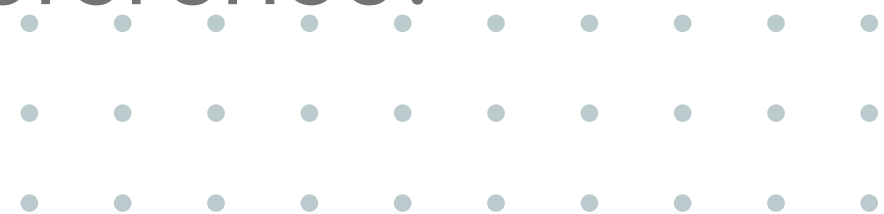

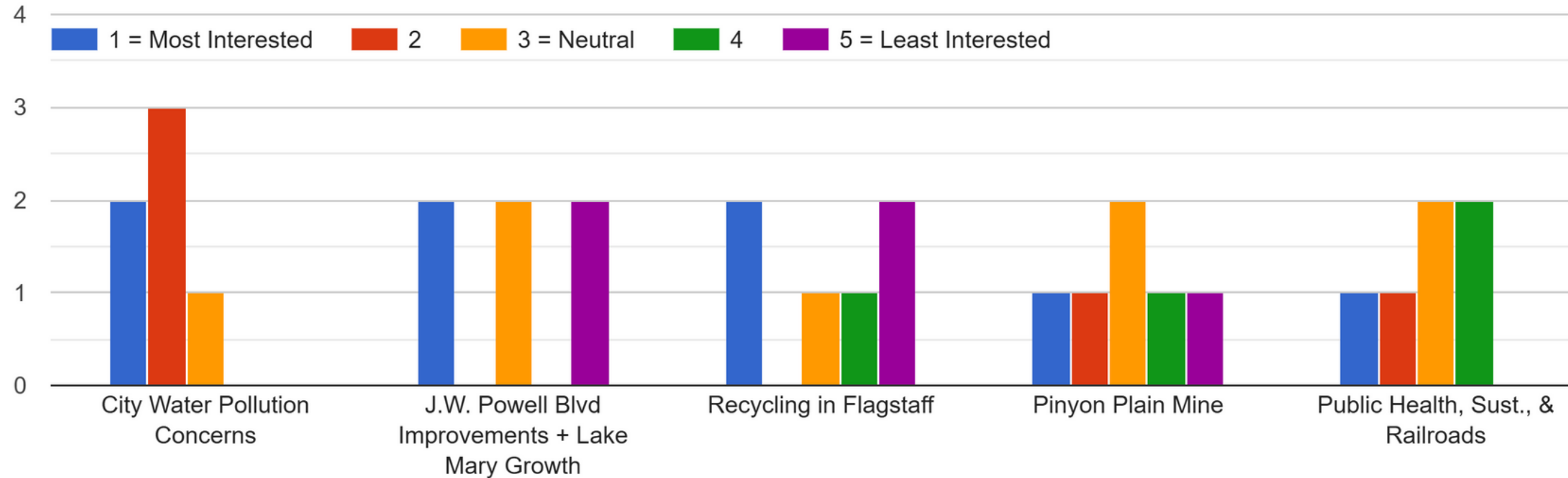

Please rank the following agenda item requests by most interested (#1) to least interested (#5). Please only assign one topic to each number.



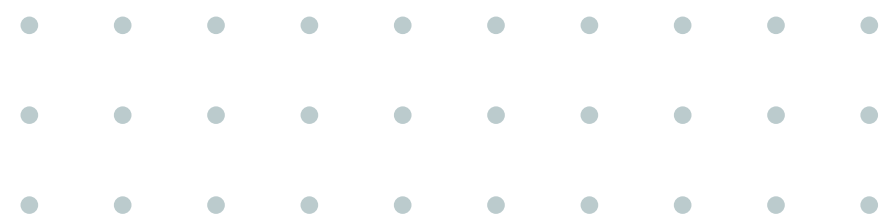
Top Interests:**

COMMENTS



- Fire resistance, finding sustainability oriented industries to grow here,
- I am just curious about how the future of JW Powell will impact the city as a whole from emissions and land use perspectives.
- If there are city water pollution concerns I'd love to learn more about this topic from City water services.
- Water quality and pollution- Microplastics (including from tires), PFAS, phthalates, arsenic all in local tap water. Railroads- concerns about particulates from brakes and gaseous emissions for public health and climate change. Equity concerns. Sound pollution and solutions. Future of clean rail and advocating and creating city policy for it.
- Recycling - this still seems like low-hanging fruit. I have some ideas about a project that could support a business case for providing glass pick up services to flag residents. But don't think the full commission is the place for the discussion.

COMMENTS

- Lake Mary Growth + Flagstaff growth in general: we are growing but still lack many resources in town that other cities similar in size have. Where's our Costco, what is happening out at the mall, why is the Flagstaff version of every big box retailer subpar to versions in the big city? Many residents drive to Prescott or Phoenix to get things they need that are unavailable in Flagstaff, significantly increasing ghg emissions associated with our community. Do we need to hear from city planning? business retention? ECONA – or the city version? Also interested on information related to the JW Powell improvements in general, I do not know what's currently planned so that could be a good place to start!
- Honestly, I don't know much about these topics so this was a wild guess. Least interested in lake mary growth because I live down there, and I'd like to see growth– we need more housing. Most interested in pinyon plain mine since I know nothing about it.
