



Application for Ad-Hoc Advisory Committee to AZSITE Consortium Board

On April, 29, 2020, the AZSITE Consortium Board (Board) voted to create an Ad-Hoc Advisory Committee (Committee) to serve the needs of the now defunct AZSITE Advisory Committee that was defined in Executive Order (EO) 2006-03. The Committee will remain in effect until the AZSITE Advisory Committee can be reestablished through the Governor's Office. The Committee may include representatives of state and federal agencies, tribes, local governments, academia or non-profit institutions, private consulting firms, and the public interest (e.g., utilities, mining companies, developers, ranchers) in order to ensure diversity of stakeholder input; however, the size of the committee shall be limited to 10 members. Membership shall be for a period of two years, and an individual may serve as a member for two succeeding terms (4 years). If a member leaves the committee, the AZSITE Board will attempt to fill the position within one month. The Board may remove a member at any time, with cause (including non-attendance or hindering the Board's ability to function).

The purpose of the Committee is to advise the Board on matters of concern to AZSITE users. The Committee shall identify a chairperson and meet periodically, as determined by the Committee; these meetings shall not be open to the public; however, the chair of the Committee may invite the President of the Arizona Archaeology Council and Chair of the Governor's Archaeology Advisory Commission (or their delegated representatives) to attend any meeting as non-voting members. The AHAC shall provide a written report to the Board no less than two weeks before the scheduled AZSITE meeting so that the Board's agenda may be finalized. The Committee Chair or its designee shall attend the AZSITE Board meeting and be prepared to discuss the report. However, the Chair of the Board maintains the right to set the AZSITE Board Meeting agenda.
