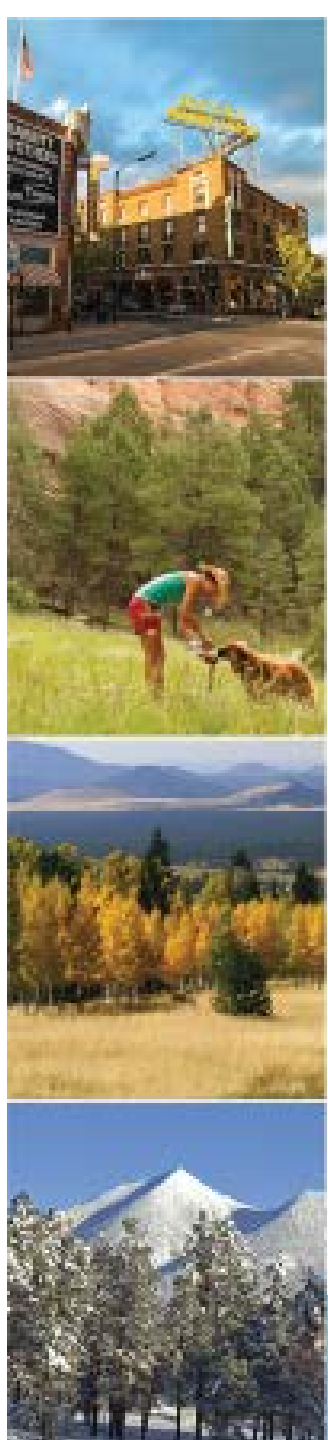

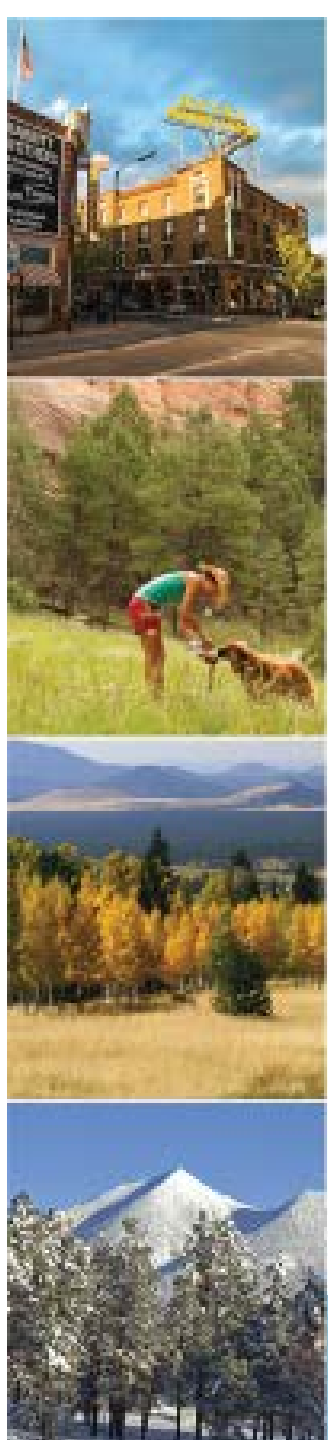

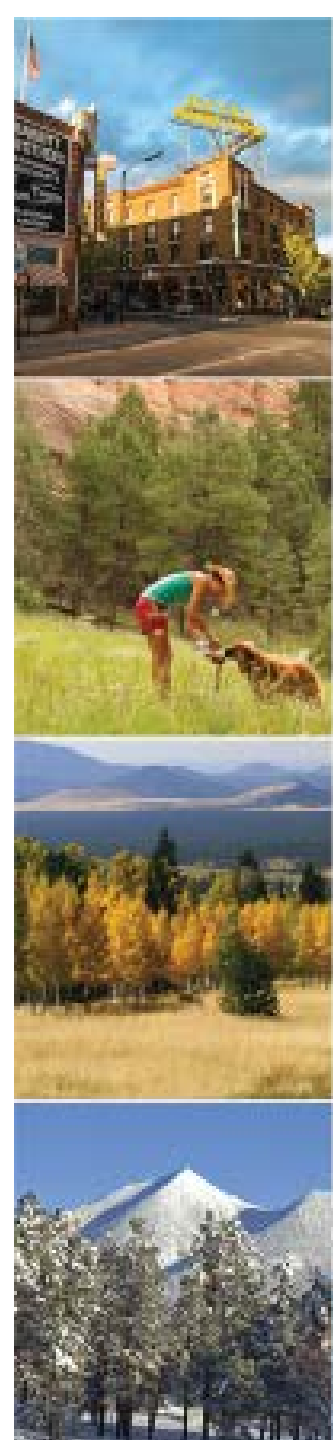

In 2005 Martin joined the Flagstaff Metropolitan Planning Organization as their second employee serving in the role as the Multi-modal Transportation Planner. With FMPO Martin hit his stride professionally as all things alternative modes are his true passion. While at FMPO Martin celebrated the completion of the 50th mile of FUTS, the planning and ultimate construction of multiple FUTS trails such as the Arizona Trail up the McMillan Mesa slope, and the Matt Kelley bridge over Cedar Avenue.

Lately Martin has been pouring his time into the recently completed Active Transportation Master Plan, the City's first comprehensive plan for bicycle and pedestrian programming and facilities, a huge success!



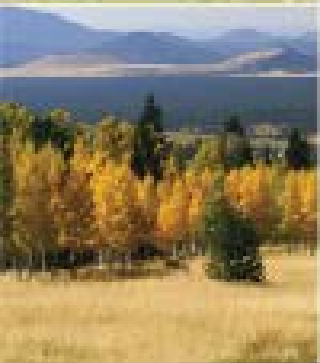

He enjoys the outdoors , camping riding his quads, playing softball, driving and cleaning his corvette.



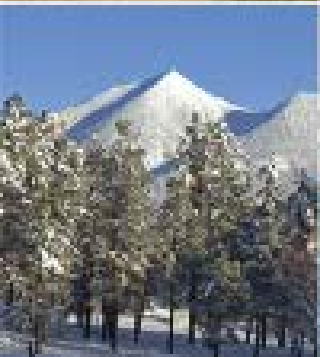
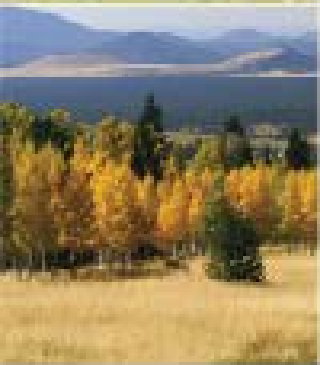
