Environmental Assessment

Landfill Road-History

- Forest Service Road 6010
- 2 Miles long from State Route 89 to Cinder Lake Landfill
- City of Flagstaff granted Special Use Permit by the Forest Service in 1965
- Currently used by landfill customers and recreationalists
- Road was repaved in 1987
 - County currently assist with maintenance and snow removal
 - Filling Potholes, Shoulder Maintenance, Crack Seal etc.

Landfill Road-Conditions

- Roadway Condition
 - Topcoat is deteriorating
 - Potholes throughout
 - Mill & fill not warranted
- Original Design
 - Turning radius-large trucks
 - Drivers must occupy 2 lanes
- Timely reconstruction recommended

Needs for Environmental Assessment & Scope of Work

- Forest Service required to review proposed modification
 - National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA)
- Environmental Assessment (EA) Scope of Work
 - Thorough considerations for cultural and biological review
 - Conduct public scoping, review, & analysis of public input
 - Draft & Final Environmental Assessment
 - Finding of No Significant Impact
 - Project Record
