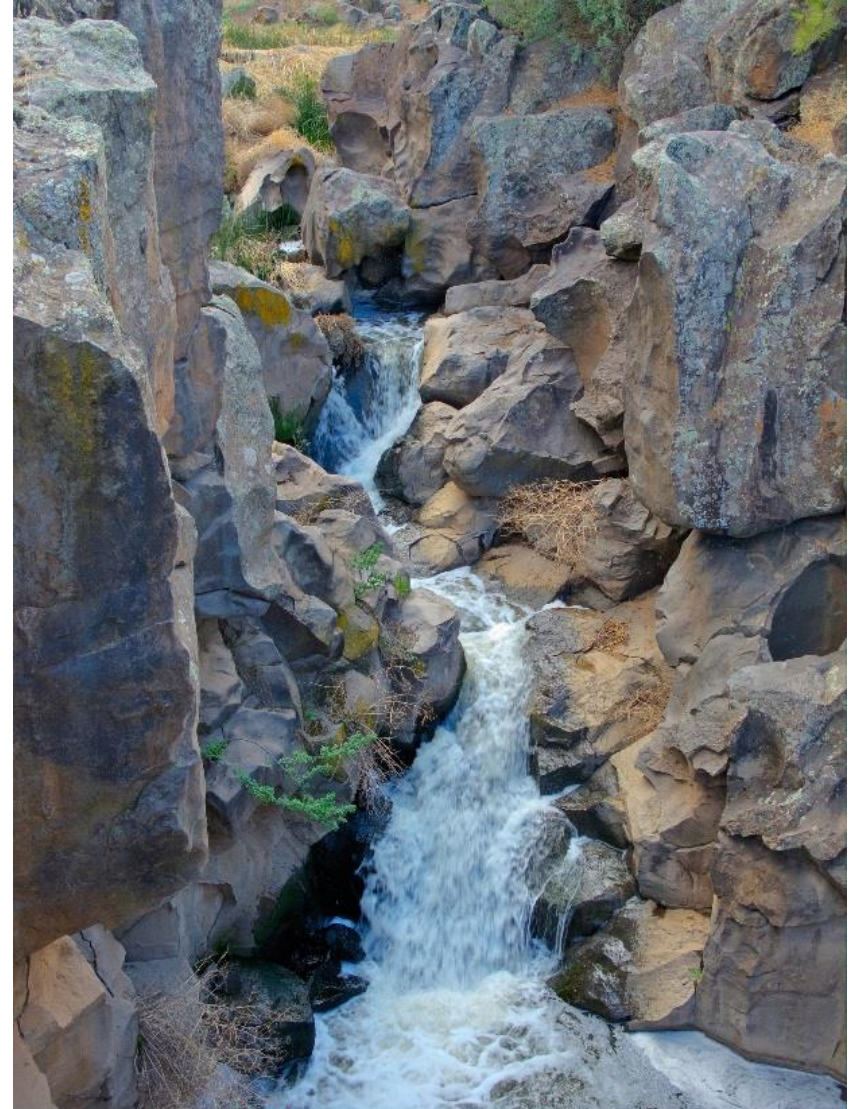


Site Steward Program
