

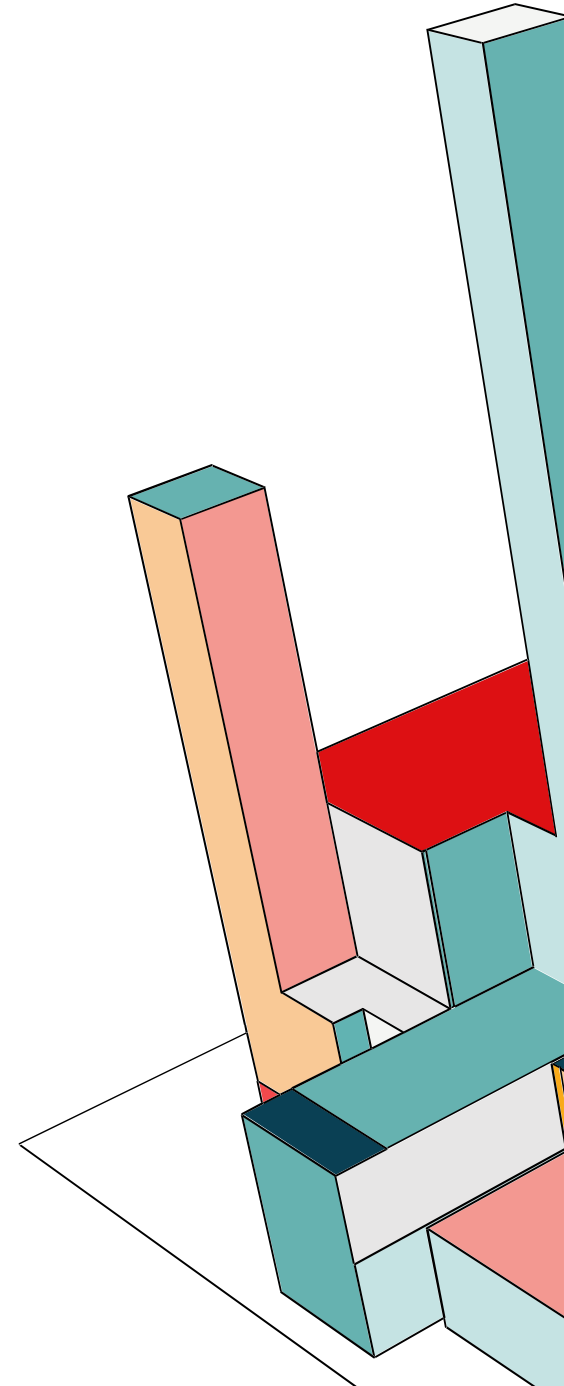
# **PUBLIC ART WALLS (PAWS)**

