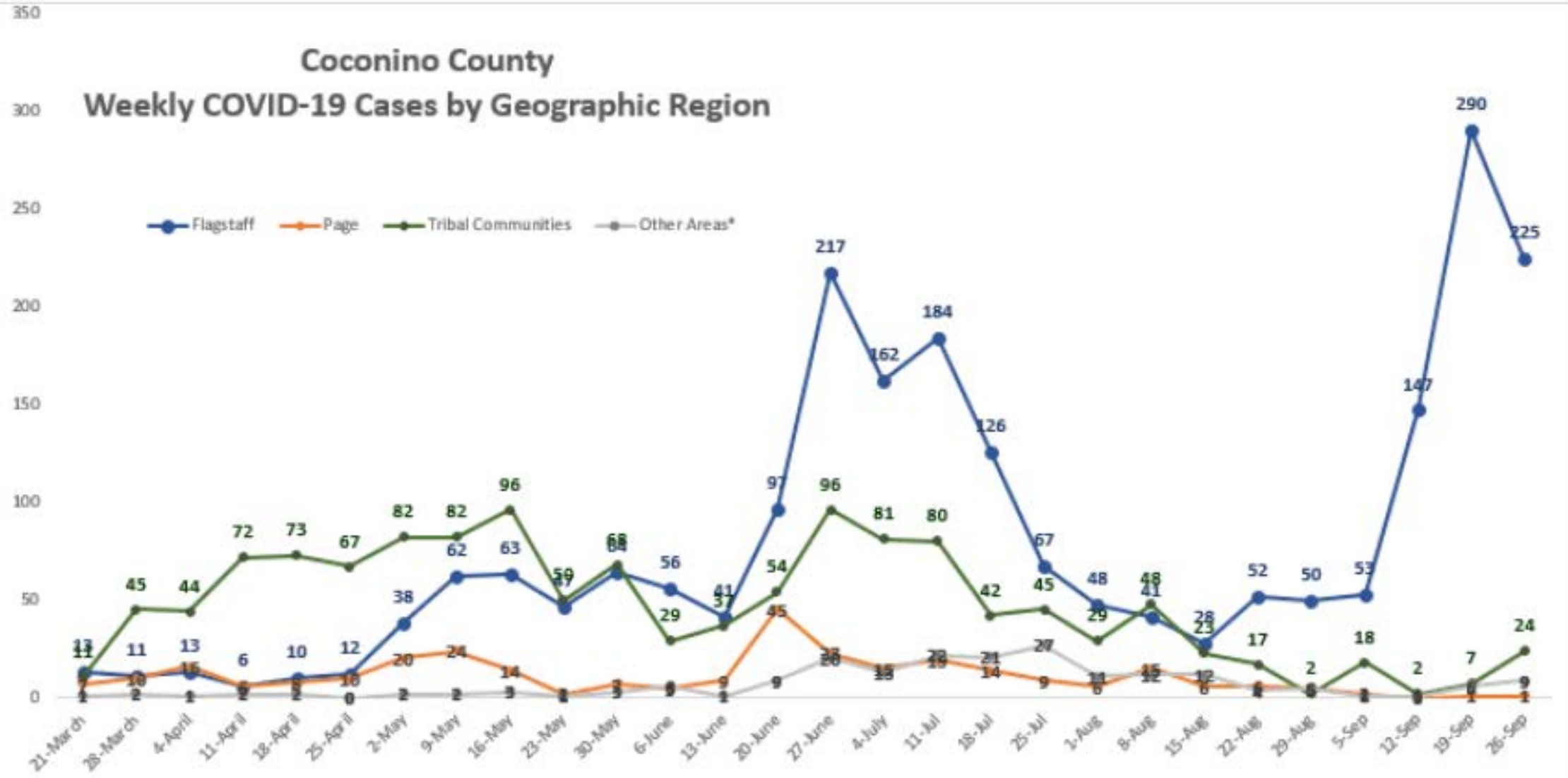

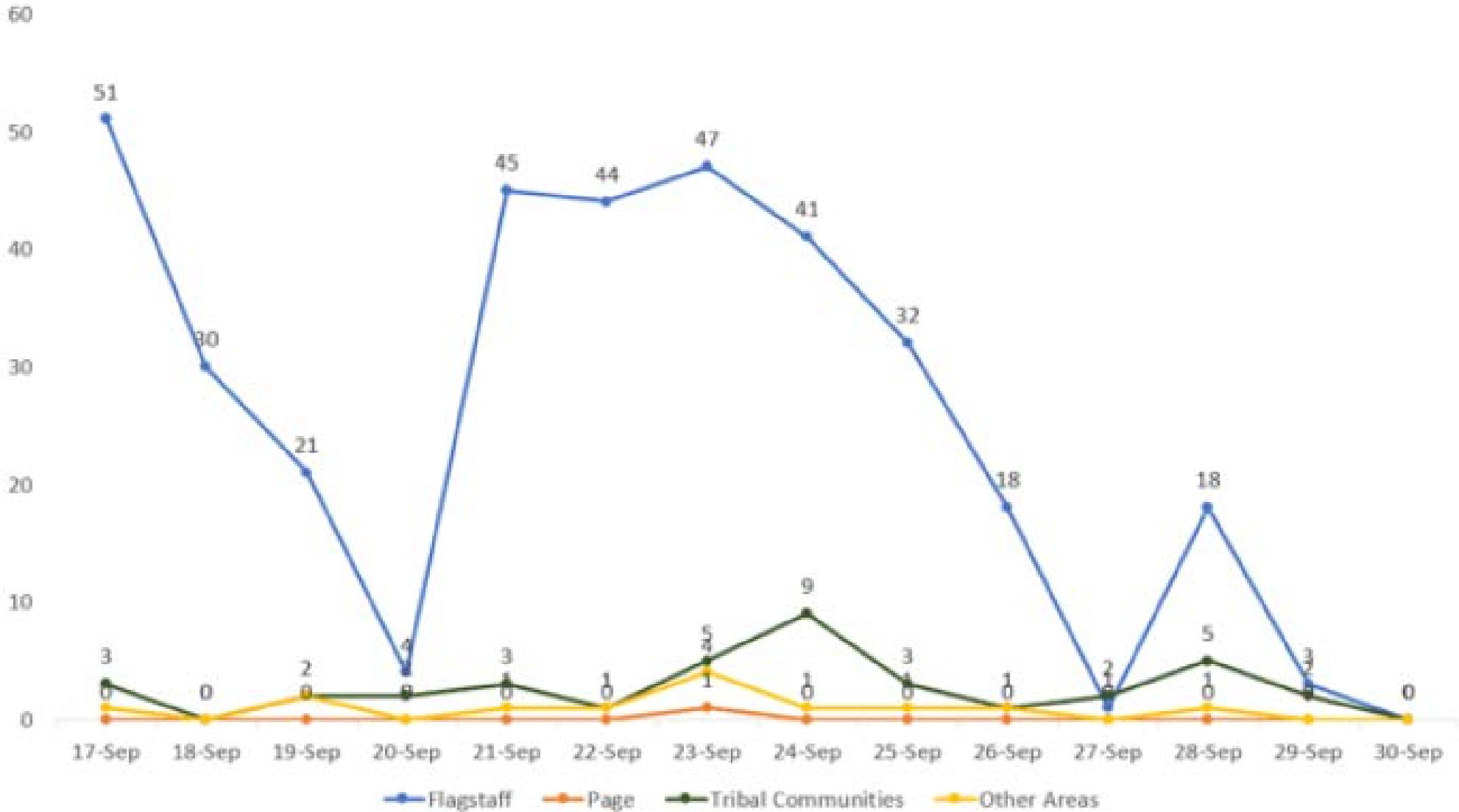

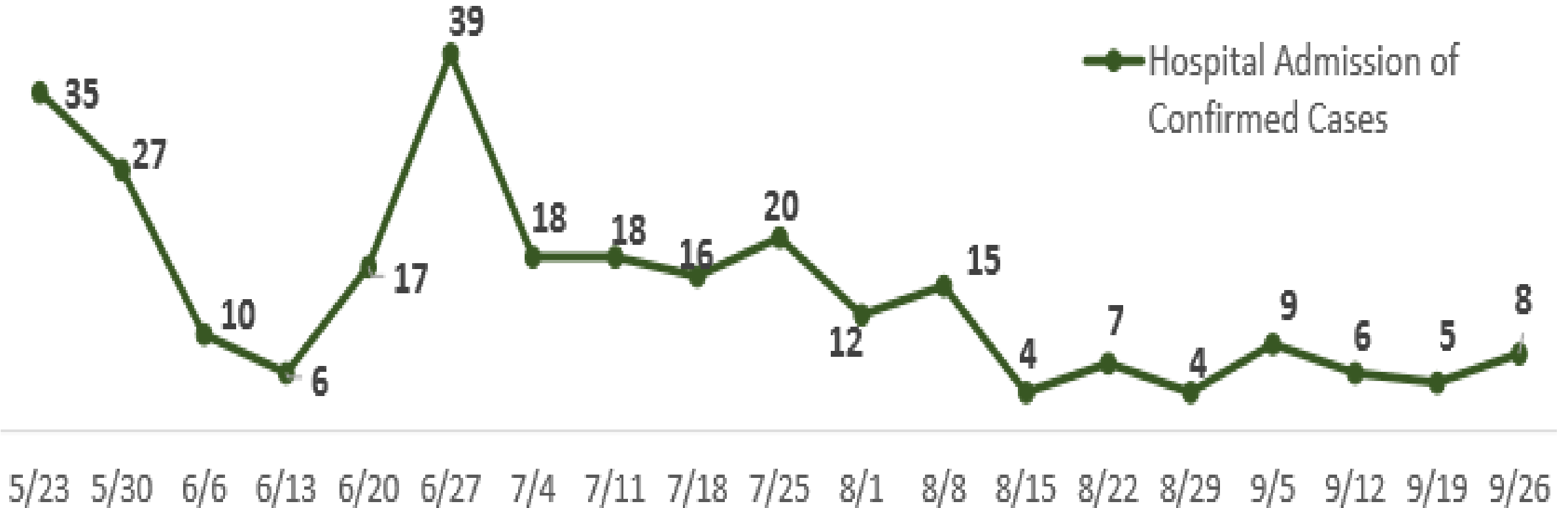
CCHHS: COVID-19 Daily Cases

Weekly Case Counts Among Coconino County Residents:

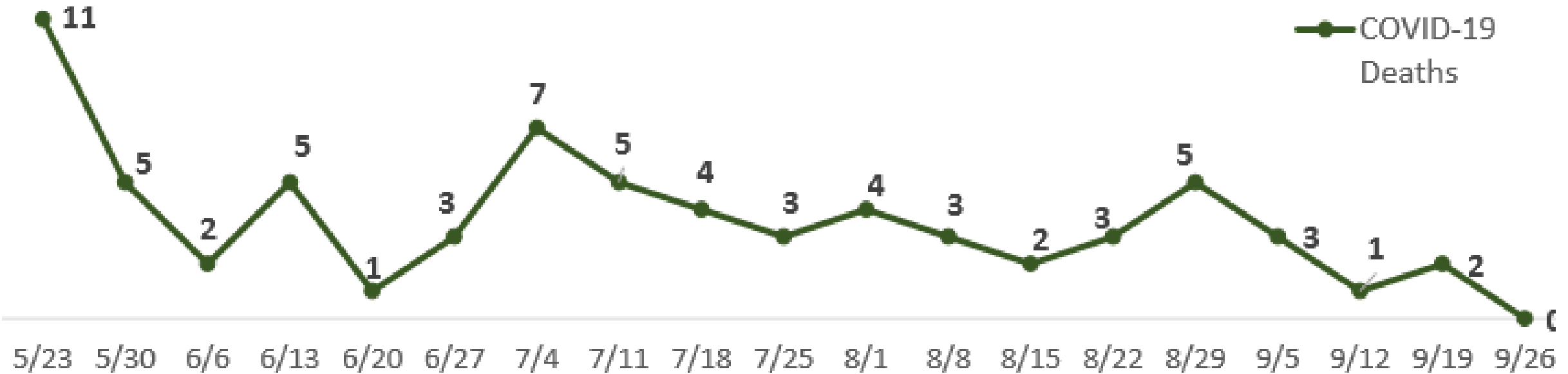




CCHHS: COVID-19 Related Deaths

CCHHS: Community Transmission



Community Transmission

- Coconino County has a current **incidence rate of 178.6 per 100,000**, **percent positivity of 7%***, and **COVID-19-Like-Illness incidence (CLI) of 3.0%****.
- Coconino County is currently at a **moderate** level of community transmission.

