Goals, Purpose and History

- Collaborative and Specialized Program between Coconino County Juvenile Court and Ponderosa High School
- Open to youth involved in Juvenile System and youth “at risk”
- Students can enroll any time during school year
- Students earn credit towards graduation

- Teach skills for school success
- Provide support and encouragement
- One to one instruction in a small school setting
- Preparation to return to their home schools
- Builds up youth to create a healthier community

Goals, Purpose and History

- Previously located at Juvenile Court Building prior to 2020-2021 School Year
- 2020-2021 School Year housed at Ponderosa High School
- Need space to operate as a “one room schoolhouse”
- Hal Jensen Recreation Center has space during times when the Center is closed

Classroom space and benefits

- Upstairs classroom and dance studio, computer room
- Other spaces available: gym, weight room and outdoors area
- A “Place” that instills healthy living and a sense of community
- Introduces recreation programming, facilities, and opportunities to the students