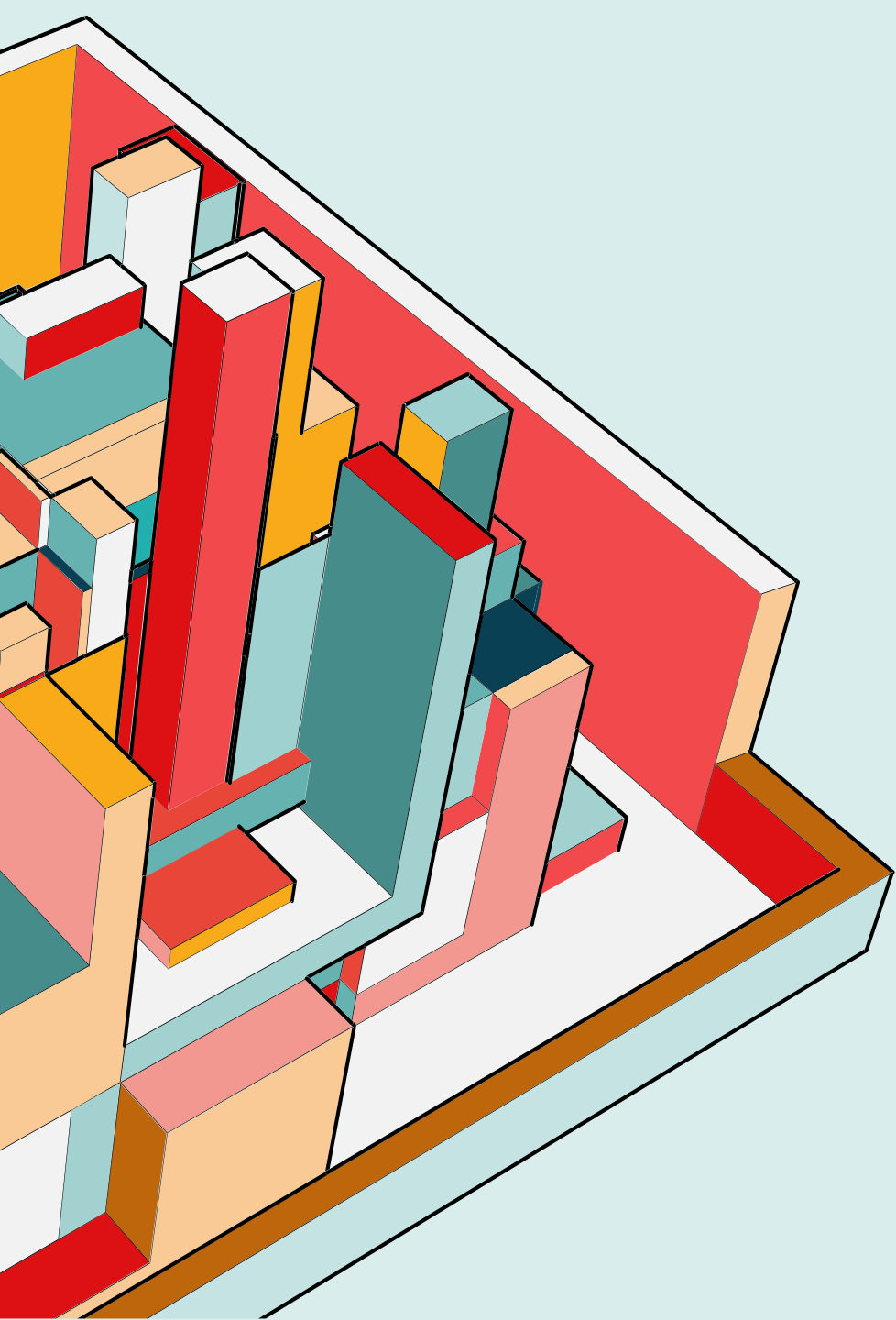
# WHAT ARE PUBLIC ART WALLS (PAWS)?

