# Oppose Recommendation

HB2316

Misconduct involving weapons; public places

- Weapons could only be prohibited from public buildings if weapons screening devices like metal detectors are present.

HB2453/ SB1298

Governmental entities; mask requirement; prohibition

- Prohibits a governmental entity from imposing a mask requirement on its premises.

HB2674

Municipal zoning; by-right housing

- Preempts municipalities in housing matters, violates voter-approved general plans, eliminates single-family zoning, overrides locally-adopted residential building codes, eliminates citizen review processes, and prohibits planning commissions and Councils from reviewing housing projects, among other things.
- No obligation for developers to make units affordable.

HB2375

Urban revenue sharing; public safety

- Requires Cities to use state shared revenues only for public safety services.
- Any amount used for purposes other than public safety will be withheld by the State Treasurer the following fiscal year.



# Support Recommendation

**SB1270**

**State parks; lottery; heritage fund**

- Appropriates \$3M from the State Lottery Fund to the AZ State Parks Heritage Fund.
- The Heritage Fund supports parks, historic preservation, nonmotorized trails and education.

**HB2663**

**Short-term rentals; vacation rentals; licensing**

- Allows cities to limit the number of STRs as a percentage of housing stock.
- Grants other tools to regulate STRs, such as permitting and revocation of permits after multiple verified violations.

**HB2125**

**Electronic smoking devices; retail licensing**

- Raises minimum age of sale from 18 to 21.
- Requires unannounced compliance checks by the AZ Dept of Health Services (DHS), with fines and other penalties for violations.
- Establishes a tobacco retailer license managed by AZ DHS, with fines and other penalties for violations.
- Local governments are not preempted.



# Support letter for HB2396



- Request for letter of support
- Appropriates approx. \$50M to the AZ Dept. of Transportation
  - Including \$2.6M to Flagstaff for the Lone Tree Corridor
