City of Flagstaff ALPR Discussion

Flagstaff PD's Flock Safety Program Journey:

- First contract approved in June of 2024
 - Aided in bringing justice for many victims in community
 - No incidents of misuse in over 12 months of usage
- Amendment brought before Council on September 2, 2025 along with Citizen's Petition
- Community Discussion held in front of Council on October 28, 2025
 - Council directed staff to bring the Amended Contract to them

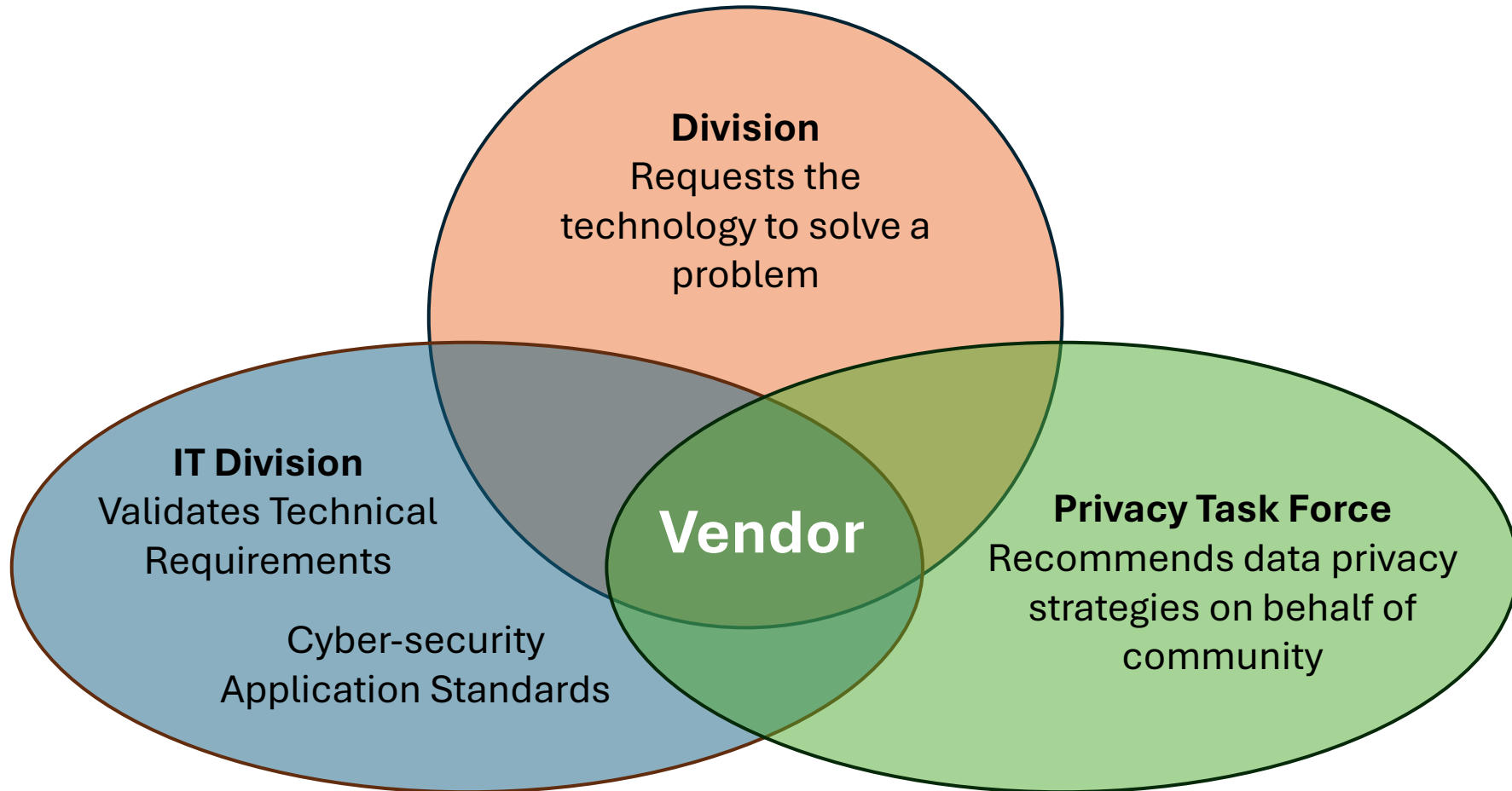
Flock Safety Program Changes After Community Input

- FPD removed itself from the National Lookup
- FPD removed itself from Statewide sharing
 - Only sharing partners are CCSO and NAUPD, and Tribal partners
- Updated policy to not allow ALPR sharing for immigration enforcement
- Policy requires supervisor approval for the creation of hotlists
- FPD changed its data retention of ALPR scans from 30 days to 14 days
- Creation and selection of citywide technology oversight committee
- FPD will provide a 6-month public check-in in front of Council
- Forward facing Flock Transparency Portal on FPD website

Technology Privacy Task Force:

- We took Applications through Dec 5.
- We have selected 10 individuals from a wide range of backgrounds, expertise and lived experiences.
 - We're waiting for final acceptance
- First meeting will be scheduled for January.
- It's not just for License Plate Readers, but wholistically.
- We want a framework on how we can balance being “cutting edge” with community core values.



City of Flagstaff ALPR Discussion

Contract Amendment:

- Amendment to fund ALPRs for fiscal year 2025-2026
- 36 Flock cameras and 1 Flock Safety Operating System
 - 32 permanent fixed cameras, and 4 portable devices
 - Same number of existing cameras from 2024
- \$112,000 in addition to other fees and taxes
- Funding allocation in fiscal year budget