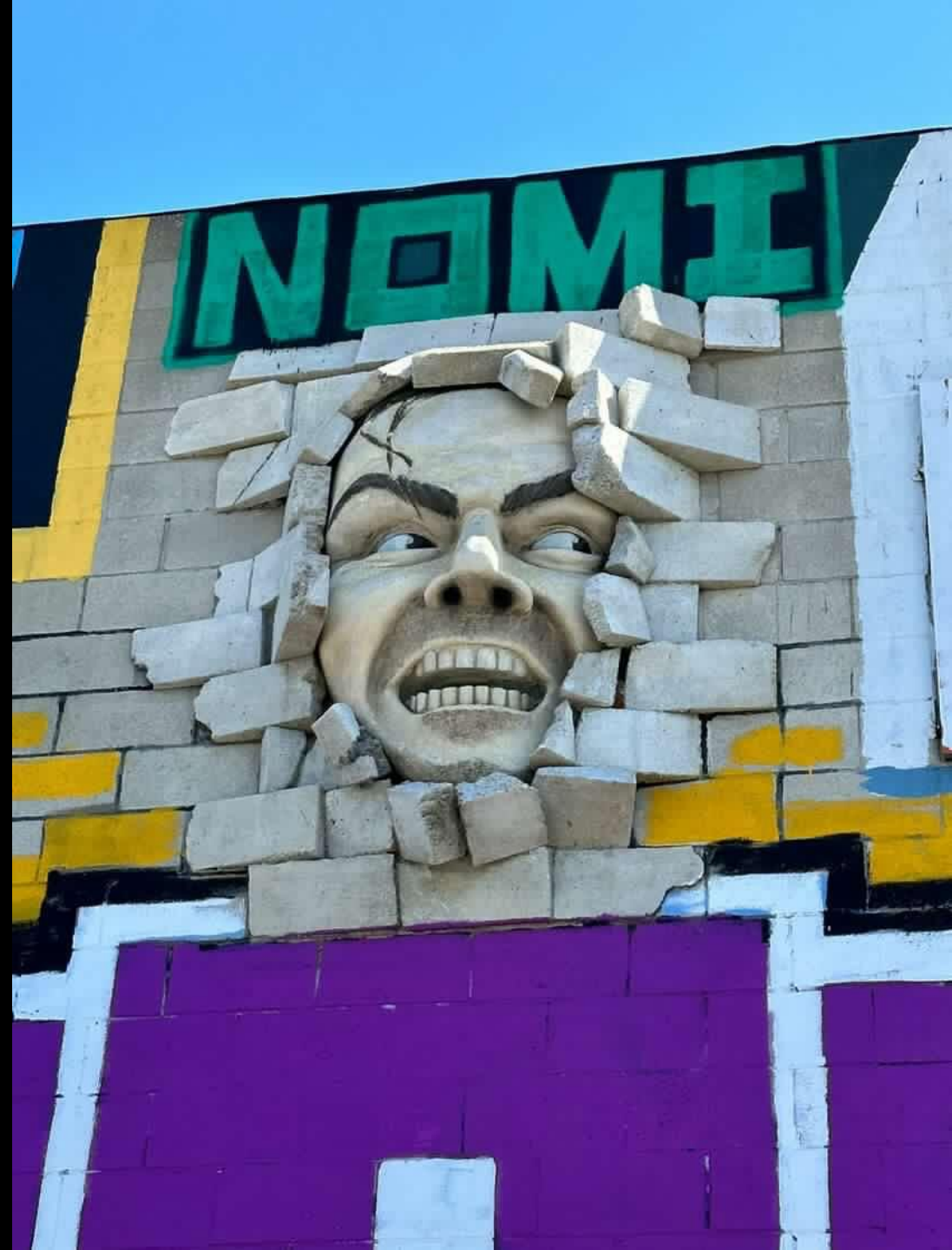


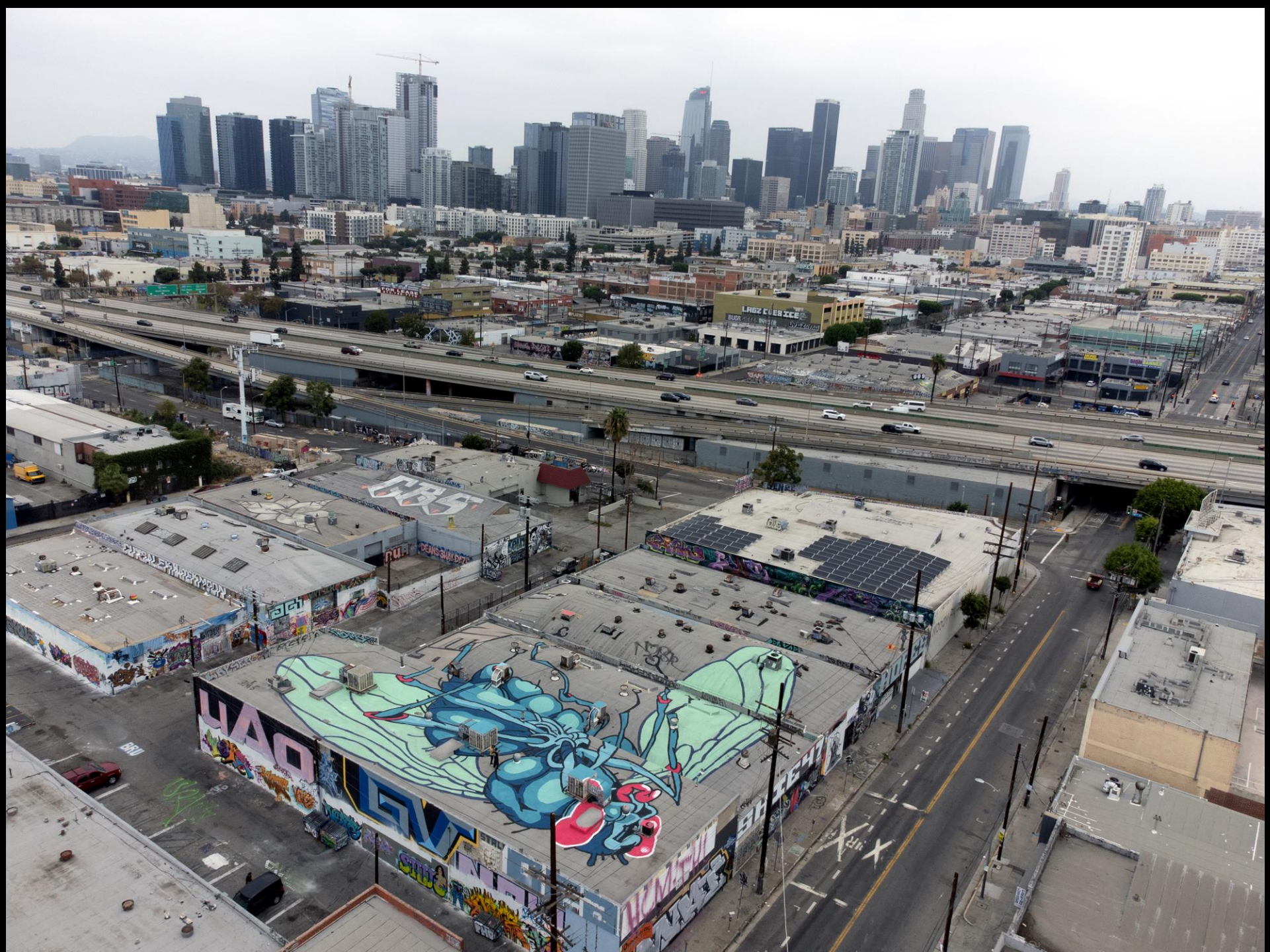


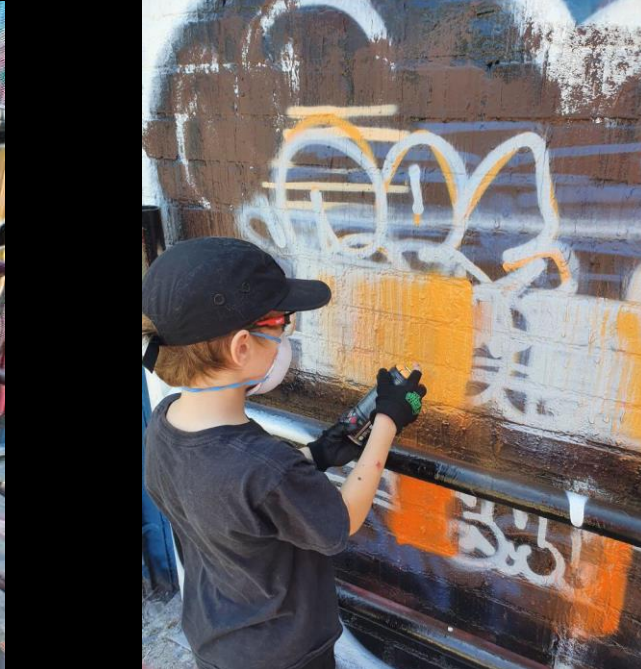
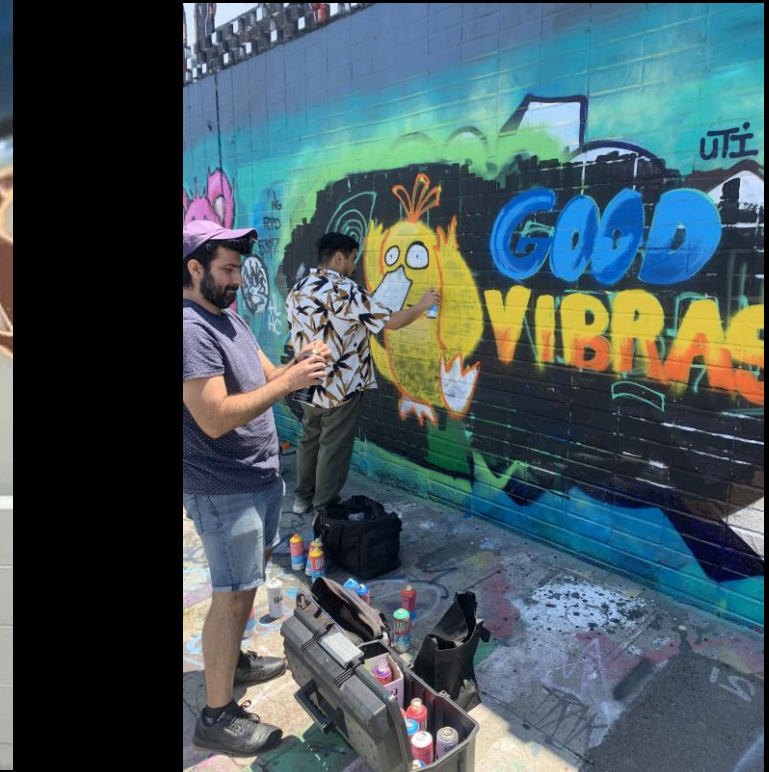
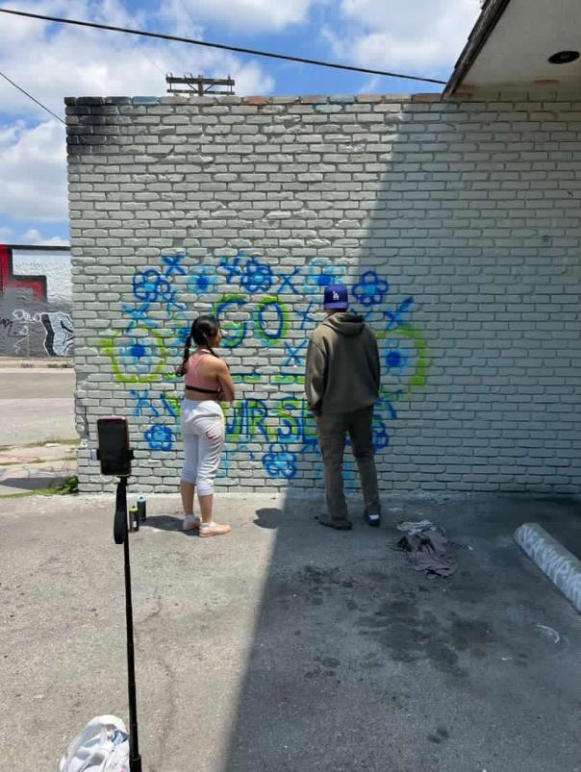












# PROPOSED SPACE IN THORPE PARK



## Thorpe Park Handball Courts

- Large wall space allows for a variety of work to be painted.
- Not many people play, so the infrastructure isn't being utilized for it's intended purpose.
- If people do use the courts, there is still space for artists to paint on the wings (shown in the next slides).

# WHAT WILL THE SPACE DO?

Allow for a free space for public art of ALL forms to exist legally.

Create a new space for art education outside of the classrooms. Programs built for children, teens and anyone willing to learn.

It will inspire a new community to form that will forge strong relationships involving artists, photographers, musicians, writers and members of the community.



# HOW WILL THIS POSITIVELY IMPACT THE COMMUNITY?

Allow artists a place to fight their addictions and manage better mental health with painting.

Give artists a legal and free opportunity to build their portfolios, thus gaining employment and greatly improving their skills.
