WHEREAS, subsequent to Mrs. Harper's death at the communion rail of St. Andrew's Episcopal Church on November 1, 1914, the Chapter was re-named in her honor; and

WHEREAS, the Cora Stickney Harper Chapter, National Society Daughters of the American Revolution, has supported the patriotic, educational and philanthropic needs of the City of Fort Pierce, Florida, for the past 100 years.