Benchmarks	Minimal	Moderate	Substantial
Cases	<10 cases/100,000	10-100 cases/100,000	>100 cases/100,000
Percent Positivity	<5%	5-10%	≥10%
COVID-19-Like-Illness	<5%	5-10%	>10%

Message from County Website on 10/2/20

As Coconino County COVID-19 case numbers change over time, clarification regarding a move from the Moderate category to the Substantial category was requested by the County. ADHS confirmed this week that the all three benchmarks for transmission on the ADHS Business Dashboard must be met for 14 days, with a 12-day reporting lag, to move to a higher transmission phase. This is a change from previous guidance.

Coconino County is experiencing a substantial case incidence rate, however percent positivity and COVID-Like Illness are within the Moderate and Minimal range. Based on the ADHS guidelines, Coconino County remains within a Moderate level of community transmission.

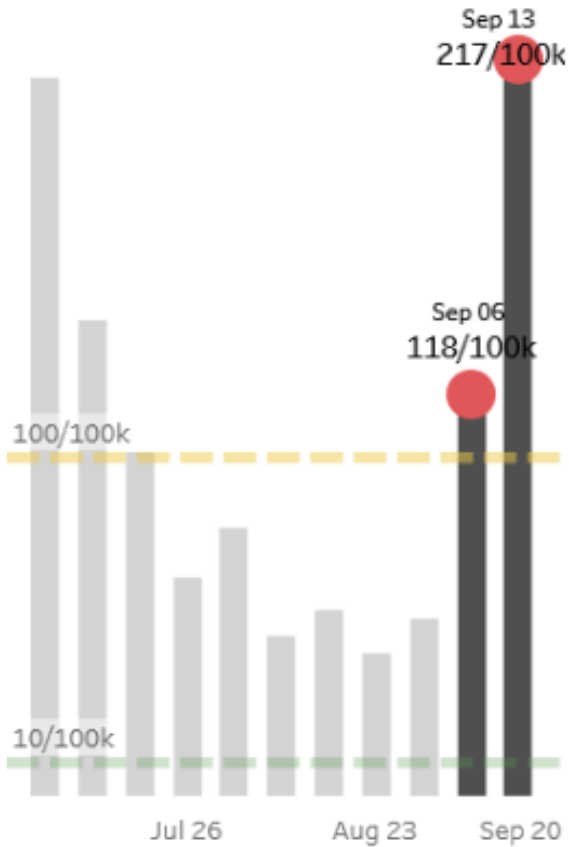

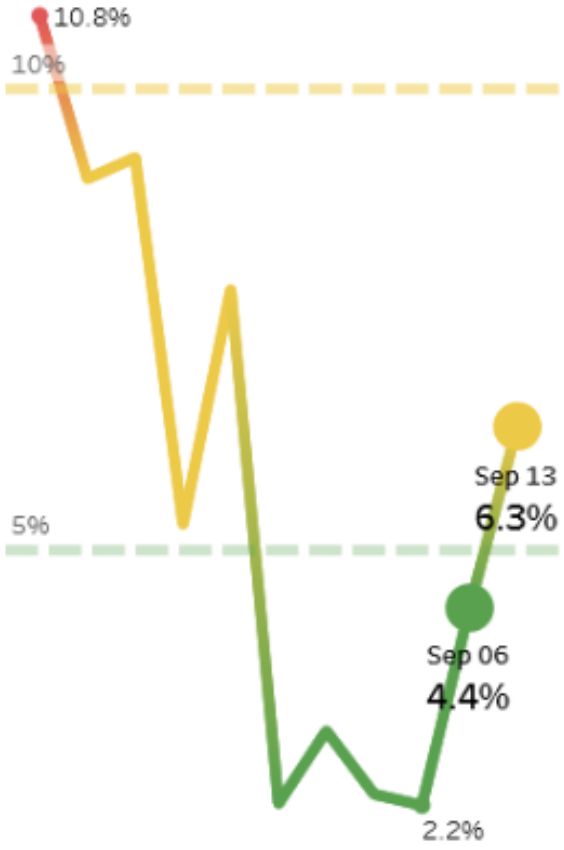

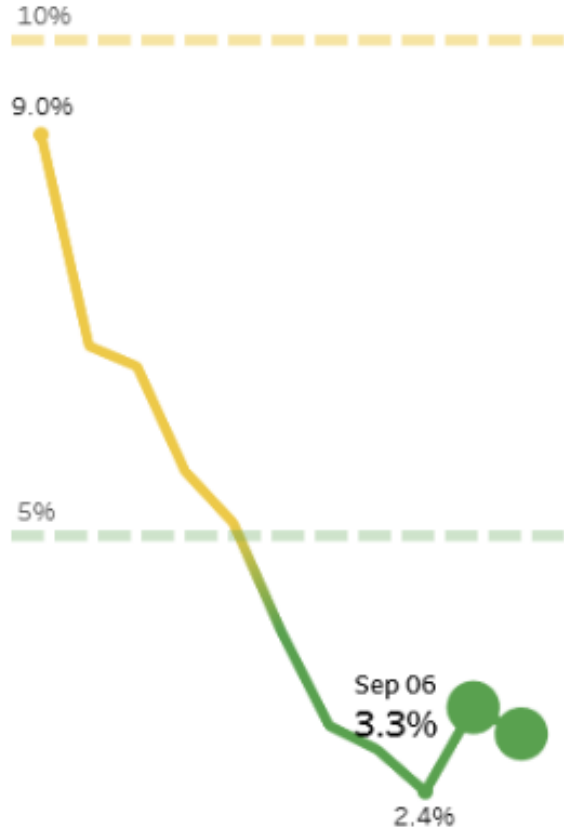
1) Cases per 100,000 individuals

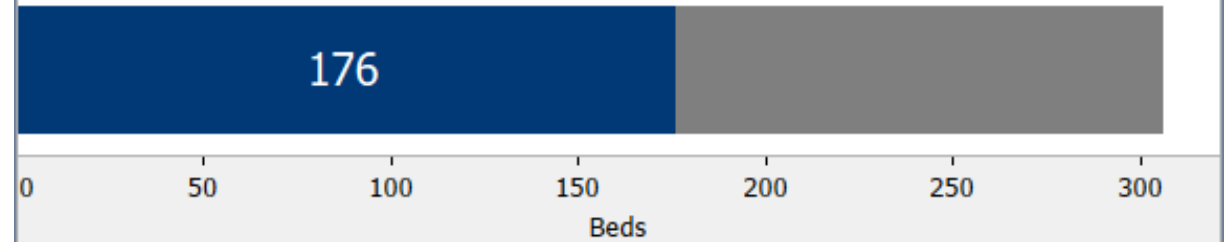

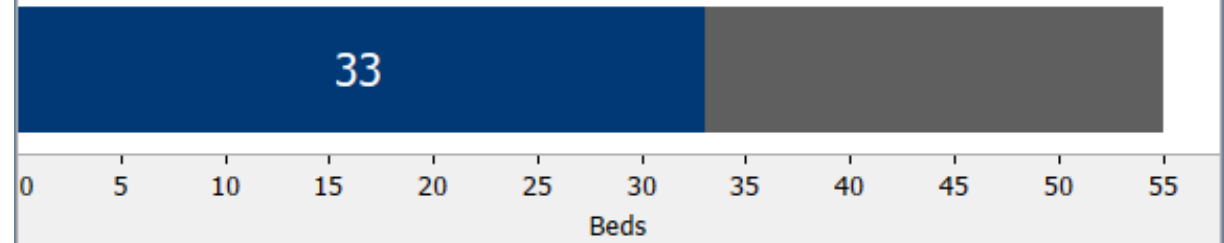
