I believe that will be a good interim solution. We are looking forward to continuing the conversation for Flagstaff's future trail and land use plans.

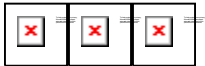

Staff Recommendation to address ASLD comment

Recommend that the City Council approve the Active Transportation Minor Regional Plan amendment, case PZ-21-00129-01 with the following conditions:

- Add State land boundaries to all maps
- Add the recommended disclaimer to Map 26d
- Maintain the trails as shown in Section 20 on the current Map 26 in Map 26d and Map 26e**

Good afternoon Sara,

It was nice speaking with you and Martin again. We appreciate the opportunity to meet this morning to discuss the planning of trails on State Trust Land, and the opportunity to recommend revisions before the current amendment goes to City Council. I have drafted the following language for your consideration:

For the map disclaimers:

Depiction of planned trails on State Trust Land do not constitute final location of or legal access to trails unless a legal trail easement is obtained from ASLD. In the absence of a legal trail easement, any recreational use of State Trust Land requires that individuals and/or groups obtain a Recreation Permit. Permits can be acquired through ASLD's online portal at <https://asld.secure.force.com/recreationalpermit/>. Please note that certain State Trust Lands may be closed to some or all recreational activities, such as camping or campfires.

For the Council presentation:

ASLD supports planning documents that depict trails co-located with planned roadway alignments. Depiction of planned trails on State Trust Land do not constitute final location of or legal access to trails unless a legal trail easement is obtained from ASLD. In the absence of a legal trail easement, any recreational use of State Trust Land requires that individuals and/or groups obtain a Recreation Permit. Permits can be acquired through ASLD's online portal at <https://asld.secure.force.com/recreationalpermit/>. Certain State Trust Lands may be closed by the State Land Commissioner to some or all recreational activities, such as camping or campfires. Currently, no trail easements exist within TRS 21N, 8E, 20. ASLD would like the opportunity to

continue working with the City staff in order to determine the most appropriate plan for future trails within Section 20 before this minor amendment is finalized.
